

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

People are not property. We cannot exchange them at will or simply use them for our own designs and purposes. What does the word "commitment" mean to you? We can begin to understand its meaning by looking at some synonyms: dedication, devotion, allegiance, loyalty, faithfulness, fidelity, and bond. Commitment is primarily about relationship, and Jesus is all about relationships: how our lives affect others. how we treat our brothers and sisters. how we resolve conflict, and how we view the vows of marriage. Jesus' teachings on obeying the commandments, murder, reconciliation, marriage, divorce, and adultery all stem from the sacredness of commitment.

All of this has a God connection.

We can easily see one another as interchangeable and dispensable. We treat so much of our lives this way. What works today may not be what I want tomorrow. We search and search for the right thing only to find our hearts still restless in the end. Is real happiness achievable this side of the grave? Sometimes we expect too much out of others and want our relationships to fill a hole that we must figure out how to fill ourselves. Any seasoned married couple will tell you that their love for one another changes as time passes. Even though the understanding of romance changes as life changes, the dedication, devotion,

allegiance, loyalty, faithfulness, and fidelity all remain and even deepen.

Some relationships can be hurtful, and God does not want us to live with abuse or pain. Also, how a relationship develops is sometimes out of our control, and we become the victim of someone else's decision. But we can't be self-focused in our relationships and see them exclusively as self-fulfilling ends. We are companions on life's journey with varying depths of relationships being enjoyed by all who are with us along the way. We have the freedom to choose. God asks us to do so wisely, with right judgment and thinking.

Dear Parishioners.

A year or two ago my AOL e-mail account was hacked and in the period of 24 hours they sent out tons of e-mails and used the information to also hack my Microsoft and Amazon accounts. I was fortunate that I caught it early in the morning and was able to regain control of my accounts by the end of the day. Only e-mails coming from Askpadre@aol.com or revtcm@aol.com are from me. The revtcm account is the main account. but I don't use it for personal communication. It was the account that I originally made with AOL back in the 90's. Askpadre is the one you will find in the bulletin and is my primary means of e-mail communication.

I have been made aware that someone is texting and creating fake email accounts

using my name asking parishioners for donations in the form of gift cards/PayPal. If you receive a text or an email allegedly from me or a parish staff member, originating from an email address with a domain other than the parish's domain, which is ihmnewmelle.org, or my own accounts, please ensure the authenticity of the email before responding. No action should be taken and please contact the parish office. My cell phone # is in the bulletin, and it is the only number I possess. If you get a text from me that is not from 314-303-2428 it is not from me. Please also note that I don't sign messages with Rev. Fr. Tom Miller, Pastor as a conclusion to a message.




Did you know? Every participating family receives a free 8x10 portrait and a printed and electronic copy of our directory. Be a part of it! Sign up today.







Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of Christ and the Church St. Peter Damian: Feast Day February 21

St. Peter Damian is one of the close to 40 "doctors" of the Church. Doctor of the Church is a title given by the Catholic Church to saints recognized as having made a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through their research, study, or writing. One interesting work of St. Peter Damian was called "the Book of Gomorrah", a letter he wrote to Pope St. Leo IX in 1049 in response to an epidemic of sexual perversion, moral laxity and other abuses both in the priesthood and in the laity of the Church. As it has been said, history may not repeat itself, but it certainly does rhyme.

Here this powerful testimony from this doctor of the Church, taken from one of the Eucharistic Miracle display panels as described in the Vatican Exhibit booklet, "Eucharistic Miracles of the World." St. Peter Damian, a Doctor of the Church, describes an important Eucharistic miracle of which he was a direct witness. We present the Italian translation of the episode as the Saint himself describes it: "This is a Eucharistic event of great importance. It took place in 1050. Giving in to a horrible temptation, a woman was about to take a consecrated Eucharistic host home to use the Sacred Species for sorcery. But a priest noticed what she had done and ran after her, taking away from her the Host she had sacrilegiously stolen. Then he unfolded the white linen cloth in which the sacred Host had been transformed in such a way that half had become visible the Body of Christ, while the other half preserved the normal look of a Host. With such a clear testimony, God wanted to win over unbelievers and heretics who refused to accept the Real Presence of the Eucharistic mystery: in one half of the consecrated bread the Body of Christ was visible, while in the other the natural form, thus highlighting the reality of the sacramental transubstantiation taking place at the Consecration."


