

## **ALWAYS READY FOR JESUS**

Today's feast is both magnificent and mysterious: magnificent because the very first contemporaries of Jesus begin to recognize him as Christ, the anointed Savior of the world; mysterious, because this King is still a child, an obscure boy obedient to his earthly parents. The prophet Malachiliving and dying before the coming of Christ—points toward the arrival of the Messiah and encourages God's people to prepare themselves by living generous, holy lives. The Letter to the Hebrews—written after Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection renews the prophetic call to holiness, reminding us that the Lord will always help us: "Because he himself was tested through what he suffered,

he is able to help those who are being tested." The Gospel reading overflows with examples of joyful men and women living God's call to holiness. Mary, Joseph, Simeon, and Anna show us, in their own ways, how to love Christ.

We often think, "Once I get this, or once that happens, then I will be happy." But the Gospel shows a better way. All four adults in today's Gospel long deeply for the Messiah and "the consolation of Israel" he will bring. Human temptation might obsess over the promise of future peace and prosperity, leaving only anxiety and resentment for present suffering. But Mary, Joseph, Simeon, and Anna leave the saving of the

world to God; for their part, they focus on Jesus. Each of them keeps busy with daily details of the various lifestyles they have chosen. Mary and Joseph concern themselves with raising a family, while Simeon and Anna dedicate their lives to prayer in the temple. They find peace enough in fulfilling the obligations of their stations in life, maintaining a lively prayer life to be attentive to God's action in the world. In today's Gospel, their focus is literally and spiritually on Jesus. They model for us how to be happy and holy: performing their daily duties peacefully, always ready to recognize Jesus as he reveals himself.

## WHEN DOES THE CHRISTMAS SEASON END?

#### Is it December 26? January 6? February 2?

In secular culture the Christmas season begins around Halloween and ends on December 26. However, in the Roman Catholic Church, the liturgical season of Christmas only *begins* on December 25 and lasts much longer!

The <u>USCCB</u> explains, "The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts, and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him...including the fact that he was born to die for us."

For those dioceses in the Roman Rite that celebrate Epiphany on January 6, the Baptism of the Lord falls on the Sunday after it. In other places where Epiphany is celebrated on the first Sunday that falls from January 2 through January 8, then the Baptism of the Lord could occur either on the following Sunday, or on a Monday (this happens if Epiphany is celebrated on January 7 or 8).

The latest that the Baptism of the Lord can occur is January 13. The season of Ordinary Time starts

on the day after this feast.

This means that typically, the Christmas season runs roughly from December 25 – January



For many Eastern Catholics (as well as Orthodox Christians), the birth of Jesus is celebrated on January 6 (or sometimes on January 7).

At the same time, the historical Christmas cycle extends even past the Baptism of the Lord. Traditionally the feast of Candlemas (the Presentation of the Lord) occurs on February 2 and marked the final conclusion of the "Christmas cycle."

Candlemas celebrates an event that occurred 40 days after Jesus' birth and was his first introduction to the Temple. In other words, it is the final "baby Jesus" feast day on the Church's liturgical calendar.

Christmas is a beautiful season in the Catholic Church, one that doesn't end on December 26, but extends as far as February!

## THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD—YEAR A

Only great solemnities are allowed to interrupt the usual Sunday cycle of celebration. Today is one of those special days! The Solemnity of the Presentation has traditionally been called "Candlemas Day." It is the day on which all candles are blessed for Church and home use. In times past, today was also called the "Purification of Mary," but it is primarily a celebration of Christ as Light of the World.

The canticle of Zechariah (The "Benedictus", Luke 1:68-79) is used every day in Morning Prayer ("Lauds") in the Liturgy of the Hours. The canticle of Mary (The "Magnificat", Luke 1:46-55) is used each day in Evening Prayer ("Vespers"). The canticle of Simeon (The "Nunc Dimittis", Luke 2:29-32) is used each day in Night Prayer ("Compline"). For spiritual growth, consider praying them regularly as part of your Morning, Evening, and Night Prayer. Use Blessed Candles at home as a sign of the presence in your home of Jesus, the Light of the World.


### St. Paul Library / Lighthouse CD Resources


We recently updated some vocation materials and have collected them in a "traveling case" for families to pray for, support and / or discern their vocational call, whether as married, sacred single, priesthood-

diaconate or religious life. We have scheduled 8th grade PSR families to be the first to "travel." We would like all families to pray for godly vocations in whatever area the Lord prompts someone to follow. We are distributing some Vocation "Table Tents" in the narthex for anyone to pick up to set on the family table or mantle.



Two other notes about vocations: If you have a holy hour, please consider dedicating one minute before the Lord to pray for holy vocations from our parish. If you are interested in praying for priests in particular, there is a "Prayer Warriors for Priests" group that meet in various local parishes on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month at 10 am. Mary Stassi at the parish is a contact here.

The Vocation Traveling Case contains a few "visuals" that you can use for prayer at your discretion. There is a Vocation Prayer chalice (For Priests-Deacons), an Icon of St. Francis and St. Clare (For Religious Life) a Sculpture of a Husband, Wife and Child (For Marriage) Lyrics from Hymn "How Can I Keep From Singing" (For Single Life). A prayer candle is also included.









In the Traditional- Devotional Dedication of the Months of the Year, February is traditionally dedicated to The Holy Family. Simply put, a Holy Family is a praying family.
