

Hello, God

Just before our first reading it says that "the word of the LORD was rare; there were not many visions." (15am 3:1) I imagine most people today would think that was true. Haven't you ever wished you lived in biblical times, to see some of the miracles you read about? Wouldn't it be cool to hear the LORD speaking in a vision? Do you think God has stopped talking? People apparently felt that way in 5amuel's time. Let's look at the reading to see what 5amuel's experience can teach us.

At first Samuel thinks it is Eli calling him. It is not unusual for people to miss a sign from God. If you have a talent that you are proud of, perhaps it is a sign that God wants you to use that

talent to help others. Or if a friend tells you she is concerned about your health, it could be God's way of telling you to get help. Try to see God speaking in whatever happens to you and you may hear a lot more than you think.

Samuel also gets help from Eli. Eli began to recognize that the LORD was speaking to Samuel. Sometimes we need help discerning what the Lord is telling us. A good spiritual director can lead you to understand what God is saying to you. Your pastor may be able to do that, or at least able to refer you to someone.

Warning: A spiritual director will probably ask how often you pray. In our reading Samuel finally speaks di-

rectly to God, instead of going back to Eli. Then God tells him what God's plan was. So if you wonder what God plans for your life, try spending more time in prayer with him. Don't be like the man who complains he never knows what his wife wants from him. When asked what she tells him, he says, "I don't know; we never talk." I bet we have all had times where we didn't know if we are doing God's will because we didn't take time to pray. But don't do all the talking. Give God some quiet time to hear his response. For God hasn't stopped talking; we just stopped listening.

Some Amazing Facts About Babies In Utero

Dr. Eduard Gratacós and the journalist Carme Escales have developed a guide to follow the baby's life step by step from the first weeks of gestation. Dr. Gratacós is director of <u>BCNatal</u>, a reference center in maternal-fetal and neonatal medicine at Clínic and Sant Joan de Déu hospitals in Barcelona. He is an international expert in fetal development. Carme Escales received the Boehringer Ingelheim Award for Journalism in Medicine in 2016. In their co-authored book <u>9 Months From Within</u>, it is the fetus himself who explains some odd facts that give us a sense of joy and wonder at the mystery of new life.

Here are some facts about fetuses that you probably didn't know.

- The first heartbeat occurs at week 5 of gestation. But the entire heart is only the size of the head of a pin! During this week, the heart grows from 1 millimeter to 2.
- At week 6, "I measure 4 millimeters. I'm still like a tadpole. I still have a tail until week 8." Then this tail will not disappear. "It will recede to give way to my tail bone, inside the trunk."
- Petuses also pee. It happens for the first time in week 9. "My kidneys are still primitive but they already produce some urine. It's my first pee-pee. At the moment, it's very little, but it will increase rapidly and in a few weeks I will urinate about as much as after my birth."
- Each fetus has its own fingerprints. They begin to form in week 10 and are unique to each one, even in identical twins.
- Fetuses open and close their eyes. Although they are in the amniotic fluid, it is as if they were swimming in a pool and were opening their eyes. This occurs in weeks 12 to 14. Also, "I begin to touch my face with

my hand. Little by little I will start to put it in my mouth from time to time, and later I'll put my thumb in.

- Fetuses yawn. And they do it often, between one and three times an hour. It occurs from week 13 on. The funny thing is that scientists do not know why most mammals yawn.
- ❖ The fetus' skin heals on its own. The skin of an unborn baby is very special. If you had to surgically intervene, puncture, or put a catheter into the fetus, the incision would be the doctor's least concern because he knows that the wound will close on its own and also leave no scar.
- ✓ If you are a girl, at around week 20 you will have produced 7 million eggs. At birth, you will still have 2 million, and at puberty there will be about 400,000 left. Even so, there are so many because a woman ovulates about 400 times throughout her life, once each menstrual cycle.
- ✓ If the fetus is a boy, the process is different. The testicles will produce large amounts of testosterone from week 12 to week 24. Unlike girls, boys constantly produce new sperm in the testes for many years. "In my life as a fetus, I create thousands of cells that are precursors of the spermatozoid and they also remain dormant until puberty."
- ❖ The fetus is a big sleeper. The brain needs a lot of energy to form. He spends the day sleeping, but from the 26th week on, he begins the cycle of sleep and wakefulness. At most, fetuses spend 20 minutes awake every hour. If the mother notices kicking, it means the fetus is awake and everything is working as it should.





Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: The Canonization Miracles of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (Feast Day: January 4)

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774–1821) was a convert to Roman Catholicism and foundress of the Sisters of Charity, the first sisterhood native to the United States. She is also the first person born in the United States to be canonized a saint. While this article will focus on the canonization miracles attributed to Mother Seton, it is hoped that by so reading, one might consider delving a little more deeply into the life and actions of this amazing woman. Those who knew Mother Seton realized that it was only a matter of time before she would be canonized. In 1882 James Cardinal Gibbons of Baltimore took the first step toward having Elizabeth so honored. The Church then officially began a detailed study of her life with that cause in mind. The officials learned that at least three miracles had been attributed to Elizabeth's intercession with God. A child was miraculously cured of leukemia, a woman was similarly cured of cancer, and a man recovered miraculously from a massive brain infection.



In 1959 Pope John XXIII declared Mother Seton a Venerable, and in 1963 a Blessed. Then, on September 14, 1975, Pope Paul VI named Elizabeth Seton Saint of the Church. She became the first native-born American to be canonized. The saint's body rests beneath an alter in the chapel of the National Shrine of St. Elizabeth Seton in Emmitsburg, Maryland, which is located in the provincial house (headquarters) of the Daughters of Charity of the Emmitsburg Province. Two miracles required for beatification were approved in 1961. Through Mother Seton's intercession, Sister Gertrude Korzendorfer, a Daughter of Charity in New Orleans, was cured of pancreatic cancer. A four year old child, Ann Theresa O'Neill of Baltimore, was cured of acute, lymphatic leukemia. A third cure of Carl Kalin, New York, from a rare form of encephalitis was also declared miraculous.



Regarding the cure of Anne Theresa O'Neill: At the age of four, Anne was diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia. At the time, like other aggressive malignancies, this was considered a fatal disease without any treatment that assured a cure. In essence, no effective therapy for disease control and sustained remission existed. In a later interview, Anne said she was taken to Seton's grave site and placed on the tomb. "They laid me there," O'Neill said. "Within three or four days, my blood count was normal. My mother knew it was a miracle. The Catholic Church had my hospital records and kept track of me from the age of 4 1/2 to the time I was 15," O'Neill said. "The fact was, there was no cancer in my bones." O'Neill said that it was a nun, Sister Mary Alice Fowler, who originally told her mother, Felexina Ann O'Neill, to pray to Seton for divine intervention to cure her daughter. Fowler was a member of the Sisters of Charity, Seton's religious order. Anne's cure, which was considered

acceptable by the Sacred Congregation of Rights in 1959, would contribute directly toward Mother Seton's beatification and ultimate canonization on September 14, 1975, outside Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome by Pope Paul VI. Ms. O'Neill attended both the beatification as a thirteen-year-old girl and the canonization ceremony at age twenty-seven, as a mother of several children and accompanied by her mother and husband.


From the Lighthouse Catholic CD – Pamphlet Rack: Narthex

The Catholic Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures, and teaches that "Sacred Scripture is the speech of God as it is put down in writing under the breath of the Holy Spirit." She also, "forcefully and specifically exhorts all the Christian faithful to learn 'the surpassing knowledge of Jesus Christ' (Phil. 3.8) by frequent reading of the divine Scriptures. 'Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ.'" (From the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, nos. 9, 21, and 25)By making a commitment of only twenty to thirty minutes a day, you can prayerfully read through the entire Bible and/or Catechism in one year! Use whatever Bible translation you like that contains the entire Canon of Scripture. This guide is divided by month, but you can start at any time. From the Parish Library – Stoltz Grand Hall – Lower Level

In 2000, biologist Jonathan Wells took the science world by storm with *Icons of Evolution*, a book showing how biology textbooks routinely promote Darwinism using bogus evidence—icons of evolution like Ernst Haeckel's faked embryo drawings and peppered moths glued to tree trunks. Critics of the book complained that Wells had merely gathered up a handful of innocent textbook errors and blown them out of proportion. Now, in *Zombie Science*, Wells asks a simple question: If the icons of evolution were just innocent textbook errors, why do so many of them still persist? Science has enriched our lives and led to countless discoveries. But now, Wells argues, it's being corrupted. Empirical science is devolving into zombie science, shuffling along unfazed by opposing evidence. Discredited icons of evolution rise from the dead while more icons—equally bogus—join their ranks. Like a B horror movie, they just keep coming! Zombies are make believe, but zombie science is real—and it threatens not just science, but our whole culture. Is there a solution? Wells is sure of it, and points the way.
