

# Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When doing student report cards, there was a comment the teacher could choose that read: inattentive and easily distracted. Could that comment describe your spiritual life? We can become so consumed with myriad distractions and preoccupations and lose our connection to what is really significant and important. We can become dull. This happens in our human relationships, too. We can easily take the love of others for granted, whether it be a parent, spouse, friend, or a child. We assume and presume that their love will always be there and do very little to cultivate, rejuvenate, and deepen it. Presumption can become a great sin.

We do the same thing with God and our spiritual lives. We presume that God

will be merciful. Because we believe that in the end God is going to forgive us anyway, then why put a lot of effort into things now? What's the point? It's far easier to find a comfortable spot, curl up and take a nap! There is no immediate urgency to staying awake and attentive, so we think, and we simply fly by the seat of our pants. Assuming and presuming too much about our relationships, especially our relationship with God, can lead to neglect and abuse. It can even lead to a sense of entitlement, where we actually believe that something is due us without much effort on our part.

Folks who are distracted and preoccupied can find their relationships, especially the primary ones, drifting away.

You can actually be married to someone for many years and wake up one morning realizing that you really do not know them or truly recognize them. We have to desire God in order to recognize God. We have to open our hearts, minds, and souls to His Presence so that we can be rejuvenated and refreshed. But we cannot do this if we are distracted or napping. We have to be awake and alert! As a young child eagerly watches for and anticipates that arrival of their parent home, so too we must watch for God's presence. If the anticipation of God's arrival does not excite us and rouse us, then we need to ask why. The wise person keeps vigilant watch, knowing that in the end they will not be disappointed.

Congratulations to Nancy Ast, who has recently completed her year long journey and training to minister to and be of service to others as a Spiritual Director. In a ceremony on November 30th, Nancy will receive her formal certificate in Spiritual Direction from Archbishop Rozanski. Every PSR class has a chosen patron saint which catechists help students learn about. After 8 years, students will have learned more about 8 folks in God's Holy Hall of Fame. Meet the 6th grade patron—Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati. Pier Giorgio Frassati was born on April 6, 1901, in Turin, Italy. His father, Alfredo, was the founder and director of an Italian newspaper and a politician. His mother, Adelaide, was a painter. Mr. and Mrs. Frassati were not exactly ideal parents. Alfredo antagonized his children, and Adelaide was high-strung and critical. They attended Mass because it was an obligation. From his early childhood, Pier Giorgio was sensitive to the needs of others. At the age of fourteen, he began attending Mass and receiving Communion almost every day. Later Pier Giorgio joined the Dominican Third Order. Pier Giorgio's ministry was to the poor. Pier Giorgio's friends knew him as a lively prankster who enjoyed mountain climbing and skiing. He was also a social justice activist, taking part in religious demonstrations against fascism. In 1925, he contracted polio from one of his patients. Giorgio would soon be close to death. His last hours were spent in quiet prayer and in giving last minute instructions for helping the poor, who

Anointing. He was twenty-four.

Pier Giorgio was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1990. The life of Pier Giorgio will impress kids more than many other saints because they will be able to relate to this athletic, adventurous youth and young adult. They will learn one of his principles of life: "Life must be lived well, following true and sound principles. It's never enough to simply get along."

# Miracles and Phenomena associated through Blessed Pier Giorgio Frasatti's intercession

# WHAT WAS THE FIRST MIRACLE ATTRIBUTED TO BLESSED FRASSATI'S INTERCESSION?

Although many miracles may perhaps be attributed to the intercession of Blessed Frassati, the Church officially recognized the healing of Domenico Sellan in 1933. At the time, Domenico was 40 years old and suffering from a tubercular disease of the spine, paralyzed and nearing death. A priest visited him on December 28, 1933, and brought him a small prayer card of Pier Giorgio (whose cause for canonization was opened soon after his death.) Domenico was miraculously cured and lived another 35 years.

It wasn't until 1989 that the documentation of this miracle received final approval. Pier Giorgio Frassati was declared "Blessed" the following year on May 20, 1990. Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati...pray for us!

# IF PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI'S BODY WAS FOUND INCORRUPT WHEN HIS TOMB WAS OPENED, WOULDN'T THAT BE CONSIDERED HIS SECOND MIRACLE?

A second miracle must be attributed to the intercession of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati in order for his cause of canonization to proceed. However, the mere fact that

his body was found to be incorrupt is not sufficient. In rare cases, incorruptibility may be considered miraculous. Generally, however, incorruptibility is only considered to be evidence of the holiness of the person. Why then is the tomb opened during the canonization process? This is normal procedure for identifying the mortal remains of the holy person.

#### IF THERE ARE TWO MIRACLES NECESSARY FOR THE CANONIZATION PROCESS. ARE THERE ANY OTHERS "PENDING"?

#### A young man's unexplained recovery may be the miracle that leads to the future saint's canonization

In 2011, Kevin Becker fell from the second floor of a house he shared with a couple of college roommates, fracturing his skull in five places and damaging every lobe of his brain. After an emergency operation he lay stable but unresponsive for nine days. The doctors thought he wouldn't live; and if he did he would suffer from gross cognitive deficits.

A picture of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati had been sent to his mother by a cousin, who suggested she ask for Frassati's intercession. Becker's mother did so, and placed the picture at his side.

During his coma, Kevin remembers waking up in the house he shared with his friends, and hearing someone downstairs. That was odd; he says he's always the first one up. He investigated, and in the living room he found a young man he didn't know.

"Who are you?"
"I'm George, your new roommate."


"That can't be. I already have two roommates."

"They aren't around anymore."

"Oh."

He then spent a long timeless day with George. An ardent soccer player who hates staying indoors, Kevin kept trying to leave the house but George wouldn't let him go. They fought about it, as if they were brothers, but George was adamant. He encouraged him to be patient, passing the time by sitting on the couch [with Kevin] playing a soccer video game called "FIFA."


Eventually he awoke in the hospital. Less than three weeks after his injury he was wheeled to the door of the hospital, where he stood up, slung his bag over his shoulder, and walked to the car ... tossing a football with his brother. The records of Kevin's case have been sent to the Vatican; and his recovery may well be the miracle that leads to Frassati's canonization.
