Childish or Child-like?

The Gospel for Easter this year reminds me of little children. Mary of Magdala runs from the tomb when she sees it has been opened. Then Peter and the other disciple race each other to the tomb. The other one wins the race but Peter goes in first (John 20:1-5). I can picture the disciple stopping suddenly and Peter running into him, tripping and ending up in the tomb. But putting slapstick aside, there is another way they are like children.


Remember the Gospel about St. Thomas, who would not believe Jesus' resurrection until he could see him? Compare that to the disciple in today's reading, who "saw [the empty tomb] and believed" (John 20:9). That is real faith. For all he knew, someone could have taken Jesus' body and left the cloths behind. But he must have remembered Je-

sus saying that he would rise again. That is the kind of faith we find in a little child.

Children will believe in things they cannot see, especially if there is a good reason. We "bribe" them into believing in Santa Claus or the tooth fairy by giving them Christmas presents or money under the pillow. They will also believe in Someone real who they cannot see. If we teach them that God made them and loves them, if we love them ourselves and teach them to love others, they will have good reasons to believe in God. As they get older, we can teach them how to pray, save money for the poor, visit the sick, or volunteer to help the homeless. We can reinforce what they learn in religion class and encourage them as they prepare for First Communion or confirmation.

Jesus didn't say that only children could enter the Kingdom. He said we must become like children if we want to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3). What he means is that not only can we help teach children how to have faith, we can also learn from them about faith. Becoming like children does not mean being selfish or stubborn, throwing tantrums when we don't get our way. Those are childish behaviors that we put aside. Instead, we can keep a child-like faith and trust in God. Teaching them about God is a great way to help our own faith to grow. By giving them real examples of God's love for them, they will continue to believe long after they have given up the fairy tales of childhood.

Blessed Easter

Dear parishioners,

May the joy of the Risen Christ touch and transform your lives! I pray that the peace which Jesus offers to the apostles and those gathered on that first Easter morning will be experienced personally and profoundly by each of you. I am reminded of St. Augustine's thoughts on the experience of Lent and Easter:

“Because there are these two periods of time - the one that now is beset with the trials and troubles of this life, and the other yet to come, a life of everlasting serenity and joy - we are given two liturgical seasons, one before Easter and the other after. The season before Easter signifies the troubles in which we live here and now, while the time after Easter which we are celebrating at present signifies the happiness that will be ours in the future. What we commemorate before Easter is what we experience in this life; what we celebrate after Easter points to something we do not yet possess. This is why we keep the first season with fasting and prayer; but now the fast is over and we devote the present season to praise. Such is the meaning of the *Alleluia* we sing.

“Now therefore, brethren, we urge you to praise God. That is what we are all telling each other when we say Alleluia. You say to your neighbor, “Praise the Lord!” and he says the same to you. We are all urging one another to praise the Lord, and all thereby doing what each of us urges the other to do. But see that your praise comes from your whole being; in other words, see that you praise God not with your lips and voices alone, but with your minds, your lives and all your actions.”

Praise the Lord!! May this Easter season be a time of profound celebration as we repeat our Alleluias with ever deepening faith. May we savor the richness of Christ’s victory over sin and death. May we take time to prayerfully reflect on God’s desire to save us from sin and death. May each of us know in our hearts how Christ has saved us. The more particular and concrete our awareness, the deeper and richer our gratitude will be. May this Easter be a time of overflowing gratitude for the gifts of life and faith. May we respond generously to all that God has done in the work of redemption!



SEXUAL ABUSE SURVIVOR GROUPS



Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was one of the best-known and best-loved Catholic orators of the twentieth century, reaching millions of Christians of all denominations. Presented here are his timeless reflections on the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord, combined with Scripture and Gregorian Chant to create a powerful presentation that is sure to become a family favorite.

The Resurrection: Miracle of Miracles

There are many great works examining the evidence for the Resurrection. Evangelical Christians Lee Strobel, Gary Habermas and William Craig have written and debated extensively on the topic. Catholics have an additional piece of evidence that is often missed in the discussion, the post-resurrection apparitions of Jesus throughout history (i.e. to St. Faustina in 1933). Below is a summary of some points regarding evidence for the Resurrection made into a memory aid.

E How to explain the empty tomb? It would have been impossible for Jesus' disciples to have believed in their master's resurrection if his corpse still lay in the tomb. But it is equally incredible to suppose that the disciples could have stolen the body and perpetrated a hoax.


A How to explain the testimony of all those who saw, touched, conversed, and even ate with the Lord? In particular, how does one explain the incredible life / conversion of St. Paul without him seeing the risen Lord? What of all the appearances and miracles of Jesus after the New Testament era?

S How to explain the multiple faceted evidence of various fields of science in its studies of the Shroud of Turin, the alleged burial cloth of Jesus? If ever there was a tangible sign pointing to the reality of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus it is the Shroud.

T How to explain the reaction of the apostles, who transformed from great fear and hiding, to going out into the whole world to share their testimony and witness of the resurrected Christ and His Gospel, even to giving their lives as martyrs in death? (And so many martyrs after them).

E Along with the mention of the eyewitness testimony of the apostles, what of the hundreds of other eyewitnesses to the Risen Christ? Of worthy note is the eyewitness testimony of the women which, at the time, would have been a somewhat embarrassing detail, given the lack of acceptance of women's testimony in the wider culture.

R How to explain the rise of Christianity? "Christianity without the resurrection is like a car without an engine; it gets you nowhere." If the Resurrection didn't happen it would be a greater miracle to perpetuate such a hoax. What could make so many devout Jews steeped in a tradition that extended for thou-


