Come to the Feast

Why would invited guests refuse to come to a wedding? Free food and drink, music and dancing—what's not to like? Apparently the king in Jesus' parable had the same questions. By this time, Jesus knew that many of the Jewish leaders would not accept the invitation to follow him. As we know, after the Resurrection, the disciples began to spread the good news not only to other Jews, but to anyone who would listen. The church began to grow, much faster than they expected.


One reason the leaders in Israel did not accept Jesus was his association with sinners. They did not understand that God calls sinners to repent and be forgiven. Since they thought of

themselves as holy, they were not interested in forgiveness. Ordinary people, who knew they were sinners, were attracted by the offer of forgiveness. Many of them repented and came to be baptized. As the parable says, they filled the banquet hall.

Jesus calls us today to come to the same feast. But there are still people who think they have no need for Jesus. So what about the man in the parable who came in street clothes? The wedding garment was a symbol of the baptismal gown, the sign of new life in Christ. This man symbolizes those who "come to the feast" without repenting of their sins. We can be like that man sometimes. We come to church arguing with our

spouse on the way. We bring our prejudices, lies, anger, and selfishness—with no intention of doing anything about them. We come with the attitude that says, "I'm here, aren't I? That should be good enough." But it isn't, for the feast we come to is not a wedding to join husband and wife. It joins God to humanity. God's Son came to unite us all to himself. By dying for our sins, Jesus calls us to come back to God. So repentance is not just a change of clothing; it is a change of heart, a change in how we live. It is our ticket to the banquet. It is our way of saying, "I know I don't deserve this, but thanks for letting me share the feast."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Last Sunday at the 7:30 and 9:30 Mass I had a brief homily about the importance of our attitude. Attitude is everything! Our attitude is the one thing that is our sole responsibility. Others can influence our attitude; life's circumstances can test our attitude. But in the end it is ours and ours alone. It is in the personal realm of our attitude that grace is either planting new seeds of faith or being as ineffective as water on a rock. Here is a check list that I discovered on the internet and tweaked for consideration. I genuinely care about those around me and I am able to express it	I am flexible when it comes to my plans and expectations
I look for ways to make other's lives better	I am a giver, not a taker or user
I make an effort to speak in positive and encouraging ways	I seek solutions rather than complain about problems
I have goals towards which I am willing to work and sacrifice	I take responsibility for my attitude and feelings

The more of these to which you can answer yes, the more positive your attitude is. However, a positive attitude is only the seed bed for a Christian attitude. The attitude we are ultimately striving for is that of Our Lord. His attitude was one of love rooted in truth that acted with bold humility.

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

[Jesus told this parable.] "A king . . . prepared a wedding feast for his son. He sent his servants to tell the invited guests 'Come to the wedding feast!' But the invited guests... went about their business: one went to his farm, another to his store. [Then the king said to his servants,] 'Now go . . . and invite to the feast as many people as you find.' And Jesus concluded, 'Many are invited, but few are chosen.'" *Matthew 22:2-5,9,14*

The "cast of characters" in Jesus' parable is as follows: the king is God; the wedding feast, God's Kingdom; the first guests, God's Chosen People; the latter guests, Gentiles and sinners. Jesus' parable invites me to ask: To what extent am I responding to God's invitation to the wedding feast the way the first guests did: giving priority to my business rather than to the invitation?


In today's Gospel we hear Jesus say: "Many are invited, but few are chosen."

October is Respect Life Month

Do Not Conform Yourself to this Age

St. Paul tells us, “Do not confirm yourself to this age but ... discern ... what is good and pleasing ...”

Since Roe v. Wade, around 60 million innocent children have lost their God-given right to live. An entire class of persons, children in the womb, have been relegated to the status of “chattel,” personal property, who can be disposed of by those more powerful than they. They have no power to resist. They are subject to abuse and destruction by those with more power, namely the power of the State. They have no voice that can be heard except our own.

Without doubt, the killing of innocent children in the womb is the pre-eminent moral evil of our age. It is for this reason that we must “not conform” to this grave injustice. As St. Paul tells us, we must instead stand on the side of truth and justice and “what is good and pleasing to God.” We must recognize what both medical science and natural justice tell us: children in the womb are human persons with an inalienable right to life.


Undoubtedly, the most important human rights issue of our age is to protect our “first neighbors” - children in the womb. The womb is the “first home” of the whole human race and standing up for them is a matter of solidarity with our neighbors and love for the poor. We should not stand by while thousands of children every day are evicted and killed! Our call (as St. Paul reminds us) is to replace the current culture of death with a new culture of life and a civilization of love.

Note: With close to 3000 items, the Parish Library is located in the Grand Hall past the restrooms.


It is open during the week-normal business hours-and works on an honor system.






