

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

There is always something very tender and heartwarming about a kiss. When someone who loves us offers us a kiss, it sends a clear message that we are valued and special. We occupy a unique place in their lives and have a distinct purpose. Kissing celebrates the wonder and beauty of human life. In a very powerful way, we are connected, through intimate touch, with another human being. With the incarnation of Christ, God kissed humanity. God, revealed so perfectly in Jesus Christ. showed us that we have value and are made in God's image and likeness. Mortal human beings radiate with the presence of God and are worthy enough to reveal the intimacy of the Divine Mystery. The human race is not simply something God created from a distance but something special within

which God dwells.

It is no wonder then, why the poor hold such an honored place in Jesus' ministry. They speak of God's love and they cry out for the compassion that is due them as children of God. Justice is about setting relationships right because we are all filled with God's love and have dignity. The human story is understood as a partnership, a true and new covenant, celebrating a love relationship between all of creation and their Creator. It is a story that does not end with the Cross or even the Resurrection. The story finds its happy ending in the Ascension. Our human narrative is still evolving and moving ever more closely toward that day when all will be one in Christ.

Jesus now sits at the right hand of the Father as the Christ of God. In the ascended state, we see what we are all meant to become and have before us the transformed life that awaits all of creation. The disciples got a glimpse of what this transfiguration would be on the holv mountain and it is an essential part of the Good News we are called to proclaim! Christ, now ascended to the Father, sets our paths straight and gives us a look at what awaits us. The day-to-day challenges of life often find us struggling with our incompleteness. Today's celebration gives us the strength to persevere, knowing that we'll eventually be well. May our hearts be enlightened so that we can know this hope and the surpassing greatness of Christ's power!

The Lifeblood of the Parish

Dear Parishioners,

Families are the lifeblood of parish life. All households in our parish are meant to be families of faith, hope and love. My strongest desire as a pastor and spiritual father is to assist our families in pursuing that goal. I care greatly for our single person families as much as our families with children hanging off the rafters and everything in between. Families are the lifeblood, and the heart that makes that blood vital and alive are the Sacraments. At the center of our Sacramental life is the Eucharist. Nothing is more essential to our life as a Catholic than the Eucharist. Catholics without a Eucharistic heart become more and more lifeless and listless. You can be a very good person without the Eucharist in your life, but you cannot be a disciple.

One of the things I have noticed throughout my priesthood is the lack of that Eucharistic Heart in the lives of many of our families. I am so blessed to see so many of you— who read this bulletin every Sunday here for our most important hour together. I focus on the good I see and try my best to build upon that foundation. At the same time, I am keenly aware of how many either struggle to obtain that heart of faith, or have simply shelved it for whatever reason. It is one of the most reoccurring sources of sadness in my ministry.

Of vital important to our parish family is the formation of our children in the faith and the continuing formation of adults. Our parish has vast resources at our disposal to help accomplish that goal of personal growth and formation. I have watched here, and at every parish I have served, efforts to help parents and individuals make faith the priority in their lives. With that in mind I am instituting a change in our parish life with the goal of making Sundays Sacred and the Eucharist the source and summit of our life as parishioners.

Starting in September PSR will be hosted on Sunday mornings between the 7:30 Mass and the 9:30 Mass- which will be moved forward a half hour to 10am. I know this change is not necessary, but it is greatly needed if we want to make faith a real part of our life. As I mentioned last week, change is something many of us loathe, and I imagine some of you will. I would ask that you pray about your reactions to this news. Feel free to come talk with me about it or send an e-mail to me. Your feedback is welcome and mostly appreciated. Concurrent with PSR will the addition of family formation that all parishioners are welcome to attend. My goal is to provide something for all families in the parish as a way to bring the life of Christ from church into your homes in a more concrete and discernible manner.

To our PRS families, please consider this change as an intentional effort to help you and your children embrace our faith. Seeing your children attend our classes but miss our worship is a very sad reality. Of even greater sadness is seeing our young people think that Catholicism and God are irrelevant realities in their life. 85% abandon their practice and connection with the faith within 5 years of Confirmation, many started well before Confirmation. We are not powerless to change this reality. We need but apply the effort and invest ourselves in the faith to reap the great treasure and the pearl beyond all price.



From the Parish Library: Grand Hall



Now, the larger-than-life story of The New Testament gets a larger-than life treatment in the stand-alone feature SON OF GOD. Told with the scope and scale of an action epic, the film features powerful performances, exotic locales, dazzling visual effects and a rich orchestral score from Oscarwinner Hans Zimmer. Portuguese actor Diogo Morgado portrays Jesus as the film spans from his humble birth through his teachings, crucifixion and ultimate resurrection. It marks the first motion picture about Jesus' life since Passion of the Christ, released ten years ago.

As law enforcement officers, Adam Mitchell, Nathan Hayes, David Thomson and Shane Fuller are confident and focused. Yet at the end of the day, they face a challenge that none of them are truly prepared to tackle: fatherhood. The Ascension-Evangelization

All of the Christian faithful, by virtue of their Baptism, are called by God to spread the Good News. Evangelization is not some exclusive mission that God has entrusted to a select few. Today we celebrate Christ's Ascension to the right hand of the Father; Christ has made captive our captivity (Ephesians 4:8). He calls us to walk in the freedom of the children of God, who joyfully announce to others the salvation He has won for us. Evangelization does not have to entail mission trips to foreign lands. It starts within our own minds and hearts. We can seek to learn more about our Catholic Faith and seek opportunities for catechesis and instruction. We can pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit each day. We can share the beautiful encounter we have had with the Lord with others through simple acts of charity and kindness. God is with us always!

Limberg and Gober both have previous experience in most aspects of business, food, nature and the arts.



Year of St. Joseph

Pope Francis declared a Year of St. Joseph through December 8th 2021 on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being proclaimed as Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX in 1870. Throughout this special year we will include various insights, past and present about St. Joseph.

Saint Joseph is described with the word "just". In different places the word for "just" is also translated as "righteous." This title was one of the highest compliments a person could receive in first century Jewish society. St. Jerome described it as the perfect possession of all virtues. It was attributed to those who faithfully observe both divine and human laws, whose way of life was wholly conformed, united to the will of God. We see this in chapter one of Luke's Gospel when he applies the term to Zechariah and Elizabeth. (Luke 1:6) "Both were righteous in the eyes of God, <u>observing all</u> <u>the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blamelessly.</u>" Pope Benedict XVI in his series on Jesus of Naz-



<u>areth</u> wrote, "Psalm 1 presents the classic image of the "just" man. We might well think of it as a portrait of the spiritual figure of St. Joseph." Psalm 1: Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners,² but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. ³He is like a tree planted by streams of water, that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.....⁶ for the Lord knows the way of the righteous (just), but the way of the wicked will perish.

Just Men Follow the Law. Saint Luke is especially concerned to tell us that Jesus' parents observed all the prescriptions of the Law: the rites of the circumcision of Jesus, the purification of Mary after childbirth, the offering of the firstborn to God (cf. 2:21-24). In terms of secular obedience, journeying to Bethlehem for the census in obedience to the orders of legitimate authority, Joseph fulfilled for the child the significant task of officially inserting the name "Jesus, son of Joseph of Nazareth" (cf. Jn 1:45) in the registry of the Roman Empire. One of the laws, precepts of the Church is to attend weekly Mass and Holy Days. In fact, this is what Fr. Tom has emphasized that "If there is only one thing you do as a Catholic, go to Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation." The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: *The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor.*
