The Ascension of the Lord May 13, 2018



Exalted in Glory

All three readings talk about Jesus being taken up into heaven or in a cloud or on high. These descriptions of the ascension actually tell us that Jesus is reunited with his Father and exalted in glory with the Father. Jesus not only has a new life that cannot be ended by death, he also is no longer limited by time or space as he was before he died. So what does that mean for us?

Because he is not limited, he can be with us everywhere. Through his Spirit, he gives us the power and the courage to act as Jesus and the vision of faith so see Jesus in others. Now this takes some practice. One way we learn is through the lives of the saints. We see how God works through them to do great things. We learn that they become more and more like Jesus, in how they treat others with love and respect.

But if the saints seem too distant, we can look at someone we love. Whether it is a parent, spouse, brother, sister or friend, the good that they do and the love they show is from God. So we can learn about God's love for us by letting ourselves be loved by another.

The other side of the coin is seeing Jesus in ourselves. We may have to forgive ourselves for the bad choices we have made in the past, or the bad habits we still have. We also have to accept that God really does love us as his children. And we have to accept that sometimes, even when we do our best, we still seem to fail. But the God who brings life out of death also brings success out of failure. So trust his promise that we have Jesus in us. Then do your best to follow Jesus and you may lead someone else to him.



If your Mom had challenges in life and failed to be the best Mom she could, ask the Holy Spirit to help heal any wounds she may have knowingly or unknowingly caused by her words and actions. If she is still alive, ask for discernment and guidance from the Holy Spirit regarding possible paths for reconciliation. If no reconciliation is possible, then pray for peace and spiritual healing. Don't let her or you go to your grave with unresolved pains, hurts or bitterness. None of us want to appear before God with resentment in our hearts.

At baptism we were adopted by Holy Mother Church. Born from the font of eternal life, we look to our first spiritual Mother to guide us through this life to the Kingdom of God. The Church is much more than just a geographical location for worship and community. The Church is Mother of all the faithful and seeks to form her

children in a way that is pleasing to the Lord. We are gathered into a family of faith by the Sacraments and taught by the Church so that our beliefs can be more than just a personal relationship with God, but a communal expression of faith that transcends time and culture.

Our Lady of Fatima

The next time you stop by the church office, take a look at our collection of Marian plates that are displayed on the wall. This one is entitled "Our Lady of Fatima" and we'd like to tell you a little about this Marian feast.

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the

Mother of God, appeared six times to three shepherd children near the town of Fatima, Portugal between May 13 and October 13, 1917. (We just celebrated the 100th anniversary of her appearances last year.) Appearing to the children, the Blessed Virgin told them that She had been sent by God with a message for every man, woman and child living in our century. Coming at a time when civilization was torn asunder by war and bloody violence, She promised that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if Her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed.

"If My requests are granted ... there will be peace"

Our Lady of Fatima explained to the children that war is a punishment for sin and warned that God would further castigate the world for its disobedience to His Will by means of war, hunger and the persecution of the Church, the Holy Father and the Catholic Faithful.

In all Her appearances at Fatima, the Blessed Mother repeatedly emphasized the necessity of praying the Rosary daily, of wearing the Brown Scapular of Mount Carmel and of performing acts of reparation and sacrifice. She also asked that the Faithful practice a new devotion of reparation on the first Saturday of five consecutive months ("The Five First Saturdays").

Her feast day as Our Lady of Fatima is May 13.




