Dear Parishioners,





Celebrating Lent helps children understand this time of preparation for Jesus' Resurrection. Full-color illustrations. 32 Pages. St. Joseph's Books are a great teaching aid not only for children but also for adults to "brush up" on various topics pertaining to our beautiful and rich Roman Catholic faith.

The Season of Lent is upon us. It is good to consider a "family plan" for these 40 days. What types of prayers, works, acts of charity, devotions can I renew, take on, carry the cross, bear throughout this time out of love for the Lord. What is some type of faith "risk," stepping out, going out on a limb for the Lord like Zaccheus that I might do. Come Holy Spirit to give us the insights and the courage to follow your inspirations during this season of Lent.



1st Sunday of Lent - Year A

Then the Devil came to him and said, "If you are God's Son order these stones to turn into bread." But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Man cannot live on bread alone, but needs every word that God speaks."

MATTHEW 4:1-4

As a boy, Arturo Toscanini attended Italy's Royal Academy of Music. Because he was poor, he sold to the other students the meat from his meals so that he could buy musical scores. Like Jesus himself, Toscanini belongs to that elite group whose generous spirit has enriched the human race.

Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." JOHN 3:16-17

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 26, 2020) and Good Friday (April 10, 2020) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.



First Sunday of Lent:

IHM RCIA Catechumens and Candidates join others throughout the Archdiocese for the "Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion" at the Cathedral Basilica in St. Louis



The Rite of Election celebrates the Lord's choosing of men, women and children who, with the help of the Church, acknowledge God's election of them for the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The Rite of Election marks the beginning of the final period of intensive preparation prior to receiving the sacraments of initiation. The Call to Continuing Conversion marks the final period of preparation for those preparing to be received into full communion or for those Catholics completing their initiation through Confirmation and First Eucharist.

This Rite is for Catechumens seeking Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, and candidates for reception into full communion, as well as those Catholics completing their initiation at the Easter Vigil. A clear distinction will be made in order to respect the baptismal status of

those being received into full communion. Candidates for the Rite of Election are expected to have a conversion of mind and

morals, a sense of faith and charity, and be judged by those involved in their preparation to be worthy to receive the Easter Sacraments at this year's Easter Vigil. (cf. RCIA, no. 120) Those seeking full communion in the Church and those Catholics preparing to complete their initiation are to have listened faithfully to the Gospels, developed a deeper appreciation of their baptism, reflected upon the tradition of the Church, and have advanced in a life of love. (cf. RCIA, no. 453)


