

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

St. Augustine tells us that a "Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps." As we look around and out at the world. we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life's necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world's ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes. Why doesn't God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he

would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world's ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine, God could use her as his mind, heart, voice,

and hand. She became God's vessel so that God's greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God's fix for the world's difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God's instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and just world it would be.

Fourth Sunday of Advent and Merry Christmas!

Dear Parishioners and Guests:

If you are reading this on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, our time for Christmas is nigh! With less than a week to go before the Solemn Feast of the Incarnation, we prepare our hearts and homes for such a mighty Guest. May these remaining days be filled with ever-growing anticipation. The Gospel of this Sunday presents us with the beautiful and familiar scene of the Visitation. The Blessed Mother bears the recently incarnated Jesus in her own womb as she hastens to meet St. Elizabeth to share her joy in preparing for the birth of John the Baptist.

For those reading this on Christmas:

On behalf of all of the staff I wish you and your families a very Blessed and Merry Christmas! As we gather to celebrate Christmas let us reflect upon the uniqueness of our faith as Christians. We celebrate the mystery of God made flesh. While we joyfully reflect upon that first Christmas when the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph received the newborn Christ, we are reminded by the Gospel of St. John that Jesus is God's eternal Word. The Word was with God in the beginning and all that is came to be through God's Word and the working of the Holy Spirit.

Alone among the religions of the world we Christians celebrate the profound intimacy of our God who became like us in all things but sin. We celebrate our faith in one God who is a community of Persons, overflowing with abundant creative life and love. Our creation is the fruit of that abundant crea-

tive love. No necessity, no hidden desire or motive, no need "caused" creation other than the overflowing mystery of Trinitarian love. God creates us to chare in His life, and gives us revelation and faith to form that life. It's hard to grasp or even begin to appreciate a love like that because all of our "loves" bear some weight of need and necessity. In God's love there is no need or necessity but only desire for the beloved. Ever so slowly we

pray that such love will transform us humbly and subtly into the likeness of the One who loves us.

As Catholics we not only share in the profound intimacy of our God with our brothers and sisters of other Christian faiths, we also acknowledge that God comes to us in the Eucharist. Few experiences are meant to be more intimate than holding the Lord in our hands, being fed by His Body and Blood and experiencing the mystery of communion upon our reception of Him. May we accept the invitation to come to the altar, to open our ears to God's loving truth in Scripture, to praise the Father for the gift of His Son, to offer ourselves in union with Jesus, and to implore the Holy Spirit to give us the Body and Blood of Jesus while forming us into active members of the Body of Christ. Like the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph we are privileged to welcome, behold and receive the Son of God. We receive Him in humility and cradle Him in gratitude. O Come let us adore Him!


Dynamic Catholic Alive! Surrender to God

Advent and Beyond: A Time to Reflect on Love, Service and the Works of Mercy Present (or not present) in our lives



Recall that from 2015-2016 Pope Francis decreed a special year of mercy in which he directed the faithful to reflect and act on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. He wrote, "It is my burning desire that, during this Jubilee, the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. It will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty. And let us enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God's mercy. Jesus introduces us to these works of mercy in his preaching so that we can know whether or not we are living as his disciples. Let us rediscover these corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. And


let us not forget the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead."

To DO the works of Mercy, it is helpful to first KNOW the works of mercy. Many are familiar with the Corporal Works of Mercy. While there is a need for the Corporal Works of Mercy in all times and places,, in America, it could be said that we are in greater need of the Spiritual Works of Mercy. Here are the Spiritual Works with some relevant Scriptures, as well as a memory aid.

- 1. Admonish the sinner: Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, (Colossians 3:16)
- 2. Instruct the ignorant: "Philip.. asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' And he said, 'How can I, unless some one guides me?'" (Acts 8:30)
- 3. Counsel the doubtful: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you...Let not your hearts be troubled..." Jn. 14:27
- 4. Comfort the sorrowful: "Come to me, all you grown weary and burdened, and I will refresh you." Mt. 11:28 Bear one another's burdens. (Gal 6:2)
- 5. Bear wrongs patiently: "...Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you." Lk. 6:27-28.
- 6. Forgive all injuries: "If you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Mat 6:12 ff).
- 7. Pray for the living and the dead:

Pray at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. (Eph 6:18)


