# Deeper Understanding of Scripture

As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? After all, maybe God's patient, unconditional love has run its course and He is finally fed up with humanity's reluctance to accept the truth about who we are. God really can't be that patient! All throughout human history, many have prayed to God for intervention or for particular needs. Because their prayers were not answered in the way they wanted or anticipated, they felt that God may have abandoned them. Were they right? It seems that we are continuing, at a rapid rate, down a path of destruction. Do you not care, God, that we may be perishing? When the boats of our lives are rocking and the seas tumultuous, we want to know that we have God's attention. Even more so, we want God's intervention.

Maybe the storms and the waves are necessary. If we listen, they can teach us valuable lessons. Without them, we would never learn that we have the strength to endure, understand the uselessness of fear and worry, or develop the ability to really trust. If God immediately rushed in and simply calmed things down before they got difficult, what good would that really be? We would miss opportunities to learn how to drink more deeply of life, treasure its complexity, irony, and beauty and fully engage ourselves in surrendering to the love of our Creator. It is easy to walk on the surface of life without immersing ourselves in its messiness. Life has to burn its way through us in order to bring us to a place of secure trust. It's unfortunate that some prefer a shallower journey.

That's the balancing act that comes with faith. It is not God's job to prevent us from encountering the torrential rains and winds of life. Many believe that if faith is done the right way, that God will provide for smooth sailing. That's not how it works. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God's love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God's unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing this allows us to put our boats out into unchartered waters without hesitation. Knowing that we prefer the comfort and safety of what we know to be still waters, how do we feel when Jesus says, "Let us cross to the other side"?

# In Praise of the Father, and Our Fathers

The fundamental Christian claim on reality is that the world did not come from nothing. Creation is not a mistake or a coincidence. All that is, was made by God. The Catechism <u>begins</u> with these words which every Catholic should know:

> God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life.

The beauty, order, and harmony of the world we see and study all point to the greatness and love of the one who made it. Today, the <u>Scriptures remind</u> <u>us</u> that, "Even all the hairs of our heads are counted." The Father knows things from the inside, because he has made them.

Our own fathers hint at the kind of knowledge that our heavenly Father has. Some seem to have a supernatural knowledge of the thermostat for example. The care a father takes in tending a year and ordering a home are reflections of God our Heavenly Father who sends rains to water the fields and orders our worship.

But God has not left His creation to its own devices. God, our Heavenly Father, sustains all that is, at every instance. By caring for his creation He continues to be the author of life who ennobles every human soul with the rank of his own image and likeness. This likeness cannot be erased. Even our own moral failures do not render us orphans. The mechanisms of grace and the Father's love assure us, that, as Pope John Paul II teaches,

> We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures, we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of His Son Jesus.



By sending his grace, particularly through the means of regular confession and worthy Holy Communions, the Father sustains us with His love.

Human beings were made in the image of God, but the constant temptation of our culture is to efface that image. We must not let it be stamped out. Fathers, in particular, have a duty

to their family, to protect this image, by availing themselves of the graces of prayer and the sacraments.

As the Scriptures say, we were made for life in the Father's house. A life of seeing God, being united with every glory he intends. Pope Francis <u>declares</u>,

A good father knows how to wait and knows how to forgive from the depths of his heart. Certainly, he also knows how to correct with firmness: he is not a weak father, submissive and sentimental. The father who knows how to correct without humiliating is the one who knows how to protect without sparing himself.

To stay on this path, fathers must direct their families. Children need to be pressed to worship well. Fathers have to declare to them right ways of life, without shying away from any of the difficulties of Gospel living. A father, who with his wife, is the first teacher of the faith, can offer a child the way to holiness, the way to live with the Heavenly Father.

On this Father's Day, let us rejoice in the gift of our fathers. They, like all of creation, are as different and unique as only God Himself could have imagined. And they are ours. Praise Him.

# Attention Employees & Volunteers

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called <u>Prevent and Protect STL</u>. Everyone ministering to minors and vulnerable adults (clergy, employees and volunteers) in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system before December 31, 2020. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Men and fathers need grace, strength and encouragement to take on the responsibility that comes with being part of something greater than ourselves, especially when it comes to being a provider and protector of one's family. Fatherhood is an amazing gift and responsibility. Today, we need men to rise up to father their families, to be open to life, to God's plan.



St. Joseph, you know what men go through. You know how we often flee from responsibility with our state in life. You know our weak and sinful hearts. You know how selfish we can be, how we want to escape into trivial pursuits, in the noise and the toys that distract us from our mission. St. Joseph, pray for us.



Every man and father should watch the movie <u>Courageous</u>. It does an excellent job in helping men to ask what it means to be a man, to discover their role as husbands, as fathers, as workers, as providers, as protectors. At the end of the movie, a man is speaking to a Church congregation about the role of fathers. One has to watch the movie to get the full emotional impact, but here are the words to consider.

- You don't have to ask who will guide my family, because by God's grace, I will.
- You don't have to ask who will teach my son to follow Christ, because I will.
- Who will accept the responsibility of providing and protecting my family? I will.
- Who will ask God to break the chain of destructive patterns in my family's history? I will.
- Who will pray for and bless my children to boldly pursue whatever God calls them to do? I am their father, I will.
- I accept this responsibility and it is my privilege to embrace it. I want the favor of God and His blessing on my home. Any good man does.
- So where are you men of courage? Where are you fathers who fear the Lord? It's time to rise up and answer the call that God has given to you. And to say I will. I will. I will.

they rest in Him. Only God Himself can make our lives anything but ultimately meaningless and empty. And we will never get anywhere near Him if we refuse to take up our cross and follow Jesus.

This rousing call to the real adventure of a living faith is a wake-up call to complacent Christians and a rallying cry for anyone dissatisfied with a lukewarm faith.

What if notorious atheist Christopher Hitchens, bestselling author of *God Is Not Great*, had a Christian brother? He does.

Peter Hitchens details a very personal story of how he left the faith but dramatically returned. And like many of the Old Testament saints whose personal lives were intertwined with the life of their nation, so Peter's story is also the story of modern England and its sad spiritual decline.

its sad spiritual decline. Peter brings his work as an international journalist to bear as he documents firsthand accounts of atheistic societies, specifically in Communist Russia, where he lived in Moscow during the collapse of the Soviet Union. He shows that the world's bloodiest century, the 20th, entailed nothing short of atheism's own version of the Crusades and the Inquisition. The path to a secular utopia, pursued by numerous modern tyrants, is truly paved with more violence than has been witnessed in any era in history.

Hitchens provides hope for all believers whose friends or family members have left Christianity or who are enchanted by the arguments of the anti-religious intellects of our age.


