

Words and Fruit

What do these two things have in common? In Luke's Gospel today, Jesus uses the image of a fruit tree to explain the importance of speaking with care. If the tree is healthy (that is, good), we expect to enjoy tasty fruit, but no one would pick the fruit of a tree that appears to be diseased. Good fruit is like good words that indicate one's spiritual growth and maturity—a person whose heart and words are filled with goodness. We will be known as good or evil by the qualities—of mercy and compassion, or pride and selfishness—that come from our hearts and enter the world through our mouth.

We hear similar advice from the book of Sirach in our first reading. Just as the fruit will indicate whether or not the tree from which it came was healthy, so too do our words indicate what we think, how we view the world and our neighbors. Words are important, indeed.

But what about our actions? These surely are also signs of goodness or the opposite, aren't they? Today's psalm sings about the just ones who will be like trees flourishing in the house of the Lord, bearing fruit throughout their lives. Justice implies action—mercy, compassion, love. In the second reading, Paul ad-

vises the Corinthians to devote themselves to the work of the Lord, that their labors would not be in vain, because the reward of acting with integrity is victory over sin and death. The person of justice and integrity acts and speaks from a new heart, made possible by Jesus' sacrifice.

Do actions speak louder than words? Maybe between this Gospel and last week's, when Jesus told us to love our enemies, Jesus is showing us that both are vital and essential aspects of following the life of discipleship. May our fruit always reflect the sweetness of living a good life.

Prayer, Fasting and Almogiving

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter into Lent the Church urges us to make it a season of service and sacrifice for God and neighbor. All of our Lenten disciplines should free us to love God and neighbor with greater joy and zeal. May our fasting and abstinence increase our hunger for God. May our prayer challenge and encourage us to seek God always. May our almsgiving makes us more aware of God's bountiful blessing to us. These common Lenten disciplines are meant to make God the center of our lives and the focal point of our desires.

One of the greatest things about being Catholic is the immense spiritual treasury that lies under our proverbial feet. In a world that is constantly inviting us to embrace the new and rush blindly onto the "next big thing" the Church humbly beckons us to pause, discern and receive from Her vast treasury of teaching and spirituality. Throughout the Lenten season I will be sharing various prayers that you may want to use during Lent or other times.

During Lent there will be a few changes in the way we celebrate Mass. Mass will begin with the simple ringing of a bell to call us to prayer. We will be using the Confiteor during the penitential rite of Mass. The absence of the Gloria and Alleluia will mark part of our liturgical fasting from our normal celebration. In recent years I have been praying the Eucharistic prayers for Reconciliation. You will not find them in your Sunday Missal, but they are in the weekday one. If you are interested in just getting a

copy of the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation please e-mail me and I can provide you with a printed copy.

During Lent I will be offering additional opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please know that I am more than happy to help you make a good Confession if it has been years since you have celebrated the Sacrament. Good Confessions can be life changing. To really know the love of God and His healing mercy is a powerful experience in our lives. If you go on a regular basis, think of it as becoming steeped in the mercy and grace of Jesus. Jesus wants to wash us clean in His mercy. Jesus desires to affect a radical transformation in our attitude, behavior and life. We are all in the process of having the veil of sin and indifference lifted from our eyes and hearts so that we might see the beauty and glory of our faith with eyes wide open and hearts alive with the Spirit. The lifting of this veil equips us to serve God without fear or hesitation.

It is true that donations come to the Society because a good person produces goodness from the good in their heart.




Voices Needed





How can I help guide them to be chaste in thought, word and deed?"

Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: St. Joseph: Feast March 19th




The month of March is devoted to St. Joseph. What can we know about this "mystery man" – chosen by God to fulfill one of the greatest roles in history, being the foster father of the "God-Child" - yet of whom there is no word of his recorded in Scripture? Here is a start. Recall the principal of typology, that various persons, places, things, events spoken of in the Old Covenant are fulfilled in the New. Do you recall another man named Joseph who happened to have dreams and who was led into Egypt, who protected his chastity and safeguarded the family of God? Of course. It is Joseph the Patriarch, one of the twelve sons of Jacob. What follows is some of the Scriptural links along with some books to consider. The question to ask, "If Joseph of Old was such a great man of faith, imagine the Joseph of the New Testament."





The Ignatius Study states how Matthew's portrait of Joseph recalls the Old Testament patriarch Joseph.


- (1) Both share the same name (Mt 1:18; Gen 30:24);
- (2) both have fathers named Jacob (Mt 1:16; Gen 30:19-24);
- (3) God spoke to both of them through dreams (Mt 1:20-21; 2:13, 19-20, 22; Gen 37:5-11);
 - (4) both were righteous and chaste (Mt 1:19; Gen 39:7-18);
- (5) both would save their families by bringing them to Egypt (Mt 2:13; Gen 45:16-20) to safeguard the Bread of Life.

Helping Hearts Community Service Ministry




We are a group of IHM volunteers who wish to provide physical assistance to our neighbors who are unable to help themselves because of physical limitations. We can help with:
