

Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone. Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends, struggles with understanding things and grasping the big picture. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881 -1955) a renowned and learned French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him: "We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience." Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option. It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations! This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's picture. If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death, not something that gives the courage to live through it!

So, when we protest and get upset with God because our journey is becoming

difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see. It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following purely human paths. It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so. Through prayer we can let go and let be. This is how we lose our lives but then save them.

A Generous Faith

Dear Parishioners,

As we mature as Disciples of Jesus one of the attributes we want to make our own is a generous faith. The next two points in our Top 10 List help us to move towards living a generous faith.

#5 Pray the Rosary frequently

Few things identify a Catholic more easily and readily than a Rosary. How often do we see them in the hands of our Beloved Dead when we attend a wake? If we arrive early enough at Mass we see others or occasionally join them in praying a Rosary. While some may dismiss the Rosary as a series of meaningless prayers, those who have become more familiar with the meaning of Rosary know that it is a mediation on the life of Our Lord and His relationship with His Mother. Praying the Rosary cultivates in our own hearts the same love of Jesus that the Blessed Mother held in her heart. We join Her in meditating on the most important events in the life of Jesus and applying them to our own life. The more we grow in our appreciation and understanding of the life of Jesus, the more we grow in gratitude for His sacrifice and love for us. The deeper the prayer, the greater the love.

Where prayer is in our schedule, there is God in our heart. Ok, it probably isn't that simple, but if you don't pray, God becomes a stranger and unwelcome guest in our life. God is present even if we don't pray, but when we do, we continue to enrich that loving relationship with Him and become more receptive to His life and love. We make time for what we love, we take time for who we love. The more the mysteries of the Rosary—the mysteries at the heart of our faith—permeate our heart and rest in our thoughts, the more gratitude we

have for Jesus' boundless and generous love. Those who are aware of being forgiven much, have greater gratitude than those with less awareness. This gratitude is the fuel that brings us before His altar and encourages us to join our lives to His in one sacrifice of praise to the Father.

#6 Be generous with your blessings through charities and tithing.

Awareness of such generous, unmerited love should motivate us to be generous in our faith. If we are living a generous faith we should strive to be people of tithing. The ideal mix is 5% to a faith community and another 5% to other charities that you want to support. Most people are not at the tithing level of generosity, but it is something we should strive to embrace. Looking at our spending habits is as essential as looking at our habits of spending time and seeking entertainment. If we don't pay attention, we will one day be shocked with how much we spend on ourselves without ever thinking about our generous giving.

I don't make it a point to see what individuals contribute to the parish, but I do pay attention to our weekly collection. I see your generosity to our various special fund raising activities, second collections or other expenses in parish life. I am always amazed and deeply humbled by your generosity. I pray that more people will be inspired to share their blessings with the our parish family, the universal Church and with other charities in need. We make time for what we love, we give our support to what matters to us.

Our New Listening System

There are three methods by which one can make use of the system:

1. The traditional body pack receiver with headphones are available on the shelf to the right just before you enter the sanctuary. There are 4 units there along with the chargers, so if you return the unit to the charger they will be ready for the next person.

Side note: We will be providing alcohol wipes at that station for cleaning before and after use if desired.

- This system also has the capability to connect to T-Coil equipped Hearing Aids. We currently have two of the neckloops that convert the body pack receiver to enable linking to your own hearing aids.
- 3. The third option is not ready yet, but the system will connect through an App on your cellular device and you will use your own earbuds to listen in. The app is available through your app store. We will post more detailed information in the bulletin when we have it ready.

We will have 4 body packs and 2 of the neckloops for each Mass. You would also have the option to order your own devices if you desire. Estimated cost for the bodypack is \$100 each and the neckloop for hearing aids runs \$50 each.

We expect to have the WIFI connection for the Cellular devices in the next week or two.




St. Paul Library / Lighthouse CD Resources

From the Parish Library—Grand Hall

Decades as a Christian leader, most notably at the U.N. as president of the Center for Family & Human Rights, have earned writer Austin Ruse (once a Washington liberal with little faith) his share of defeats and triumphs. Perhaps most valuably, he has intuited keen tactical insights from his confrontations with the dark side of human nature. You come away from this groundbreaking book with the sense that Ruse knows the enemy better than the enemy knows himself.

Ruse carefully examines how the anti-Christian forces gained power over every elite institution in America. He exposes their most deviant plans for the future. He then issues his authoritative call to arms, brilliantly arguing that there is no finer time to be a faithful Catholic. God Himself called each of us to live in this time and place, to contribute to the renewal of society and the Church, and to vanquish the enemies of civiliza-



tion. Ruse argues that each of us is called specifically to this battle and he provides a roadmap for fighting the major challenges American Christians now face. He identifies the vulnerabilities of the Leftists who appear so dominant today, and he pinpoints Catholicism's most potent sources of resistance. More than anything, Ruse argues that, as dark as these days seem to be, future generations will look upon this generation with envy that they could not have been here with us in these dangerous times when everything seems so lost. 


