Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Nobody enjoys paying taxes. Despite our displeasure in being forced to do so, we also realize that the monies generated from taxes allows governments to provide essential services for its people. Corruption really gets our goat, however. When we witness malfeasance, overspending, irresponsibility, and dishonesty in governmental spending, the grave injustices make an already unpleasant and arduous task even more difficult. The inappropriate distribution and use of hard-earned monies can leave a person quite angry and disconnected. It's bad enough the government wants something from me, now God does, too?

God is not concerned necessarily with our money, although its proper use does factor into our faith life. As the payment of secular taxes speaks of our allegiance to the government, our return to God speaks of our allegiance to God. All of creation, even the entire universe, is fashioned in the image and likeness of God. What speaks to God and has meaning and relevance to him? All of creation and indeed our very selves! God delights in us and when we present ourselves back to him, he delights even more! As the payment of secular taxes is designed to secure the equitable distribution of goods and services to all people, so is our return of ourselves to God in gratitude meant to advance God's kingdom here on earth.

When our exclusive and sincere allegiance is given to God, God can use us to set things right and straight again. The wounds of sin distort our relationship and disorder our world. By giving ourselves and all of creation back to God in gratitude, we acknowledge the proper Creator and Author of life for who He is and devote our labors exclusively to God's kingdom and the justice, peace, or order God envisions. In giving back to God all that belongs to God, we set the axis of our lives correctly and put our priorities in proper order. All of our relationships, especially with God, our brothers and sisters, and all of creation are perceived more clearly as they really are. Using, accumulating, wasting, exploiting, hording, and self-preservation are no longer necessary.

Dear Parishioners,

Last Advent we brought back the 11:30 Mass as a pastoral way of incorporating Praise and Worship Music into the liturgical life of the parish. I think the addition of this music has been a blessing for the parish. It is a vibrant musical celebration of our faith and an expression of it that appeals to many of our younger parishioners. The band has been active and generous in their ministry at that Mass and at our Adore evenings.

While the experience of the 11:30 Mass has been overall positive, it remains the smallest of our Mass assemblies and at times I personally struggle with various degrees of participation at that Mass. Perhaps it is just the smaller assembly and it is unfair to compare with the Mass that just preceded it. The fullness of the 9:30 (still reduced because of Covid as all our Masses are) ends up being contrasted against the sparseness of the 11:30 Mass. While the music can compensate for a smaller community, it cannot replace it. I often find the 11:30 Mass the most difficult one to pray because of my own waning energy level. This is not something I like to admit, but I cannot keep this pace and hope to maintain a positive attitude and enthusiasm about what is most dear to my heart, the Eucharist. Not the Eucharist as a whole, but rather the 11:30 expression of that mystery.

While my own personal shortcomings are the primary reason for discontinuing the 11:30 Mass after **November 22nd** there are a number of oth-

er secondary reasons. Here are just a few other thoughts that went into my discernment of this issue.

- There is no real pastoral need for this Mass in terms of seating.
- Finding supplement priests to assist is unlikely and inconsistent. While I had given it a fair amount of prayer and thought, in the end the one responsible for this Mass would always be the pastor. Fill-in priests remain too much of a variable for me to place any hope or confidence in finding one.
- All things being equal, a church full of parishioners praying and participating is much more enriching for the life of the parish and myself.
- As the parish continues to grow, I am open to revisiting this Mass, but more then likely it will be a decision of my successor rather than myself.

While I would prefer that all of our parishioners to attend Mass here, I want to make you aware of later Masses in neighboring parishes.

For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. What is the consecration? It is a devotion in which the person sets aside time each day for 33 days to pray certain prayers and read devotional reading all focused on how Mary leads us closer to Jesus.

How much time do I need to devote to this each day? It is advised to set aside a least 15 minutes a day for this devotion.

What do I read and pray? We will be using 33 Days to Morning Glory by Fr. Michael Gaitley as our guidebook.

Why do I need to sign-up to do this? It is always good to have prayer warriors by your side when you are trying a new devotion with the purpose of growing your relationship with Christ. We are your prayer warriors, cheer leaders and trail guides for this devotion. We are praying for you every
