YOUR REWARD WILL BE GREAT IN HEAVEN

Today's Gospel from Luke is the Sermon on the Plain with the Beatitudes, what we usually think of as the Sermon on the Mount. It seems as though Jesus is congratulating those who would have been considered unfortunate, doesn't it? The Beatitude statements overturn the concept of "fortunate" in Jesus' time, naming those who are poor, hungry, mourning, or marginalized as those who should rejoice.

Jesus continues with prophetic and startling "Woe to you!" statements, directed to those usually thought of as blessed. Heavenly reward is not a privilege of the rich and comfortable but a blessing for all who trust in God, whose reward will be great in heaven.

The first reading and the psalm take a somewhat different focus: trust in God, not people or things of this world. One who trusts in God is fortunate, like a plant that produces good fruit, sustained by living waters and currents of grace. "Not so the wicked," who wither and vanish, blowing away like the illusions of their self-absorption.

Paul, in the second reading, confronts members of the early Christian community of Corinth who were doubting, or devaluing, belief in Jesus' resurrection and the general resurrection of the dead. Depending on the material world in their spiritual pride, they believed that their righteousness was something they had achieved on their own. They

felt self-sufficient, "rich," not in need of the ongoing saving power of Christ's resurrection that completes the sacrifice of Good Friday through Easter, which is our true blessing.

So, congratulations! Acknowledging our need for God, we are rich in the Kingdom love of our Father. Our hunger is satisfied by the sustaining nourishment of the Spirit. Our weeping is "turned into dancing" knowing that Jesus is with us in our sorrows, in fact knew them when he walked upon earth. Reasons enough for us to rejoice, always, even when people treat us badly. God's reward to us is the Kingdom, now and always.

MATURING DISCIPLESHIP

Dear Parishioners,

I have mentioned this numerous times in homilies and want to reiterate that one can be a good person without ever going to church or even professing a private or personal faith. While the source of all goodness is from God, it is possible for people to be good without ever acknowledging the source of goodness in this life. We should thank God for all the good people we know who are part of our community and contribute to the overall goodness of society.

One cannot be a disciple without an active and practiced faith. If you were baptized you were called to be a disciple. A life of discipleship is rooted in the Sacraments, and seeks service and study. We want to embrace and advocate an active and living faith in Jesus Christ. Passive faith often leads to a lack of practice and little desire to serve or study what should be our greatest love. Boredom with God, faith or the life of the church is really a confession of a lazy and/or bored person.

One of the first things a maturing disciple should strive to practice is self-awareness. We want to heed the words of the ancient Greeks and "know thyself." As I mentioned in the January Year of Life homily we want to move beyond expressions of "how I feel" to statements of "what I believe." Statements of belief incorporate feelings, thoughts, and reflection on knowledge and experience. We want to deepen our self-awareness through prayer and reflection on our own pilgrimage of life. One of Our Lord's promises is

that we will have greater self-awareness by losing ourselves in discipleship to Him.

One of the first things you will discover when you seriously reflect upon your life and what you believe is your own sinfulness. Self-awareness leads to self-accusation. This is not bad news. This is actually GREAT news. We want to know our sinfulness so we can approach the Divine Healer and Font of Mercy with full confidence and complete contrition. The great souls that have gone before us know this truth. Our saints testify to the mercy of God because they have pulled off the blinders on their own sinfulness and have embraced self-accusation.

These topics are much easier to write about than to practice. Anyone serious about self-awareness and self-accusation knows that once you set on the path of maturing discipleship it never ends. If we seriously and intentionally embrace the pursuit of these habits of the soul it will open the door to greater humility and patience.





Archbishop Carlson Comments on State legislatures extreme abortion laws


St. Peter Damian didn't mince words. Take a look on the internet regarding his words on homosexual practices, the vice of sodomy, the need of correction of lust, evil bishops, etc. In our PC culture of today, St. Peter Damian would probably be locked up by the state or chastised by fellow clergy for such "insensitivity" or "hate speech." In all things, however, love is the motive. He has been declared a saint, after all. If one is concerned for the salvation of others, both in time and in eternity, then one can see that there is "a time for everything" and sometimes there is a time to call sin out. St. Peter Damian may be noted for his strong words, but as a Doctor of the Church, there is more than just critique. Here are two quotes:

"Do not be depressed. Do not let your weakness make you impatient. Instead, let the serenity of your spirit shine through your face. Let the joy of your mind burst forth."

"Receive the Body and Blood of Christ very frequently. The sight of a Christian's lips red with the Blood of Christ terrifies the enemy. He immediately recognizes the sign of his own ruin. He cannot stand the instrument of divine victory by which he was taken captive and cast down."

St. Peter Damian describes an important Eucharistic miracle of which he was a direct witness. In his own words, Damian writes: "This is a Eucharistic event of great importance. It took place in 1050. Giving in to a horrible temptation, a woman was about to take the Eucharistic Bread home to use the Sacred Species for sorcery. But a priest noticed what

she had done and ran after her, taking away from her the Host she had sacrilegiously stolen. Then he unfolded the white linen cloth in which the sacred Host had been wrapped and found that the Host had been transformed in such a way that Half had become visibly the Body of Christ, while the other Half preserved the normal look of a Host. With such a clear testimony, God wanted to win over unbelievers and heretics who refused to accept the Real Presence of the Eucharistic mystery: in one half of the consecrated bread the Body of Christ was visible, while in the other the natural form, thus highlighting the reality of the sacramental transubstantiation taking place at the Consecration." This event is depicted on one of the "Eucharistic Miracle Displays" that have been here at our parish and beyond. 
