The Way to the Kingdom

The disciples were trying to be helpful. In the Temple of Jerusalem, only priests could enter the Holy of Holies, the men could enter the sanctuary, while women and children only got into the vestibule. So the disciples knew that children never approached the Rabbis. To show their respect for Jesus, they tried to turn the children away. But Jesus saw this as a chance to teach the disciples about the kingdom.

As they tried to send the children back to their parents, Jesus changes the rules. He invites the kids to come to him and even makes an example of them: "accept the kingdom of God like children" or you won't

get in at all. So what do we learn from this?

Children don't make themselves look important. They haven't learned to brag about their accomplishments, or how to offer a bribe to get what they want. They simply accept what is given to them. In a culture where we are expected to make a good impression, where we compete to get scholarships and jobs, we may be more like the disciples than we think. A young man falling in love may be tempted to show what a great athlete he is, or how he plans to get a high paying job after graduation. Yet all he really needs to do is tell the girl that he loves her.

We cannot make ourselves look important to God; we can't bribe Him with good works or change His mind with promises to avoid sin. We can be sorry for our sins, and tell Him we love Him, and ask for help with our weaknesses.

Children also have great faith. Not the deep faith that comes with adult experience, but a faith that sees goodness in everyone. If we can keep that faith in God's goodness, while developing a deeper faith that is not discouraged by sin and evil, we are on the way to the Kingdom.

Away at Convocation

Dear Parishioners,

This week I will be with other priests of the Archdiocese as we gather with Archbishop Carlson to celebrate our priesthood and ministry. Please pray for all of us. Nothing is more important in our lives than prayer. It is the foundation of authentic discipleship. All of us want to strive for greater time in prayer and greater depth while praying. Time in prayer is important. You can measure the potential depth of your love by the time you are willing to give to those you love. It is the same for God. Thinking about God, talking about God is good, but actually seeking God in prayer is great. Just as nothing replaces the time we actually spend with those we love, it is the same for God.

Time spent with God and others opens the possibility of depth of sharing and communion. It is possible but rare for depth in relationships to happen rapidly. Most relationships require time and a growing level of comfort and vulnerability for depth to occur. Relationships with genuine depth, mutual sharing, challenges and growth take time, effort and patience. It is the same with God. Our depth of listening to God requires time, effort and patience. Depth is not a situation of control, but rather a state whereby our efforts become more lovingly attentive to God. Attentive love will open the door to the possibility of signs and subtle movements of God


in our life. Those subtle movements are meant to both console us and challenge us to seriously reform and renew our lives.

The Church is always in need of reform and renewal. It begins on a personal level and hopefully transforms the community of the Church. There is never an age when the Church is not in need of reform because we always contend with sin. Every member of the Church is susceptible to sin, and none are exempt from its consequences. When we fail to address known sin and injustice, scandal destroys communion within the Church. Reform is never easy, and will often become distorted itself if it does not flow from prayer. Prayer should embolden us to act with justice and seek reform with hopeful courage.








PSR CORNER


