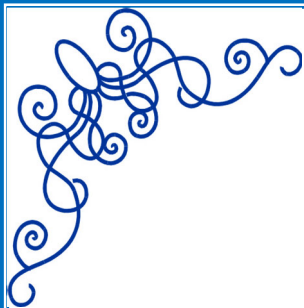
MEDITATION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
 Matthew 28:19-20

When our Lord commanded the disciples to baptize, he told them it was to be in the *name* of, not the *name(s)* of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity is a Tri-Unity of Persons. From all eternity, God is One, and yet also a Family of Persons of which the "Family Unit" on earth is its most fitting reflection. 1 Man + 1 Woman = 2 Persons, though united as One. With the gift of



children, the 1 + 1 + 1 = 3 Persons, though still united in One Family.....On Earth as it is in Heaven. What is at stake in the attempt to redefine the family? How do I see the family, my family as reflecting the very nature of God's love in the Trinity? (*Mosaic of Holy Trinity: Cathedral Basilica: St. Louis, MO*)

In the School of the Holy Spirit

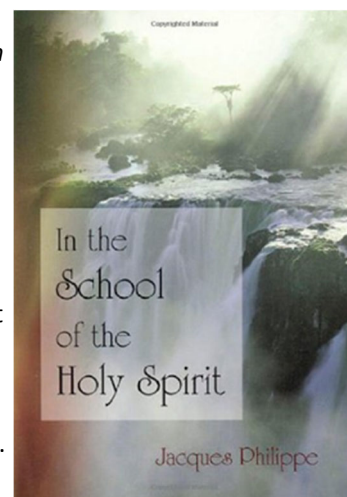
The above is a title of a book by Fr. Jacques Philippe, a spiritual guide for our times. An excerpt follows below.

The shortest road to holiness is fidelity to the inspirations of the Holy Spirit.
This book helps explain how to listen to the Spirit.

My Jesus, it is truly easy to become holy; it just takes a little good will! And if He finds this minimum of good will in a soul, He quickly gives Himself to her. And nothing can stop Him, neither our faults nor our falls, absolutely nothing. Jesus hurries to help that soul; and if the soul is faithful to this grace from God, she can in a short time reach the highest level of holiness that a created being can attain here below. God is very generous and does not refuse His grace to anyone. He gives even more than we ask for. The shortest road is faithfulness to the inspirations of the Holy Spirit.

This beautiful text is taken from the diary of St. Faustina. Even though it is simple and concise, it delivers an extremely important message for people who aspire to holiness — to people who want to respond as far as possible to God's love.

The major question for such souls, a question that sometimes causes them pain, is to know what to do about this message. Maybe you never have been particularly concerned about this question. Maybe you never have aspired to love God as much as He possibly can be loved. If not, I ask that you now beg the Holy Spirit to put that desire in you, and even that you beg Him to leave you restless until you have that aspiration.

Today's Gospel reading included the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the three persons of the Trinity: one God in three persons. "The Father generates the Son; the Son is generated by the Father; the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son" (Compendium, 48). 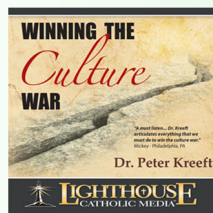

Fanning the Flame: What Does Baptism in the Holy Spirit Have to Do with Christian Initiation?

What does it mean to be "Baptized in the Spirit?" What does it mean to "stir" the Gift of Baptism and Confirmation?" The authors of this document supply much-needed clarification of baptism in the Holy Spirit. They also provide evidence that baptism in the Spirit belongs not to the personal experience of the few, not at all to private piety, but to the public official liturgy of the Church. Baptism in the Spirit is therefore normative. The authors, supported by letters of encouragement from two bishops, suggest ways in which the baptism in the Holy Spirit can be reappropriated by the local parish. Here are the sources of renewal, of on-going conversion, of the power of evangelization. For this reason, this document is of interest to every baptized believer.

LET'S FACE THE FACTS AND TELL THE TRUTH ABOUT ABORTION

*Abortion is not about "a woman making a decision about her own body". The child in the mother's womb is a separate, human being with its own heartbeat, DNA, blood type and finger prints.

*The vast majority of abortions are done as a form of birth control because the baby is "inconvenient", "too expensive" or a "burden". Very few abortions have anything to do with the health of the mother and less than 1 % is performed as a result of rape or incest. * "Leave it up to the woman to decide" totally destroys equality before the law, because it constitutes a complete removal of protection from the child, who is considered a "non-person". It also ignores the coercion women frequently confront from boyfriends and abusive husbands.

* Abortion has two victims---the baby and the mother. Many women who have abortions suffer both physically and mentally. Depression, anxiety, infection, sterility and even death are not uncommon. The incidence of breast cancer also increases significantly in women who have had an abortion.

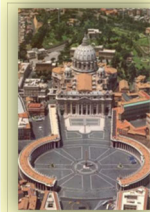
