

### PAUL THE PEOPLE PLEASER?

Last week we heard St. Paul saying that he was all things to all people. This week, we hear that he tried to please everyone. To modern ears, that sounds more like a used car salesman, who has just the right deal for any buyer. But that wasn't what Paul meant. The key to Paul's way of life is the last line of the second reading: "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." (1 Cor 11:1)

Remember when Paul was still Saul, the Jew who persecuted Christians? When he was struck by lightning he heard, not thunder, but the voice of Jesus, who asked why Saul was persecuting him. Paul later began

to understand that all Christians make up the body of Christ. As members of that body, we can show others what Jesus is like, by our example. That seems to be a two part process.

First, to show Christ, we have to know Christ. We can do that by reading the scriptures and praying with them. We can receive the sacraments regularly, especially Reconciliation, where we experience his forgiveness and love, and the Eucharist, where Jesus unites himself with us, so that we can become more like him.

The second part is acting like Jesus. If we want people to see Christ in us, we don't dress like him, or grow a

beard. We have to do things as Jesus would: Forgive people who hurt us, care for the sick, the dying, the poor. Don't be afraid to tell people what God has done for you; encourage others to be grateful for what God has done for them. Pray with people who have difficulty talking to God.

Paul obviously didn't please everyone, or he wouldn't have ended his life in prison. He was more interested in pleasing God by spreading the Good News of Jesus' resurrection. If we can imitate Paul in that way, we can't go wrong.

### LENTEN HABITS

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Wednesday we begin our annual Lenten preparation for Easter. There are a number of things I want to make you aware of as we enter this new liturgical season. Many of these are just a personal choice and are not mandated by the Church, but rather chosen by me as a way of enhancing our celebration of the season.

**Simple Entrance:** Since my early days as a priest I have liked the idea of processing into church by the sound of a simple chime or bell. My hope was that it would provide a more reflective state of mind as we enter the liturgy.

**Confiteor:** This form of the penitential rite can be done anytime, but it is especially fitting for Lent as we examine our sins in preparation for receiving the Lord. The penitential rite itself does not forgive sin, but rather calls to mind that we can approach God with confidence because He is merciful.

Apostle's Creed: During Lent we have the option to say the Apostle's Creed instead of the Nicene Creed. While the Apostle's Creed is older than the Nicene Creed it is not as complete in its explanation of the theological elements professed in a creed.

**Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation**: The last few Lent's I have made it a point to pray these Eucharistic Prayers as part of our celebration. They tend to emphasize the themes of mercy and reconciliation. I don't think these prayers are in our new missals, so it will require more attention at Mass.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: During the Lenten season I will be offering additional times to celebrate the Sacrament. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday I will be in my Confessional from 7:00pm until 8:30pm or until the last confession is heard. Please know that if you have some hesitation about celebrating the Sacrament, I am more than happy to walk you through the Sacrament. Nobody wants you to be reconciled to God more than He does.

Stations of the Cross: While not part of Mass, the Stations invite us to reflect upon the last hours of Our Lord's life. This year we have a few different varieties to experience. Hopefully I can talk with the Deacons and will be able to let you know what version we are praying on a given Friday of Lent.

## #EATMORE Fish

The tales of why the Church embraced eating fish at Lent are as big as the one that got away. Especially this account: Centuries ago, the pope required Catholics to eat fish on Fridays to support a floundering fishing indus-

try rife with financial troubles. — Oh, that's a good one! Urban legends aside, the reasons our Church has taken to these little or big — swimmers as a source of penitential sacrifice are rooted in the idea of remembering the betrayal and crucifixion of Christ. No law states that Catholics must eat fish on the Fridays of Lent, but it's a rule that we must abstain from eating the meat of warmblooded animals. The practice of abstinence among Christians dates back centuries — and was mentioned in the Didache, the Teaching

of the Twelve Apostles, written around the first or second century.

Among the simplest ways of explaining our fascination with fish? It was a natural go-to back in the day, especially among those without means. Meat was a luxury, hence why fish came onto the Lenten scene.

Fish frys these days aren't fixed on the fin, though. Menus include vegetables, meatless pastas, ethnic specialties such as tamales and even the legs of our amphibian friends. But the overriding element is the sense of community built when more than one are gathered in His name.

As we pledge to eat more fish — or other meatless fare — let us make this Lent a good one.

### Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." JOHN 3:16-17

> The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2018) and Good Friday (March 30, 2018) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

### Valentine's Day coincides with Ash Wednesday this year

Catholics throughout the world recognize Ash Wednesday as the solemn beginning of a period of prayerful reflection and penance, as is evident by the large number of churchgoers on this day. In view of the significance of Ash Wednesday, the obligation of fast and abstinence must naturally be the priority in the Catholic community.

Valentine's Day can appropriately be celebrated the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which also happens to be Mardi Gras, a traditionally festive time before beginning our Lenten observance.



### What's your Catholic Catechism IQ?

It is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, under (now saint) Pope John Paul II, who wrote, "The Catechism is offered to every individual who asks us to give an account of the hope that is in us (cf. 1 Pet 3:15) and who wants to know what the Catholic Church believes." ### Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: St. Francis of Assisi (Feast: October 4<sup>th</sup>)

Apart from the Lord Jesus Himself, few saints have had such an impact on the life of the Church as St. Francis of Assisi. Where does one begin to highlight, summarize his influence on the life of the Church or the mysteries, marvels and miracles associated with his life? A good place to start might be the DVD depicted below, which is based on the official writings of Brother Thomas Celano, a close companion and friar with St. Francis who spent many years with the saint. Brother

Thomas called Francis an "alter Christos" who was like "a holy mirror of the sanctity of the Lord, and an image of His perfection." One reviewer on Amazon wrote: "When purchasing this DVD I assumed that it dealt primarily with the miraculous events in the Saint's life. Though some aspects of the miracles are covered, like the miracle of the swallows and of the fish, and of course the stigmata (the theological aspects of these miracle are superbly explained), the gist of this presentation is really the miracle of the LIFE of St. Francis; a life filled with a true love for Jesus Christ." We recently highlighted the Franciscan Priest, St. Padre Pio and the stigmata he shared. It would be fitting to mention St. Francis' stigmata as well.

The Chapel of the Stigmata is perched on the edge of the same sheer precipice where Saint Francis stood two years before his death and where he was swept up into the mystery of God's overwhelming love for him and for humanity. Saint Bonaventure, in his Life of St. Francis, describes Francis as being more inflamed than usual with the love of God as he began a special time of prayer at Mount

La Verna in September of 1224. Bonaventure goes on: "While Francis was praying on the mountainside, he saw a Seraph with six fiery and shining wings descend from the height of heaven. And when in swift flight the Seraph had reached a spot in the air near the man of God, there appeared between the wings the figure of a man crucified, with his hands and feet extended in the form of a cross and fastened to a cross. Two of the wings were lifted above his head, two were extended for flight and two covered his whole body.

"When Francis saw this, he was overwhelmed and his heart was flooded with a mixture of joy and sorrow. He rejoiced because of the gracious way Christ looked upon him under the form of a Seraph, but the fact that he was fastened to a cross pierced his soul with a sword of compassionate sorrow." When the vision disappeared, writes Bonaventure, Francis was left with a "marvelous ardor" in his heart. At the same time, there "was imprinted on his body markings that were no less marvelous." These markings were the stigmata.

More about the Seraph There are two things to dwell on here. First is the seraph. Seraphs are angels closest to God, burning with love as they bow before the most high God, shouting "Holy, holy, holy!" Their fiery wings suggest the flaming



intensity of God's love that Christ communicated to Francis, which, in turn, set Francis' heart afire. The word seraphic is often used to describe Francis' passionate style of relating to God and is often applied to the Franciscan Order, which is sometime called the Seraphic Order. Second, we focus on "the gracious way that Christ looked upon him." This is something of a repeat of the vision Francis had in the beginning of his spiritual life in which "Jesus appeared to him fastened on a cross, and Francis' soul melted at the sight, and the memory of Christ's passion was so impressed on the innermost recesses of his heart that from that hour whenever Christ's crucifixion came to mind, Francis could scarcely contain his sighs..." 
