

Deeper Underslanding of Scriplure

I remember as a child the meticulousness my father would bring to a task. Whether it be tending to a chore in the yard, repairing something, or painting a room, the tiniest of every detail demanded his attention. He had great patience. I benefited greatly by his example and remember these lessons well. We all need examples to follow. It is important to identify folks who excel at simple things and show us how to do things well. There are those among us and those who have gone before us who serve as these models and witnesses. They are ordinary people who in their "extraordinary ordinariness" capture our attention and allow us to see things more clearly.

These are the prophets, martyrs, teachers, witnesses, heralds, and innovators who bring a single-minded devotion to God to

even the simplest of tasks they perform. They have an openness to being used and become vessels of Divine justice, mercy, and presence. They call us to the "more" of life and point us to the Gospel in all of its simplicity and splendor. They remind us of the little ones of the Kingdom and the values we all need to cultivate and possess. They are the poor in spirit, the meek, the merciful, and the peacemaker who often are rejected not only by those who have far different agendas but by those you think would welcome them.

All of the saints in heaven and on earth form this cloud of witnesses who journey with us as we make our way through life. They offer us inspiration, wisdom, intercession, and support. They direct us toward true happiness and remind us that we are all called to be saints. All it takes is

desire, love, and fidelity. There is much we can learn from the official saints of the church. Their guidance is ever before us and ever with us. But there is also a lot to learn from the unofficial saints of the church. They sit beside us every Sunday, are our neighbors and ordinary people we meet every day. Because of the devotedness of their faith, they remind us to keep going, remain focused, and cultivate purpose and meaning, and give voice to those who have none. The inspiration is all around us.

Pay attention to the details. Do what you do with great love. Know that you are not alone. Believe that you can persevere. Have great faith.

Dear parishioners and friends,

The month of November is marked by two great Feast Days: All Saints and All Souls.

All Saints celebrates all of the holy men and women who have gone before us and share in the glory and communion of God. The Church promotes our devotion to the saints as a way of deepening our communion with them, drawing inspiration from their life, and help through their intercession. The Saints are not capable of answering our prayers, only God can do that. But the Saints are yearning to pray with us and for us. When we "pray to saints" what we are really doing is asking them to intercede for us. If you don't have any favorite saints, I would invite you to do some more exploration and develop a friendship with them. My spiritual friends are the Blessed Mother, John the Baptist, St. John Chrysostom, and Gregory the Great as a well as a few others. Cultivate a new friendship with someone who loves God and wants you to share your eternity with them.

All Souls and all of November is marked by praying for all of the faithful departed. Few things are as important as praying for the dead. None of us knows an entire person's life story, and we are not privy to all of their struggles and possible sins. Sin is so pervasive in our lives that more than half our Sacraments are directed at healing us of our sins. If by chance we go before God without all of our sins reconciled by God's mercy and our atonement, Purgatory is there to help complete the work of our conversion. Our prayers help the Poor Souls in their final act of conversion. Only those free from all effects of sin will go to Heaven. For those of us still wrestling with sin and grace, we can

hope that Purgatory will offer us the merciful opportunity to complete the work of atonement for our sins and the conversion of our hearts. Please pray for the dead and perhaps even visit their grave to lift them up to the mercy of God. Since we don't know the fate of the departed, don't prematurely consign "Uncle Tom" to heaven and never offer a prayer for him again. I hope all of my beloved dead are in heaven, but I pray for them every day that they will be genuinely sorry for their sins and seek God's immense mercy.

Sadly, it is unlikely that everyone will be sorry for their sins. The Bible warns us repeatedly of developing a hardened heart. A hardened heart is unresponsive to grace and unrepentant of sin. Those of us who remain unrepentant and unconverted to God's love and truth will go to Hell. The Damned are not consigned to Hell because God is some kind of sadist. The Damned will be there by their own free will. I pray no one puts themselves in this permanent state. God has done everything to insure our salvation short of violating our free will. We have a choice to make: live like future citizens of the Kingdom, or live like wretched creatures that have forsaken their Creator. There will be no sorrow in Hell. If that were the case, sorrow would open the way to repentance. Hell will be a state of unfettered pride, anger and envy. It's not pleasant to think about Hell, and it shouldn't be. We should be striving for personal holiness so that we receive our adoption completely as God's beloved sons and daughters.




