

"Smoting" or Non-"smoting"?

Some times I get angry at things that frustrate me. I'm driving home and traffic slows to a crawl. The electricity goes out while I'm watching a favorite show. So I have to struggle with the line in our first reading, where the disciples were "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name" (Acts 5:41). They weren't just frustrated; they were flogged for believing in Jesus. And still they rejoiced.

Imagine rejoicing over pain and suffering. These disciples had seen Jesus on the cross. When he rose from the dead, they began to see that his suffering was not a tragic loss, but a sign of his glory. They loved him so much that they took to heart his command to take up the cross. And when they suffered because they

believed in him, as is recounted in today's reading, they saw that as a way to imitate Jesus on the cross. Those who had followed him in life could also follow him to the cross—and many did that literally, by dying for their faith.

Most of us today rarely have the chance to die for our faith. We may wonder if we even have the courage it would take. Instead, we usually find ourselves suffering because we have done wrong. God does not use special interventions to smite sinners. Think of the times we were punished as a child. Think of the times we lost a friend because of a cruel remark. Think of the times we got a ticket for speeding. These are the result of our actions. These are sufferings that we would rather avoid.

Jesus, however, suffered for our sins when he was totally innocent. If he could do that, could we not accept suffering for our own sins when it comes? We may not be ready to rejoice in that suffering, but we can at least try to learn from it. If we behave differently because of it, if we can grow to be better persons, then that suffering can be our way of accepting the cross.

Of course, not all suffering is caused by the sins of the person suffering. The suffering of the innocent is a great mystery, a cause for sorrow and a challenge to help where we can. But like growing pains, all suffering is a step to new life in Christ. And that is what Easter is about.





Do You Love Me?

Have you ever asked this question of someone you love?

These are the words of Jesus to Peter after the resurrection. In this famous passage, Jesus asks him three times. Over and over again, Jesus persists. "Do you love me?" It must have hurt Peter to hear his Lord and Master repeat this penetrating question. Exasperated, Peter says, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you!"

Jesus knew Peter believed, but he also knew how fragile his faith was. Only a short time before did Peter deny Jesus and run away when Jesus was crucified. Jesus doesn't demand an expression of faith, so much as encourage us to be confident and sure when we say, *I Believe*. Jesus knows once Peter is confirmed in faith, he will do anything for the proclamation of the Gospel.

The Annual Catholic Appeal asks the question, "Will you give?" In some ways it is the same question as "Do you love me?" or even "Do you believe?" It is really one question, not three, to which the Christian is invited to make a response. I Believe, in short, means I love and I will give.

10 Reasons to Love and Honor Mary



Here are 10 reasons to increase our love for the Mother of God.

- (1) Loving Mary is pleasing to God. We cannot outdo God and no one has ever loved and honored Mary more than God has. God the Father chose her to be the Mother of his only Son; she is the spouse of the Holy Spirit, and mother to God's only begotten Son.
- (2) She is nothing. Therefore, she is everything. "As the most humble handmaid of the Lord who is 'full of grace,' Mary was the perfect instrument of God because she was nothing else but his instrument," Thomas Merton.

- (4) It's a way to imitate the saints. I never met a saint who didn't love and honor Mary. Many of them were rarely without a rosary handy.




- (6) It's Scriptural to Include Mary. The Blessed Mother was part of the incarnation, birth, first miracle, passion, and the death of Jesus and with the apostles for the descent of the Holy Spirit. It is believed that she was present during Our Lord's Ascension. The first part of the Hail Mary is from Scripture and is centered on Jesus. Jesus and Mary go together.
- (7) It's historical. During Old Testament times, it was the Queen—the king's mother in those days—who people went to with their requests. The best chance at getting a good answer from the king was to run it by his mother. That's the way it was done during King David's time and Jesus is descended from the House of David.
- (8) God Continues to Give Us His Mother. A multitude of Church-approved Marian apparitions shows that God continues to send his mother to help us.
- (9) Her Rosary is a weapon. Padre Pio and a host of saints called it a weapon against evil and prayed it continually. There are many documented miracle stories and many personal stories attributed to praying the Rosary.
- (10) Mary is righteous. No one can argue that she must be the most righteous, therefore, the Bible attests to the power of her prayers. "The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effect" (James 5:16).
