## The Holy Season of Lent

Dear Parishioners,

As we approach the Holy Season of Lent I would like to share with you the various opportunities for personal growth that are available here at IHM. While I am tempted to say spiritual growth, it is more than that. We are all striving for personal growth and maturation as disciples of Jesus Christ. Much of that happens in the realm of our spiritual pursuits, but it is not limited to that. Personal growth embraces every aspect of our being, but it is fueled and focused by an awareness of the primacy of the spiritual in our lives. Here are some of the varied opportunities that Lent affords us.

- Disciple Maker Index On-line Survey I mentioned this earlier this year at the end of the Christmas season. It is exciting that we have been selected by the Archbishop to participate in this program. This study requires as many parishioners as possible completing a 10-15 minute survey online. The survey will only be available from February 17 to March 10 and will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide feedback on what efforts the parish is doing to help you grow. All responses will be confidential and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation I will be offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings throughout the Lenten season from 7:00 PM until 9:00 PM. If it's been a while, please know that I am happy to walk you through the Sacrament. It is not an easy Sacrament to celebrate for many, but it is the most humbling one for me to celebrate as a priest. Many are tempted to think that I see people only at their worst when they come to the Sacrament, but the opposite is true. I see you at your best as you seek God's mercy. His mercy far surpasses any of our sins, and His healing is greater than any of our wounds.
- Daily Mass: Prepare your hearts for the Risen Christ by celebrating the mystery of His Passion, Death and Resurrection with our daily Mass community. One of the best fruits of daily Mass is the deepening awareness of Our Lord's humble gift of Himself to each of us. God calls us to communion through Him, with Him and in Him. Jesus is our path to communion with Our Father, the Holy Spirit and our neighbors.
- Eucharistic Adoration: Monday morning through Friday at noon Our Lord is adored in our chapel. This is not something limited to Lent, but Lent is a good time to consider praying in our chapel once a week for a hour before His mysterious presence. While we can find Our Lord in a variety of ways because He is so present and available to us, the Eucharist is the only Sacrament where He abides with us. Every Sacrament is an encounter with Our Risen Lord, but in the Blessed Sacrament He is present to us in a way that surpasses all the rest. The combination to our chapel door is 145.
- Thursday Prayer Sessions: On the Thursdays of Lent I will be hosting prayer sessions in Stoltz Grand Hall. The sessions will begin at 7:00 and run about an hour to an hour and a half. You need not attend all of them, though it might be helpful when I have some prayer experiences that may be covered over a few weeks. My plan is to make these times together informative and practical. More than anything else, encouraging and fostering your relationship with God is my greatest desire as a pastor.
- Stations of the Cross: Every Friday of Lent we will have Stations of the Cross in our chapel at 7:00 PM. This wonderful devotion given to us by God through the love of St. Francis of Assisi invites us to reflect on the Passion and Death of Jesus. We are called to walk with Jesus and witness His life offered up for our Redemption. On Good Friday the Stations will be in church and in the afternoon at 1:00 pm.
- **BestLentever.com:** Join Matthew Kelly, the best-selling Catholic author in America, on a life-changing journey through your Best Lent Ever. Each week, participants will receive short videos and inspiration from Matthew that explain the genius of Catholicism and empower them to become the best-version-of-themselves. It's simple and completely FREE, the only cost is your commitment to live better each day this Lent.

One note of caution—it's better to pick one thing to do well than to try and undertake too many things that are done poorly. The Lord is not looking for us to become spiritual busy-bodies during Lent, but to develop hearts that are more attentive and responsive to His grace. There are so many opportunities, pray and discern well as we enter into this season of grace.

## FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

Then to all, Christ said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day, and follow in my steps." (Lk 9:23)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

**Ash Wednesday (February 18) and Good Friday (April 3)** are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means abstinence from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

**All Fridays in Lent** are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

## We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.



## Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - Liturgical Seasons

With the season of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, you may be wondering about the liturgical year. The liturgical year begins in Advent, and consists of six liturgical seasons:

Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time after Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time after Pentecost. "In the liturgical year the Church celebrates the whole mystery of Christ from his Incarnation to his return in glory." (*Compendium*, 242). 

As we begin the season of Lent we would like to emphasize this season of prayer and healing by inviting you to add your personal prayers to those of the our entire community. Please look for a container on the table in the narthex where you can place your prayer requests. Lent we ask everyone in our

community to pray for all of them. Lent is a special time of the year for us as a community to pray for each other and to prepare ourselves for the Glorious Resurrection.



#### Answers to Catholic IQ

- 1. (a) Celebrated in December, Hanukkah is an eight-day festival that commemorates the miracle of the multiplication of lamp oil after the Maccabees cleansed the Temple from defilement (see 1 Maccabees 4:36-59).
- 2. (c) While Fr. Tom is noted for his care and prayer for the dying and the deceased, and while he frequently works with funeral homes, mortician school was not on his resume as preparation for his priesthood.
- 3. (d) Zion, also known as the "city of David," is the name of the hill on which Jerusalem was built. The two words—Zion and Jerusalem—are often used interchangeably.
- 4. (c) Levi is one of the 12 sons of Jacob. He is the one for whom the priestly tribe of Levi is named.
- **5. (d)** According to early tradition, Mary's mother's name was Anne (or Hannah). However, she is not named in the Scriptures. (Nor is the name of Mary's father mentioned in Scripture. According to tradition, he was called Joachim.) Many people erroneously confuse Mary's Immaculate Conception with the virgin
- 6. (a) Mary's birthday is celebrated on September 8, nine months after the celebration of her Immaculate Conception (December 8).
- 7. (b) The statue, dedicated in March 1904, commemorates the peaceful settlement of a nineteenth-century conflict between the two Latin American countries.
- 8. (a) The vessel is also used to hold the reserved hosts in the tabernacle.
- 9. (a) The winged ox is the symbol of St. Luke because of his emphasis on Jesus' sacrificial priesthood. The winged symbols for the four Evangelists—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—are based on biblical visions recounted in Ezekiel 1:4-10 and Revela-
- 10. (d) The glorious triumph of Christ's kingship is emphasized on the last Sunday of the Church year.
