

Hipped—Out Pharisees

The Gospel reading for this Sunday is not only the first miracle in John's Gospel, it is also John's first mention of Jesus' mother. I used to find it odd that Jesus addressed her as "Woman." I can't imagine my Dad letting me get away with that. But in that time the word was more respectful; it could even be affectionate. (The last time Jesus speaks to his mother—John 19:26—he also calls her "Woman." He certainly wasn't being disrespectful on the cross.) Jesus does help as his mother requested, but he does so in a way that doesn't draw attention to himself and also is a lesson about God's love.

You have probably heard how the Jewish people in Jesus' time performed purification rituals before eating any-

thing. The cleansings were a sign that they wanted to be like God, completely free from sin. Eventually, it came to mean that you could not approach God until you cleansed yourself. Jesus used the miracle to show us a different way of understanding holiness. Jesus could have made the wine in bottles or wineskins to show that it was new. But he used the "six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings" (John 2:6). That meant that once they were full of wine, no one could wash themselves from the jars. I wonder how many Pharisees flipped out when they saw that.

The point is that no one can cleanse themselves. We don't purify ourselves in order to come to God—we come to God to be purified. God is the only one

who can make us holy. God offers this to sinners especially, because sinners who know they need forgiveness are the only ones to receive it. Not because God excludes the rest. Those who don't think they are sinners or don't think they can be forgiven won't ask for it. God never forces mercy on anyone. It is offered to those who ask for it. The amount of wine (six big jars of about twenty-five gallons each) symbolizes the extent of God's mercy. As there was now more than enough wine for the wedding, God has more than enough mercy for those who need it. Wine is also a symbol of joy in the Old Testament. There is no greater joy than knowing that you have been forgiven by the Lord.

Four Saints Who Converted to Christianity

One of the most famous conversions to Christianity was that of St. Paul the Apostle, which we celebrate this Friday, January 25. After embarking on a journey to persecute Christians, Paul's encounter with the risen Christ set him on a new path that not only changed him, but the world.

Since then countless souls have adopted the Christian religion from every corner of the globe. This includes many saints who not only converted, but threw themselves fully into Christianity. As with St. Paul, their encounter with Christ fundamentally changed their life and they simply could not go back to their former way of life.

Here is a small selection of saints who felt called to embrace the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Ven. Satoko Kitahara (8/22/1929—1/23/1958)

The daughter of a Japanese aristocrat, Kitahara was raised in the Shinto religion. After World War II she felt a deep emptiness within her and began searching for truth. She was inspired by faithful Christians living in Japan and was baptized at the age of 20. After converting she tended to the needs of the poor and taught catechism to children.





Ven. Marcello Labor (7/8/1890—9/29/1954) Born to Jewish parents in Italy, Labor attended the University of Vienna to become a doctor. He met his wife there and was married in a Jewish ceremony. Life changed dramatically for him during World War I and he was enlisted as a

medical officer in the Italian army. During his time on the front he was baptized, along with his wife, because of a vow he made to the Blessed Mother. After the War Labor set up a medical practice where he served the poor of the city. After his wife's death, he became a priest and endured many sufferings before his death.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha (? 1656—4/17/1680)



Growing up among the Mohawk people near Auriesville, New York, Tekakwitha was the daughter of a Mohawk chief. After a smallpox outbreak her parents died and she was raised by other relatives. Jesuits were eventually allowed to visit the local villages and one day Tekakwitha met a Jesuit priest who catechized her. She took the name Kateri

(Catherine) after being baptized and took Jesus as her spouse.

St. Charles Lwanga (1/1/1860—6/3/1886)

Raised in the Baganda tribe in Uganda, Lwanga first heard of Christianity from members of the court of Chief Mawulugungu. There he learned more about the person of Jesus Christ and began his road to Christianity. After Mawulugungu's death, Lwanga was a page in the court of King Mwanga II. The new king began to fiercely persecute Christians and Lwanga



saw the leader of the pages killed. Strengthened by the example of the martyrs who died, Lwanga requested baptism, but soon after was imprisoned and killed for his courageous faith.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

There was a wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there. When the wine had given out, Jesus' mother... told the servants, "Do whatever [Jesus] tells you."...Jesus said to the servants, "Fill these jars with water." [They did, and the water turned to wine.] JOHN 2:1,3-5,7

After college, University of Michigan quarterback and Heisman Trophy winner Tom Harmon became a pilot. One day his plane crashed deep in a South American jungle. Miraculously, he survived. Describing his experience, he wrote, "I said at least a million 'Hail Marys' during my trek out. In fact, as I walked through the jungle, trying to find my way out, I used to yell 'Hail Marys' at the top of my voice, hoping that someone would hear me and at the same time I would be praying."

How important a role does Mary, Jesus' mother, play in my spiritual life?

We wish love, good health and peace for 2019 to everyone.





"Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children."


The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22

(or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer,

fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. Call your local diocese or parish to find out what events might be taking place in your area.




