Dear parishioners,

As I write this column it looks like we are in for another week of wonderful summer weather. I am very thankful for the cooler temperatures and providential rain. Summer is passing entirely too fast, but what a summer it has been. Here are a few things to ponder, pray or discuss as we plan for the future.

POTENTIAL MASS CHANGES:

A few weeks ago I mentioned a potential change in our Mass schedule by eliminating the 11:15 Mass on Sunday. If you missed that column, please go to our parish website where you can read past bulletins. At the time of its publication I was considering just eliminating the 11:15 Mass and leaving the other Masses in their regular time slot. I have received some feedback from about a dozen people so far that covers a variety of responses and replies. A number have suggested just changing the entire Sunday morning schedule. I am not inclined to do so, but would appreciate hearing from more of you as I ponder possibilities. The most important reason for me to change the Mass schedule is to make time for Faith Formation on Sunday mornings once or twice a month. Is such a thing desirable and would you attend? I am trying to eliminate the most frequent excuses many offer for not growing in their faith- "I don't have enough time" or "It's not convenient." Your thoughts are appreciated and needed. If such a change were to happen it would begin in January of 2015.



Fulton Sheen Project: Help wanted











A couple of weeks ago I wrote in the bulletin about a trip the Mueller family took to visit Ven. Fulton J. Sheen's birthplace and where he was raised in Illinois. Since the trip, I have revisited many of the books, audio CDs and videos that I have of Sheen. He wrote over 60 books, written countless articles, and has hundreds of audio and video talks. Years ago I bought a collection of 300 + audio talks from www.fultonsheen.com. I've listened to many of them and have been greatly impressed. I have always desired to have a written transcript (or at least the main points written down) as I think there are many timeless quotes and words of wisdom that we should keep alive in our time. Remember, if Fulton Sheen is canonized as a saint, he will be the first native born American male saint in our country. I think it would be fitting to prepare for this reality by such a project. I'm looking for a group of folks to help volunteer in a project of transcribing a bunch of these talks in written form. All you would need to be able to do is to listen and type I Side note: Recently, a friend of my son (Fulton) introduced him to a competitive game online call Nitro-type. (www.nitrotype.com) Basically, it is an online car race, test, competition to see how fast one can type and with what accuracy (Parents, if you're looking to get your kids typing, here you go). Fulton wanted to take on Lynette (my wife) as she is the queen of fast typing. She barely beat him. When I took him on, he smoked me, typing 80 + words a minute to my measly 55. When I tried to recruit him later that day for the "Fulton Sheen project", his 12 year old philosophy of "What's in it for me?" kicked in. I tried to tell him that not only would he become better at typing, but that he could also be learning great wisdom from Sheen, his namesake, at the same time. He wasn't jumping for joy, as this sounded like too much work. Well, I have some more "encouragement" to do, I guess. But as for others, would you be willing to help? Here is how it would work. I have a selection of talks that I could send you via a CD or online, or give you a link to. They are usually about a half hour each. You could do one or twenty...it is up to you and at your own pace. You would simply listen to the talk and either transcribe (or write out the main points mentioned) that you listen to. These can be typed out in some type of digital format (i.e. Microsoft Word, WordPad). It's that simple. If a bunch of folks helped we could get these talks knocked out in no time. We would have a treasury of wisdom from Sheen that could be passed on for years to come and to keep the word alive for others. Let me know if you might have an interest. Thank you, Shawn Mueller.

Answers to "What's Your Catholic IQ?"

1. (d) Manna is described as being "like coriander seed (an herb), but white, and it tasted of wafers made with honey" (Exodus 16:31). Most of Exodus 16 deals with this "bread

from heaven."

2. (c) The Romans called the area "Palestine," after the Philistines who used to live in that area.

3. (d) Our 265th pope was born in Bavaria, Germany. Prior to being elected pope, he was the Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, which safeguards the Church's teachings against heresy.

4. (a) Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John are the Four Evangelists. "Evangelium" is the word for "Good News," which is "Godspell" or "Gospel" in English.

5. (b) Since the calendar established by Julius Caesar, known as the Julian calendar, differed by ten days from the solar calendar, Pope Gregory XIII dropped the days from October 4 to October 15, 1582, and made other

adjustments.

6. (c) Mary's Assumption into heaven is not found in Scriptures. From an early period, however, her Dormition ("Falling Asleep") was celebrated on August 15. Pope Pius XII officially defined the dogma in 1950.

7. (b) We read about prayer and incense in Psalm 141:2: "May my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening sacrifice." Church historians note that the first evidence of the Christian use of incense appears to have been in 311, at the funeral of Peter of Alexandria.

8. (a) These words were given to Peter (which means "Rock") in Matthew 16:18.

9. (b) "Corporal" refers to the "bodily" needs of human beings. The Corporal Works of Mercy are biblically based, in Matthew 25:34-40 and Isaiah 58:6-10.

10. (c) "Allelu" means "praise" and "Yah" is the first part of the name "Yahweh." This expression appears in the Psalms and is sung often during worship. Alleluia is not sung during Lent.

Safe Environment Program Information

It is the policy of the Archdiocese of St. Louis that all clergy, employees and volunteers whose service in the Church brings them into contact with children and vulnerable adults must fulfill these requirements:

- ♦ Review and sign Code of Conduct
- ♦ Attend a Protecting God's Children Workshop
- ♦ Have a current background check on file
- ♦ Complete on-going VIRTUS training as required

How is IHM meeting these requirements?

Our parish has about 100 people in salaried and volunteer roles registered in VIRTUS with current information about the various organizations in which they participate.

What else do we need to do?

One of the responsibilities of the Safe Environment Program Coordinator for our parish is to make sure every person working with children or vulnerable adults on a regular basis is identified, registered in VIRTUS, and in compliance with the requirements listed above.

Another responsibility is to verify that VIRTUS contains current email addresses and phone numbers for all active accounts.

How can you help?

- 1. If you have a VIRTUS account, log in to verify that your record is accurate and contains:
- ⇒ A valid personal email address. (Email accounts with the STL suffix is are longer active.)
- ⇒ Your current address, phone numbers, etc.
- 2. If you are no longer in a salaried or volunteer role for a program at IHM or any other parish, your account can be changed to "inactive" status. This eliminates unnecessary maintenance of records.
