

DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, "You are absolutely beaming!" The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily

trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that dav.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside

that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen. (C) I Pi

Blessed Lent Dear Parishioners,

I pray your Lent is going well with whatever you planned on Ash SUNDAY Wednesday. As I emphasized last Sunday, always strive for the goal, eternal life with God as our final chapter, and personal growth in holiness in this current chapter. Of the three Lenten practices, prayer is mentioned first because it lays the foundation for spir-

itual fasting and almsgiving. Our fasting and almsgiving are not just acts of selfdenial or generosity, but the fruits of our prayerful communion with God.

> Ugly people, dirty people, ignorant people, stupid people, weak people. Arrogant people, selfish people, pompous people, smug people, too-clever-by-half people. There are so many people we can despise or envy or even hate and feel quite justified.

Lord, we have put up our defenses and You are going to need all Your ingenuity, all Your patience and all Your skill to break through our castle walls; and when You have, we'll make a last ditch stand and fight to the death to prove to You that we have been right all along.

But meanwhile, Lord, please win a few of the skirmishes. Prevail on us to reach out, however timidly, to touch the untouchable. Entice us by some means to come out from behind our barricades and expose ourselves to danger, as You came in Christ, from behind the barricades of heaven to be among us, vulnerable, the object of prejudice and cruelty. Let love break in and steal our prize possession, pride, and crush our fear with confidence.

Let it be so, Lord, for Jesus' sake.

And making a whip of cords, he drove them all, with the sheep and oxen, out of the temple; and he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. And he told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; you shall not make my Father's house a house of trade." (John 2:15-16)

The aggressive actions of Jesus are a prophetic sign of the Temple's imminent destruction. The expulsion of oxen, sheep, and pigeons from the precincts likewise signifies the termination of animal sacrifice in the Temple. Allegorically, church father Origen writes, "The sanctuary is the undisciplined soul, filled, not with animals and merchants, but with earthly and senseless attachments. Christ must expel them with the whip of his divine doctrine to make spiritual worship possible."






The Saint Inseph's Day Table Codebook



YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Pope Francis declared a Year of St. Joseph through December 8th 2021 on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being proclaimed as Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX in 1870. Throughout this special year we will include various insights, past and present about St. Joseph.

Typology of St. Joseph with the Joseph of the Old Testament




CCC 129 Christians read the Old Testament in the light of Christ crucified and risen. Such typological reading discloses the inexhaustible content of the Old Testament..., the New Testament has to be read in the light of the Old. Early Christian catechesis made constant use of the Old Testament. As an old saying put it, the New Testament lies hidden in the Old and the Old Testament is unveiled in the New.



The New is in the Old implicit; the Old is in the New explicit
The New is in the Old inferior; the Old is in the New Superior
The New is in the Old concealed; the Old is in the New revealed
The New is in the Old contained; the Old is in the New explained





Both Pope Pius IX in 1870 and Pope Leo XIII in 1889 spoke of St. Joseph of the Old Testament as a type of the New Testament Joseph. A number of parallels can be made with Joseph of the Old Testament and Jesus of course, but as one author wrote, "There can be no manner of doubt that God designed to give an exact and elaborate figure (type) of our saint Joseph in the person of the ancient patriarch (Joseph)."

If we're going to understand the full meaning, dignity and office of Joseph we have to understand how he was prefigured in God's plan of salvation through Joseph in the Old Testament.

- (1) Both share the same name (Mt 1:18; Gen 30:24); which means "May God Increase"
- (2) Both have fathers named Jacob (Mt 1:16; Gen 30:19-24);
- (3) The mother of the ancient Joseph, the beautiful Rachel, was buried near Bethlehem, which is associated with Joseph's family history. (Mt 2:18; Gen 35:19)
- (4) God spoke to both of them through dreams (Mt 1:20-21;2:13,19-22; Gen 37:5-11);
- (5) Both were called just, righteous (Mt 1:19; Wisdom 10:13);
- 6) Both had vocational calls that formed them as models of chastity (Joseph the patriarch in rebuffing the advances of another's spouse, St. Joseph in remaining a virgin in his marriage to Mary—Spouse of the Holy Spirt) (Mt 1:19; Luke 1:34; Gen 39:7-18);
- (7) Both would protect and provide for their families by bringing them to Egypt where both would provide and protect the "wheat the bread of Life" that will save, in one case, the world from famine, in the other the entire world from sin and spiritual death— in Joseph's case, Jesus who said he was the "bread of life" (John 6) fitting to be born in Bethlehem, the




