Dear parishioners,

Next weekend we celebrate Labor Day and mark the end of the summer season and prepare for Autumn. While summer continues for a few more weeks we know that our lives enter upon a more serious time of work and life. Students have already returned to school, most of our vacation plans are either completed or tabled and life becomes more focused. Hard to believe that summer has passed so quickly. We continue to pray for all those affected by the unusual weather this year. We had one of the wettest Springs, a more temperate Summer



and as I type this article, it is 54 degrees on the Feast of St. Louis. (August 25). I'm not complaining, but it is out of the norm.

A few years ago I started offering additional time for Reconciliation on Wednesday evenings . Beginning this September and continuing through the PSR school year I will start at 7:00 PM. I hope that some of our parents will be able to take advantage of the earlier time. Time should never be an issue. I will take as much time as necessary to help you celebrate the Sacrament and experience the Lord's healing mercy.

I will continue to hear Confessions on Saturday mornings. One word of note: I don't tend to linger in the Confessional and leave if there is a lull of more then 15 minutes. However I usually just go to my office and will happily return to celebrate Reconciliation. Few things can change our lives more than a good Confession. Few things can draw us deeper into the life of Jesus Christ than developing a good habit of regular Confession. It is our faithful celebration of Confession that opens us to the more complete experience of being set free by the truth. The Lord loves us more than we could ever imagine. When we present ourselves before Him in humble contrition we begin to experience an even richer foretaste of the great Banquet of the Kingdom, foreshadowed by this Sacrament and the Eucharist. Eucharist and Confession are the very lungs with which we inhale the vibrant life of the Holy Spirit. If you and I are breathing with both of these lungs, our lives will be radiant with Christ. We will experience the truth of His words: "I will be with you always, until the end of time."

Highlights: Students who participate in the parish school of religion program will......

- ⇒ Have a catechist who will be praying and working with parents, striving to be both a good teacher of the course lessons and subject matter, as well as being another adult witness to the beauty and gift of the Catholic faith.
- ⇒ Have access to Ignatius Press' Faith and Life textbooks that have been recommended by great teachers and leaders in the faith such as Dr. Scott Hahn to be a fitting guide to growth in Christ and in the teachings of the Church.
- ⇒ Have access to the Faith and Life text **online**, which includes not only the text, but engaging games, video links and more. - ⇒ Be tested in their lessons so as to ensure to parents the students are learning the content of the faith lesson. Passing a cumulative test will earn the students a "pass" to the next year, and a wristband to wear as well.
- ⇒ Learn in more detail the lives of the saints, these "holy heroes" and models of faith. Each class will have a "patron saint" in which catechists will study the life of in more detail and present various aspects of the life and virtue of this particular individual.



From the Lighthouse Catholic CD Rack: Narthex



Today there is oftentimes a misconception of what the Sacrament of Confirmation is actually for or how it affects our lives. In this talk, Dr. Brant Pitre invites us to better understand the tremendous graces and calling received through this sacrament. He points to various passages in scripture which provide a historical foundation and, through bold

Stay on the ground or get back up?

It is easy to lay down, it is easy to allow things to change and you stay still, it is easy to be apathetic. It takes courage, strength, perseverance, temperance... To stay strong in the faith!

Father Tom spoke about in his homily this past weekend, August 22 and 23, about a growing epidemic across all Christian faith... People are leaving the Church. But I have another question- where they ever really there? If they can give up so easy, did they know Christ? Or just know of him?

We can praise His name and affirm who he is. We can offer gifts of our treasure and our talent to the parish and serving His church. We can also spend quality time with Him in adoration and during the sacrifice of the Mass.
