

### Deeper Understanding of Scripture



### The Assumption of Mary — and the IHM Projector

You may have noticed that before Masses the Gospel that is read for each liturgical Sunday is posted on the projector screen, accompanied by sacred images and other art. Each slide is shown for around 30 seconds. The goal is to help "prepare the soil," that is, prepare one to hear the Gospel for the Sunday. It is meant to also be a means of prayer and meditation, to increase one's religious imagination and to deepen their relationship with the Lord through His revealed word. 



