

Laws of Love

When someone mentions laws and/or commandments, we usually think of them as burdens that we have to bear to be good citizens or church members. But if you listen carefully to the first reading from Deuteronomy, you get the sense that the laws Moses presented to the people of Israel were gifts from God, something to be proud of. Moses gives two reasons for this.

Moses presents the laws as wise and just, so much so that other nations would praise and envy the Israelites for having such laws. No doubt some of the nations around at the time had kings who used the law to keep themselves in power and make them wealthy. As the Jews had no kings at this time, they only had to obey God's laws. Moses' command not to add or subtract from the

laws was a reminder that they were directly from God, not an interpretation by Moses.

The origin of the laws was the second reason they were revered. They showed how much God cared for His people, that He would guide them in their everyday lives and hear their prayers. Though God is greater than they could comprehend, He is also nearer than we think. Which brings us to Jesus, who shows us the Father and who made the law both simpler and more challenging!

Jesus simplified the laws and commandments by showing us that loving God with all our being and loving our neighbors as ourselves was the basis of all God's laws. But it is also more difficult because it is no longer enough to

simply avoid hurting or cheating others. We are to love one another as Jesus loves us. That means reaching out to those in need, forgiving our enemies, caring for the sick or dying, teaching our children that love is more important than money.

And don't forget the first part of Jesus' command: loving God. How often do we even think about Him, thank Him for all we have, or take time to listen to Him? Do we love Jesus so much that we want other people to know Him too? Do we thank Him for the people who love us? Do we ask His Holy Spirit for the courage to spread the gospel? If we are willing to accept the challenge to love God and neighbor, we will not have to worry about breaking laws.

Earlier in this year we celebrated the 20th Anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration in our parish. Sacraments change our lives when we approach them with the awareness that Jesus is coming to us. In every Sacrament Jesus is acting through, with and in the Church to heal and transform the lives of the faithful. In the Eucharist, we receive the Lord into our lives that we might become members of His body. The celebration of the Mass is our most intimate expression of discipleship, and our Risen Lord calls us to communion in the life of the Holy Trinity and in communion with all believers. Time spent with the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration has the power to open our reception of the Lord to deeper and richer experience of communion. We make time for what we love—I invite you to make time for the One who loves us more than anyone.

- ☺ Have a catechist who will be praying and working with parents, striving to be both a good teacher of the course lessons and subject matter, as well as being another adult witness to the beauty and gift of the Catholic faith.
- ☺ Have access to Ignatius Press' *Faith and Life* textbooks that have been recommended by great teachers and leaders in the faith such as Dr. Scott Hahn to be a fitting guide to growth in Christ and in the teachings of the Church.
- ☺ Have access to the Faith and Life text **online**, which includes not only the text, but engaging games, video links and more. While this will be part of the student's homework, it will provide a real tool for parents to utilize as the primary educators of their children in the home. (PSR: The vitamin supplement to the parental meal).

They will be engaged through outstanding media resources, have fun through various activities, learn and read Scripture together, and prepare their hearts and minds for the upcoming Sunday Mass.
- ☺ Get to know Father Tom Miller, their pastor, as he visits the classes frequently, makes himself available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and other liturgical events and more.
- ☺ Be prepared to receive Sacraments worthily, especially in those grades which they will be receiving a Sacrament for the first time.
- ☺ Be tested in their lessons so as to ensure to parents the students are learning the content of the faith lesson. Passing a cumulative test will earn the students a "pass" to the next year, and a wristband to wear as well.
- ☺ Learn in more detail the lives of the saints, these "holy heroes" and models of faith. Each class will have a "patron saint" in which catechists will study their life in more detail and present various aspects of the life and virtue of this particular individual.
- ☺ Take part in several music-led prayerful praise and worship devotional nights by musicians in the parish and beyond increasing gratitude and thanksgiving to God.






