

Prophetic Living

The Corinthians knew what it was like to experience distress and suffering, much of which they caused themselves. Their Christian community, founded not twenty years after Jesus' death, faced heart-wrenching disagreements and scandalous behavior. To encourage them, Saint Paul wrote that their "momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison." Saint Paul does not deny their suffering. He does not pretend being a Christian is easy. Instead, he invites the Corinthians to accept their difficulties and put them in perspective: the heaviest burden on earth weighs nothing

compared to the mighty glory God has prepared for us in heaven. Living with this perspective makes us prophets. A prophet speaks God's truth to the world and points God's people back to the Lord. When we live in prophetic hope, believing in God's eternal glory, we remind the world of God's mighty, merciful plans for humanity. Like Saint Paul, we can encourage others to endure suffering bravely and not to grow weary doing God's will. Jesus promises that if we do the will of God, we are his "brother and sister and mother." We are his family. And he always protects his family.

Kearts Formed By Faith

Dear parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate our patronal feast day for the parish. We rejoice in the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and celebrate her maternal love for us. Today as a parish family we ask the Blessed Mother to lead each of us to a deeper union with her Son, Jesus Christ.

As disciples of the Lord we strive for two essential elements in our life of faith: personal relationship and confident articulation. All of us strive for a personal relationship with Jesus Christ that is formed by the Church, nourished by prayer, and embraced in our service to God and neighbor. A personal relationship with Jesus Christ is not a matter of emotional subjectivity, but a genuine religious experience. We are bound to Christ through Baptism, our religious experiences and expressed faith.

The Holy Spirit and Holy Mother Church act as safeguards for shaping and molding the various misconceptions and distortions that all of us are prone to encounter as we seek the Lord. Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture help us to weed out the bad seeds that would contaminate our relationship with Jesus. One of the real dangers of professing a personal relationship with the Lord apart from the community of the Church is to make the Lord little more than a mirror for our own needs and personality. One can worship the God of themselves without ever real-

izing it. Our faith is indeed personal, but it is lived in communion with the Church.

The second element in our life of faith is confident articulation. Call it professing your faith if you want, but the goal is the same. We want to know our faith and what we believe as Catholics. We want to have an answer for ourselves first and foremost. That doesn't mean we have to know everything about our faith, but we want to strive for a growing confidence that we understand the what and why of our beliefs. Few things will be more painful or potentially dangerous to our growing faith if we are caught in a conversation where we cannot answer simple questions about it.

We can be confident about our faith without being belligerent or arrogant about it. We can love and treasure the richness of our faith without denigrating what others believe. At the same time we should strive to free ourselves and others from the many misconceptions about the faith. Knowing our faith empowers us to address the many issues of life. The Church does have an answer and response for many of the choices we make in life. We can make our choices in union with the Church or ignore her at our own peril. Our choices will lead us to possessing hearts formed by faith or hearts that are spiritually dead.



Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: St. Anthony of Padua - Feast: June 13



In an age of skepticism, indifference, agnosticism and practical atheism, it is always good to "remember" the divine signs and wonders God works in our midst, both directly and indirectly. One of the great channels of God's power, signs and wonders in the history of the world was St. Anthony of Padua. Living around the time of St. Francis of Assisi, Anthony's holiness was probably as renowned. In fact, it was only eleven months after he died in 1231 that Anthony was canonized as a saint. Remember that the working of miracles is not a guarantee of holiness, but it is often a confirming sign of it. If you visit the website of St. Anthony's Basilica in Padua you can read for yourself some of the documented wonders of St. Anthony. https://www.santantonio.org/en/miracles Here are some excerpts from two of the famous miracles: The Miracle of the Mule and the Miracle of the Fish

One of the reasons why Anthony worked so hard to convert heretics was because he genuinely felt sorry for them. He saw that they were depriving themselves of the most precious gift of the Eucharist, and he believed that no one could long survive without this spiritual nourishment. One day, a heretic told Anthony that he would believe that Christ was truly present in the Eucharist only if his mule bowed down to it. They established that the test should take place in three days. The heretic starved his mule for the next three days. When the appointed time had arrived, Anthony stood off to one side with the consecrated host in his hands, while the heretic stood to the other holding some fodder for the mule to eat. The mule, ignoring its own extreme hunger, went before



the Eucharist and knelt down to adore the Blessed Sacrament. There are many other miracles associated with Anthony's ministry, but they should not distract our attention from the fact that most of Anthony's ministry was performed in simple everyday ways. It was his fervent life style, his prayer, his gentleness, his humble use of his great learning that brought people to conversion.




Once Anthony had travelled to the city of Rimini because it was a hotbed of heresy. The city leaders had ordered everyone to ignore him, so no one turned up for his homilies. Wherever Anthony went, he was greeted by silence. Anthony walked along praying and reflecting upon what had happened. As he walked outside of the town, he came to the mouth of the Marecchia River where it flows into the Adriatic. There he began to address the crowds, not of people but of fish. He called out, "You, fish of the river and sea, listen to the Word of God because the heretics do not wish to hear it." Suddenly there were thousands of fish neatly arranged in rows, all pushing their heads through the surface of the water as if they were straining to listen to every one of Anthony's words. The people of Rimini, seeing this miracle, gathered to listen to Anthony. What began with simple interest in an extraordinary event turned into a passionate conviction that Anthony was speaking to their very hearts. They were so moved by Anthony's words, by his call to conversion, that they abandoned their hardened positions and returned to the Church.

We are not sure that this story is historic, but it certainly does represent a version of what often happened when Anthony preached: that many hardened sinners were converted through the unselfish love of Anthony.

Fr. Larry Richards, a well-known preacher and retreat master, often gives the advice "No Bible no Breakfast, no Bible no Bed" challenging and encouraging folks to read the Bible frequently. Consider a goal to read at least the four gospels over the summer. A good translation is the RSV-CE or the NAB. Keeping other varieties of Catholic books around the house will invite your child to learn more about her faith. Read them together, or just allow your child to explore the books on her own.

The readings are extraordinarily rich in their content as we return to Ordinary Time. We are reminded of how quick the devil can lead us to blame others for our sins, as Adam blamed Eve, and Eve blamed the serpent. The Gospel shows that that which is divided cannot stand. It is the same for us as Catholics today. We must stand united in the truth and beauty of our faith and share that faith with others. Fewer things are more detrimental to our cause of evangelization than interior division within. We must put aside all quarreling, bitterness, envy, and hatred for one another and instead be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger in dealing with our brothers and sisters. Let that be our message for today: seek unity in the truth and do not fight your own brothers and sisters in Christ. When a non-Catholic sees Catholics arguing and fighting with other Catholics, why would that non-Catholic want to become Catholic?
