Parish Viability

Dear parishioners,

Earlier this year the Archdiocese held a number of meetings to assist parishes in using a uniform tool for assessing parish viability. The goal of such a tool is to help parishes and the Archdiocese get a complete picture of parishes so one can compare "apples to apples" and plan more effectively for the future. The issue facing the future of the Archdiocese is similar to many of those in the United States. Catholic population continues to rise but priest numbers continue to decrease.

The Archdiocese asked each parish to assemble a team of staff and parishioners to help work on the assessment. Our staff members include myself, Deacon Chris, Sarah Aulbach, Shawn Mueller and Laura Orf. The parishioners who I selected to round out the team include Nancy Ast, Jeff Comotto, Ed Etzkorn, Kelly Meyer and John Wappelhorst.

Our group has already met on two occasions to complete the process of the study. The meetings ran a few hours as we completed the questionnaire proposed by the Archdiocese. The assessment tool/questionnaire tried to examine various aspects of parish life. The following subjects were covered in the assessment: Parish as Faith Community; Parish as Worshipping and Praying Community; Parish as Community of Service and Transformation; Parish as Evangelizing Community; and Administrating the Parish Community. Our team discussed and rated the 123 questions of the assessment on a scale of 1 to 7.

The results of these two meetings are available for you in the narthex where there are several copies of the completed survey. PDF copies are being made available on the website for you to download at home. I would ask that if you have the interest and desire, look at the copies in the narthex or download a copy on your computer or device at home. If you have questions, comments or observations please feel free to drop by the office, call or e-mail me with your thoughts. Staff member e-mail addresses can be found in the front of the bulletin. Parish Missionary Disciples

Our parish has been invited by Archbishop Carlson to participate in a pilot program called Parish Missionary Disciples. It is a credit to Father, the parish staff especially Shawn Mueller, and our parishioners that the Archbishop recognizes IHM as a vibrant, growing and welcoming parish. Our committee of 8 consists of Father Tom, Shawn Mueller (director of religious education), Laura Orf (business manager), Tom and Laura Holstein, Denise Bossert, Maria Romine and Steve Farber (parishioners).

We meet one day each month with the trainers from The Catholic Leadership Institute, teams from 5 other parishes, and a group of archdiocesan employees for training.

The program is officially known as **The New Evangelization Leadership Service:** *Forming and Training Disciple Makers.* Those attending are formed to meaningfully, joyfully, and respectfully give witness to how Jesus Christ lives in their hearts, influences their lives, and calls them to wholeness and holiness. They are trained to invite and influence the Catholics of habit or those who come only occasionally but who are most likely on the way out. The outreach may extend to those who have already left the parish. This team creates a plan and SMART Goals to bring the New Evangelization alive in the parish, across many ministries.

Father Tom and the 7 others will form a leadership team who will bring their training back to the parish and invite and train others to be Disciple Makers. The more we have involved, the more people we can reach and invite to come back to the parish. "*To this end, it is more necessary than ever for all the faithful to move from a faith of habit, sustained perhaps by social context alone, to a faith which is conscious and personally lived. The renewal of faith will always be the best way to lead others to the Truth that is Christ*"
