

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

The Gospels continue to challenge us to the core. This is especially true in the way our social relationships have developed. Feeling safe and secure in the world are not things that come easily these days. Actually, we may find ourselves feeling more reservation, caution, reluctance, and fear than ever before. In a moment's notice, life can drastically change. When someone has been intentionally and violently hurt, especially someone we love, we can all too easily find ourselves very attracted to the Old Testament philosophy of "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."

Intellectually, we know this is not what Jesus wants us to do. But on some level it just seems to make practical or even political sense. After all, why should we allow someone to get away with a heinously violent act? Yet, Jesus cannot be any clearer than he is with this! Offer no resistance to one who is evil. Turn the other cheek as well. When pressed into service, go two miles. Do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. Love your enemies. Now, take a moment to reflect on all of this. Consider a horrible act of violence committed against someone you love. Listen. Think. Be honest. Can you do as Jesus directs?

We want to be holy. But we are more comfortable with a definition of holiness that can keep us saying our prayers and on our knees in church. We are not comfortable with a definition of holiness that has something to say about to how we react to and negotiate life. We like to keep a sharp and strong line between the secular and the sacred. In fact, we would prefer that the doors between them be kept closed. God wants us to be holy as He is holy. If God sees this one way and we see it another, then where does this leave us on our journey to God?

Our minds like the practical, worldly, and secular answers to things. They are more black and white and at first glance appear to make more sense. Holiness wells up from our souls and is beyond reason. It cannot be explained. It is something we just simply know comes as a result of deep prayer. The truly contemplative eye knows inwardly that what Jesus asks is true and then willingly does it. It may not be easy.

Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving

Dear Parishioners,

As we prepare to enter Lent the Church urges us to make it a season of service and sacrifice for God and neighbor. All of our Lenten disciplines should free us to love God and neighbor with greater joy and zeal. May our fasting and abstinence increase our hunger for God. May our prayer challenge and encourage us to seek God always. May our almsgiving makes us more aware of God's bountiful blessings to us. These common Lenten disciplines are meant to make God the center of our lives and the focal point of our desires.

One of the greatest things about being Catholic is the immense spiritual treasury that lies under our proverbial feet. In a world that is constantly inviting us to embrace the new and rush blindly onto the "next big thing" the Church humbly beckons us to pause, discern and receive from Her vast treasury of teaching and spirituality. Throughout the Lenten season I will be sharing various prayers and readings that you may want to use during Lent or other times.

During Lent you will notice a few changes in the way we celebrate Mass. Mass will begin with the simple ringing of a bell to call us to prayer. We will be using the Confiteor during the penitential rite of Mass. The absence of the Gloria and Alleluia will mark part of our liturgical fasting from our normal celebration. The Sundays of Lent I will be using the Eucharistic prayers for Reconciliation. You will not find them in your Sunday Missal, but they are in the weekday one. Copies will be made available on the baptismal font for those who like to follow the prayer as it is said.

During Lent I will be offering additional opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please know that I am more than happy to help you make a good Confession if it has been years since you have celebrated the Sacrament. Good Confessions can be life changing. To really know the love of God and His healing mercy is a powerful experience in our lives. If you go on a regular basis, think of it as becoming steeped in the mercy and grace of Jesus. Jesus wants to wash us clean in His mercy. Jesus desires to affect a radical transformation in our attitude, behavior and life. We are all in the process of having the veil of sin and indifference lifted from our eyes and hearts so that we might see the beauty and glory of our faith with eyes wide open and hearts alive with the Spirit. The lifting of this veil equips us to serve God without fear or hesitation.


St. Paul Library / Lighthouse CD Resources


From the Lighthouse Catholic CD Rack: Narthex


