



Fr. Mike Schmitz shares important insights on the meaning of Christ's Cross. He shows how God's rescue mission for us includes the need for each person to embrace his own cross in order to reestablish trust in the Father and the understanding that love requires sacrifice. It also includes a bonus segment on Sta-

tions of the Cross, which features reflections on the Lord's Passion and Death.

Fr. Mike's simple, yet powerful, reflections helped me to contemplate Christ's passion in light of God's perfect, fatherly love for me. I was struck by the depth of this message for me personally, and how it deepened my relationship with God. Dennis – Batavia, IL The Season of Lent is upon us. 
