

Putting God to the Test

I always thought of the temptations in the desert as part of Jesus' growth in "wisdom, age, and grace" (Luke 2:52). They show how Jesus was tempted to be a Messiah in a way that matched human expectations—those of Jews waiting for a messiah—instead of doing what his Father wanted. So he could have provided for all our needs (turn stones into bread,) brought peace to the world as a great leader (worship the devil,) or been a superhero (jump off the temple without harm). But I also wonder if these temptations are what we expect of God.

Do we expect God to provide for our needs by turning stones into "bread" (i.e., money)? When we ask

God to help us by doing everything for us, we are tempting the Lord. God does help us with our troubles, but usually by giving us the strength to get through them with our God-given abilities. This might mean finding a better job that uses more of our talents. It might be forgiving us, if we are the cause of our own troubles, and giving us the courage to start over. It might be a friend who helps us find the right doctor for a medical problem.

Or do we expect God to bring peace to the world by instantly removing all nuclear weapons or capturing all terrorists? When we pray for peace, we could pray that God show us what we can do to bring about that peace. We could follow Jesus' command to love

those around us, so that peace spreads from our actions. We could be generous in giving to the poor, especially where poverty is the cause of war.

Maybe we expect God to be a superhero for us, curing diseases, stopping hurricanes or earthquakes, and strengthening our faith with spectacular miracles. Jesus would tell us the same thing he told the devil: "Don't put the Lord your God to the test" (see Luke 4:12). Instead, as we take time to pray over the scriptures, read spiritual books, and share our faith with others, we will find our faith growing and know that the Lord has been with us all along the way.

Prayers for the Lenten Season

As mentioned last week I want to share with you various prayers that I have discovered. My hope is that you might find them helpful in your own prayer life or know someone who might benefit from them. The key is finding prayers that appeal to you and making time to pray them. The nature of these written prayers is the selfless attitude they can generate, since we are not talking to God one on one in a personal way but rather considering/contemplating/pondering the message of the prayer for the transformation of our lives.

Prayer for Overcoming Perfectionism

Gracious Father, the season of Lent is, once again, confronting me with my penchant for living more of a driven life than a called life. The last few weeks have been a blur—filled with too much navel gazing and secondguessing, and performance-ism and perfectionism.

By your grace, I want to live with less fear and more freedom, less by frenzy and more by faith, with fewer obsessions and with much more adoration of you, the God of all grace and peace.

As I get older I just don't have as much energy to juggle as many balls or spin as many plates as I used to. This is simultaneously a humbling thing and a good thing. For if greater grace comes to the humble, then accepting my limitations is essential for my liberation. Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!

It's not difficult to see that my driven-ness and busyness are rooted in fear—the fear of not being enough and having enough, the fear of losing face and losing control, the fear of missing the mark and missing out.

Come, Lord Jesus, come. Perfection can only be found in You. Your perfect love alone can liberate this poser, performer, and perfectionist. Drive out my fears by a greater grasp of Your grace and knowledge of Your love.

You lived a life of perfect obedience for us, as the second Adam—fulfilling everything God requires of us. You died a death of perfect love for us, as the Lamb of God, exhausting God's judgment against our sin. Your resurrection from the dead on the third day is the first-fruits and guarantee that one Day, we too, will be made perfect in love—the Day for which I long more than any other.

Lord Jesus, I love you because you first loved me and continue to love me. May Your perfect love continue to drive every lingering and limiting fear from my life. So every Amen I pray in your merciful and mighty name.







The tales of why the Church embraced eating fish at Lent are as big as the one that got away. Especially this account: Centuries ago, the pope required Catholics to eat fish on Fridays to support a floundering fishing industry rife with financial troubles. — Oh, that's a good one! Urban legends aside, the reasons our Church has taken to these little — or big — swimmers as a source of penitential sacrifice are rooted in the idea of remembering the betrayal and crucifixion of Christ. No law states that Catholics must eat fish on the Fridays of Lent, but it's a rule that we must abstain from eating the meat of warm-blooded animals. The practice of abstinence among Christians dates back centuries — and was mentioned in the Didache, the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, written around the first or second century.

Wow, this place is really dead...

It's like that every Lent...

Among the simplest ways of explaining our fascination with fish? It was a natural go-to back in the day, especially among those without means. Meat was a luxury,

hence why fish came onto the Lenten scene. Fish frys these days aren't fixed on the fin, though. Menus include vegetables, meatless pastas, ethnic specialties such as tamales and even the legs of our amphibian friends. But the overriding element is the sense of community built when more than one are gathered in His name. As we pledge to eat more fish — or other meatless fare — let us make this Lent a good one.

Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." JOHN 3:16-17

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 6, 2019) and Good Friday (April 19, 2019) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of *abstinence* from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.



As we begin the season of Lent we would like to emphasize this season of prayer and healing by inviting you to add your personal prayers to those of our entire community. Please look for a container on the table in the narthex where you can place your prayer requests. This Lent we ask everyone in our community to pray for all of them. Lent is a special time of the year for us as a community to pray for each other and to prepare ourselves for the Glorious Resurrection. At the Easter Vigil, we will burn all of your requests in the Easter fire, raising up your intentions to heaven, realizing that our Lord knows what's in your hearts. Have a blessed Lent.

As adopted sons and daughters of God, we have been called to give of ourselves in many ways but when we give we also have to take time to replenish our spiritual resources as well. If we don't do this, we will find ourselves empty. Throughout the Gospels we find many examples of Jesus taking time for silent mental prayer. That is what allowed Him to withstand the temptation of the devil in the desert. That is also what helped Him to endure His great suffering. Jesus stayed in a personal relationship with His Father and He trusted that His Father would be with Him throughout all of His tribulation. 
Time to Make Some PIES for Lent?

In years past, both in PSR and in the parish at large, folks were given an index card "PIE-CHART" in which to prayerfully "make a plan" for Lent. The "P.I.E.S" in the PIE-CHART stood for doing something: P-Physical. I-Intellectual. E-Emotional. S-Spiritual. They were asked to write this down and bring it home with them. (Extra "PIE-CHARTS" are in the Narthex). As adults, how can we make a good Lent --- intensify our prayers, increase our works, share our blessings, and/or more deeply unite our sufferings to the Lord? It is a good thing to make a plan. This is the week to do it. Here's a few thoughts to help get the mental map working.

Look for CDs and pamphlets at the Lighthouse CD Rack that you find relevant. Take a look at some of the books and videos that are located in our parish library downstairs.

Pick up on the "Little Black Books" that are offered during Lent and located in the back of the Church. Consider joining a home study, faith group that is being offered, promoted.


What about joining one of the Bible Study groups that take place on Wednesdays? How about picking up the Word Among Us Book for Lent to prayerfully read the Scriptures.



What about making time to go to the Sacraments more frequently--- i. e Morning Mass during the Week?
What about extra time in front of the Blessed Sacrament?

For easy recall, notes taken from the CD have been put in the memory aid **BECOMING** THE BEST P.I.E.S **VERSION OF** P=Physical: Exercise once a week every week for the entire year. You decide what the MATTHEW KELLY I = Intellectual: Read a good book for at least 10 minutes every day. Books are our friends. E = Emotional: Spend carefree timelessness with the most significant person in your life once a month. Plan it, schedule it. S = Spiritual: Enter into the classroom of silence. When you go to Mass each Sunday, ask God to show you one word, one way in this Mass how to become a better version of yourself. Write this down.

The acronym P.I.E.S stands for human life, representing its P-Physical, I-Intellectual, E-Emotional and S-Spiritual dimensions. These areas correspond to the Great Commandment to Love the Lord with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength. (And our neighbor as ourselves).



How are you going to contribute to the capital campaign? What about other charities like Rice Bowl and the Catholic Relief Services? Are you making any plans in your schedule to celebrate the Days of the Triduum? What about making family prayers for the folks in RCIA here at IHM and beyond? Lord, what would you like me to do with all the gifts you have given me?

The word "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word 'lencten' which means spring. We get the English word 'lengthen' from that word, as the season of Spring brings a lengthening of days. In the cycle of creation the light is overcoming the darkness. The key to understanding the meaning of Lent is simple: Baptism. Preparation for Baptism and for renewing baptismal commitment lies at the heart of the season. As the catechumens (candidates for Baptism) entered their final period of preparation for Baptism, the rest of the community accompanied them on their journey and prepared to renew their baptismal vows at Easter.
