

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A well-choreographed dance can be truly inspirational. Each movement and step are interconnected, each contributing a piece of the unfolding artistic story. The beholder is caught up in the rhythms, music, and gestures, realizing that none are dispensable and all are necessary. The same is true of the Divine Dance of the Trinity. Each Person plays a part, using unique gestures and movements that are connected to the other Divine Partners. They tell a story of love. Every movement and step is born of love and flows on into eternity. The Divine Dance never ends.

God the Creator powerfully, yet with gentle love, leads. Creating and recreating, birthing and sustaining, He dances

with the compassionate incarnate Son, guided by the breath of the Holy Spirit. They are three distinct Persons but move as One. On one hand, the cascading flow of their Presence appears motionless, yet on the other, flows and moves with effortless attention. They share one heart, one goal, and one purpose and invite all of creation to join in their dance, their joy.

The energy of the Trinity flows through all created things. It is a dance of the heart, not of the mind. It has to be experienced, not dissected, and contemplated, not understood. We stand in awe of the Divine Dance and find ourselves watching in amazement all that God creates and sustains. The dance continues in the majesty of a mountain, the power and wonder of an ocean, and the vastness of the universe. It moves in the cry of a newborn infant and in the soul of one who has been forgiven. It flows in the cry for justice and in the wounds of the oppressed. It circles through the changing of seasons, the cycles of birth and death, and the wisdom that one acquires when they love God.

The Dance never ends. Its movements and rhythms go on forever. The Trinitarian Dance sustains all things, endures all things, and brings hope. You are invited to dance. Don't just watch as if you were simply a spectator. Join in the dance and move as they move.

While I may not have had the opportunity to meet you, you have been in my prayers. Eight years ago I was assigned to Immaculate Heart of Mary as her pastor. It has been a joy getting to know many of my parishioners. I have also been blessed to know many of our non-Catholic neighbors as I frequent our local businesses and restaurants. We have a wonderful community. Since March we have lived with limitations and concerns that have kept many of us apart. Slowly people are returning to worship and more comfort with the company of one another. It is a great time to return to community and to an active celebration of the faith.

I have asked your family member or friend to pass this on to you as part of my personal outreach to you. For reasons unknown to me you may have fallen into a practice of missing Mass. While I don't know the possible reason or reasons, I am willing to listen to your experience and do my best to help you reconnect to Our Lord and His community at IHM. At every Mass we pray for reconciliation and unity, at the forefront of our prayers are family members and friends who absent themselves. Please take some time to consider contacting me. I'll do my best to respond with the same love and understanding that I experience in my relationship with Jesus. He is the reason I am a priest and His Good News is an invitation to each of us.

As you already know I cannot promise you a perfect community. Each of us suffers from various flaws and foibles that are part of our life. IHM is like every other faith community, made up of individuals who are trying their best to know, love and follow Jesus. Jesus loves us as we are, and if we give Him the time, He can heal and transform the ills that afflict us. If you have been injured, insulted or harmed by individuals that were part of the Catholic community please accept my humble apology. Sometimes things happen to us that need to be voiced just so others know our story and understand us a little more. Please know I am willing to listen. Please pray for me and know that I continue to pray for you and hope that one day we might meet.

The Most Holy Trinity—Year A

During the Easter renewal of baptismal promises, believers were asked to renounce satan and all his works and empty show. This might seem odd for some unreflective of the spiritual battle that exists today. In an article entitled "Why Satan Hates the



Family," author Sam Guzman echoes a statement made by Sr. Lucia of Fatima that "The final war between satan and the Lord God is over the family." "Why?" he asks, "Because the family is an icon of the Most Holy Trinity. The communion of love between the three Divine Persons is the original family. The family is the earthly image and icon of Trinitarian love. The communion of love between husband and wife is designed to be fruitful, to bring forth life. Satan is sterile in every sense of the word. He hates the Trinity because he envies its life giving and creative power, and he hates the family because it mirrors the Trinity. (The one becomes two, then becomes two in one, then with the gift of a child, three in one). So what better way to mock and warp the life-giving love of the Holy Trinity than to attempt to redefine marriage and the holy creative act associated with marriage as something that cannot bring forth life? To redefine it as something inverted and sterile, like satan himself. This is one of satan's evil works and empty show, the mockery of the family, and thus of the Trinity.


