

A Good Day to Die

Do you remember your own baptism? I wish I could; I was baptized as an infant, just a few days old. I envy the adults I have seen baptized at the Easter Vigil. Hopefully, they experience what St. Paul says in the Epistle we hear at the Vigil. For Paul, Baptism is a sign of dying and rising to new life. Sounds like Easter to me. So when Jesus died, He rose from the dead. Is Paul telling us that we will rise from the dead, too?

Yes, but that is not his main point. If all we think about is our physical death, and hope we go to heaven afterwards, we're missing the point. The new life starts with our baptism,

not just our physical death. That's why Paul says things like, "our old self was crucified" or "sinful body done away with...." (Rom 6:6) Baptism gives us a new life NOW. The water is both cleansing and a sign of dying (symbolic drowning) that help us see we are free from sin. We are dead to sin when we begin to live in Christ. The fictional Klingons have a saying "today is a good day to die" to express courage in battle. But real Christians might say that Easter is a good day to die: we have died to sin and begun a new life in Christ.

How do we experience this dying to sin? First, we identify the sinful are-

as of our life. Do I watch movies, video games, or TV shows that encourage promiscuity, lying, revenge, hatred or selfishness? What sins do I confess repeatedly and what can I do to avoid them?

Next we look for ways to act differently: Can I spend more time with friends/relatives who are examples of love? Can I spend less time entertaining myself and more time in prayer? Instead of complaining about what is wrong with the world, can I find ways to make it better? (If not the world, then my community or family.) These are a few of the ways we begin our new life in Christ.

Blessed Easter! Communion—Suffering—Redemption

Dear parishioners,

Those three realities were addressed in the homilies during the Easter Triduum. If you weren't able to attend, I would suggest that you listen to them on-line if you want an idea of my thoughts on these foundational realities. In our life of discipleship we must all come to terms with these truths. Two of the truths are eternal, and one is temporal. Sandwiched between our life of Communion and Redemption is the reality of our personal suffering. It is in suffering, in the trials of life, that we come to know the depth of our faith and the quality of our character. Don't wait for trials to come to deepen faith or strengthen character – do that before the trials come your way. The Good News is that suffering and trials are temporary realities that can lead to personal transformation because of grace. St. Augustine shared these thoughts on the seasons of Lent and Easter:

"Because there are these two periods of time - the one that now is, beset with the trials and troubles of this life, and the other yet to come, a life of everlasting serenity and joy - we are given two liturgical seasons, one before Easter and the other after. The season before Easter signifies the troubles in which we live here and now, while the time after Easter which we are celebrating at present signifies the happiness that will be ours in the future. What we commemorate before Easter is what we experience in this life; what we celebrate after Easter points to something we do not yet possess. This is why we keep the first season with fasting and prayer; but now the fast is over and we devote

the present season to praise. Such is the meaning of the

Alleluia we sing.

"Now therefore, brethren, we urge you to praise God. That is what we are all telling each other when we say Alleluia. You say to your neighbor, 'Praise the Lord!' and he says the same to you. We are all urging one another to praise the Lord, and all thereby doing what each of us urges the other to do. But see that your praise comes from your whole being; in other words, see that you praise God not with your lips and voices alone, but with your minds, your lives and all your actions."

Let us join the angels and saints in praising God for all that He has done for our Redemption and the promises of Eternal Life. May we make these fifty days time of exceptional praise and gratitude to the God who calls us to communion, is with us in our suffering, and has promised us redemption in the life to come.

Our Lady of Grace

The next time you stop by the church office, take a look at our collection of Marian plates that are displayed on the wall. This one is entitled "Our Lady of Grace" and we'd like to tell you a little about this Marian feast.

Let's go back to the year 1830, to a convent of the Daughters of Charity in Paris, France, and a young novice who would later be canonized—Sr. Catherine Laboure. On July 18, in the community's motherhouse, Sr. Catherine beheld a lady seated on the right side of the Sanctuary. When Sr. Catherine approached her, the heavenly visitor pointed to the altar as the source of all consolation.

On November 27, Catherine saw Our Lady standing on a globe, with dazzling rays of light streaming from her outstretched hands. Framing the figure was an inscription: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." Then Mary spoke to Catherine: "Have a medal struck upon this model. Those who wear it will receive great graces, especially if they wear it around the neck."

Use of the Medal spread from country to country and now blankets the world. Everywhere, the Medal is still drawing down from God blessings for body and soul.

Our Lady of Grace (feast day April 4) who gave the Miraculous Medal to Sr. Catherine, brings to the world a message of hope for those who trust in her maternal care.


St. Paul Library / Lighthouse CD Resources

The Case for Christ (Movie)




(From a Review on Amazon) Wow what can I say, this movie was realistic, practical, believable and yet also supernatural. Unlike many Christian films that often have cheesy plots, ideas, or delivery, this movie was the kind of movie that can rock someone, even an unbeliever, to the core. I pray regularly for God to portray His truth on the Big Screen in Hollywood, and lately some gems like this movie have come forth. Such an upgrade from what we have seen many "Christian" movies be in the past. Sure it's based on a true story so that may have helped, but really I believe the execution of the movie was captivating, inspiring and very moving emotionally. It confronts the reality that an "unbeliever" may think they are basing their beliefs on facts, but the reality is they are still having "faith" in many things that they cannot see or prove. So the idea that a believer is the only one having "faith" is a lie. Even someone who believes in God wholeheartedly, and has ministered the gospel to 1000s of lives, I was incredibly inspired, encouraged and motivated to more adequately share the love of Jesus with others after watching this movie. The fact that there is simply so much hard evidence of Christ's death,

burial and resurrection, more so than any other major event in history, should speak volumes to any person who doubt Jesus even existed, let alone was God in the flesh.

The Case for Christ (Book)

Lee Strobel writes in the Introduction to the book regarding one's views about Jesus, "Maybe you too have been basing your spiritual outlook on the evidence ... you... gleaned long ago... But is your conclusion really the best possible explanation for the evidence? If you were to dig deeper... what would you find? That's what this book is about. In effect, I'm going to retrace and expand upon the spiritual journey I took for nearly two years. I'll take you along as I interview thirteen leading scholars and authorities who have impeccable academic credentials." Lee Strobel has written books such as *The Case for Faith, The Case for a Creator, The Case for the Real Jesus, God's Outrageous Claims,*





Join the Holy Father's prayer intentions for April: For Those who have Responsibility in Economic Matters





The month of April is traditionally dedicated to several themes: the Blessed Sacrament / Resurrection / Holy Spirit: Phil Robertson of Duck Dynasty, who is a part time preacher once said about the resurrection. "If you travel back in time from the present to 2000, to 1500, to 1000 to 100 to 0, what event happened....so that now we even mark our time back to this event?" "It must have been something pretty big." Consider mentioning this line to your children and starting a discussion.



Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: The Resurrection of Jesus—Miracle of Miracles



"If Christ has not risen your faith is vain" (1 Cor 15:14).

The text from St. Paul above is enshrined in the Resurrection Mosaic at the Cathedral-Basilica of St. Louis. A priest friend once joked to me that if seated in the bishop's chair, the angle of viewing this mosaic precludes one from seeing the "If" --- thus all that one would read is, "Christ has not risen your faith is vain." Now, where would we if this "if" of the Resurrection never took place? Christianity stands or falls with the historical fact of the Resurrection. There are some really good authors who have written books exploring the facts of the Resurrection. I think of Peter Kreeft, Lee Strobel, Gary Habermas, N.T. Wright and Josh McDowell. Years ago I put together a memory aid that includes some of

the arguments (in very brief form) that these authors have made. I think it can be a helpful summary of background data to this central teaching of the Catholic-Christian faith.

Memory Aid: E.A.S.T.E.R

E-Empty Tomb. This may sound too simplistic at first, but a basic question is, "How do we explain the empty tomb?" It would have been impossible for Jesus' disciples to have believed in their Master's resurrection if his corpse still lay in the tomb. But it is equally incredible to suppose that the disciples could have stolen the body and perpetrated a hoax. Would the corpse of Jesus motivate a band of disciples to preach and die for their belief. Furthermore, it would have been impossible for Christianity to come into being in Jerusalem if Jesus' body were still in the grave. The Jewish authorities would certainly have produced it as the shortest and most complete answer to the whole affair.

A-Appearances of Jesus. How do we explain the testimony, witness and life after the event, of all those who saw, touched, and conversed with the risen Lord? Can one really shake this off as hysteria, mass hallucination? What of Paul who changed the course of world history by his going to the ends of the earth witnessing to his vision of the Risen Lord?

S-Scriptural record. Whether one likes it or not, the miracle of the Resurrection in Scripture is presented as a historical reality. Simon Greenleaf, founder of the Harvard Law School and author of the book *Treatises of the Laws of Evidence*, put the Scriptural record of the Resurrection to the historical test. His verdict? In the affirmative...Christ IS risen, your faith is NOT vain---but solidly established as any fact of ancient history.

T-Transformation of Apostles. It is one thing to say you saw something miraculous; it is another to be willing to die for such a belief. How then do we explain all the apostles and disciples of Christ who were martyred for their witness to the resurrected Christ? The band "Apologetix" sings, "Why O why would someone die if it was just a hoax? Why then take the awful risk to tell us Jesus rose? Simple men from Galilee would not have spoken lies, to get enrolled in history books as martyrs for Jesus Christ."

E-Eyewitness of women. We mentioned the eyewitness testimonies of apostles and disciples to the Risen Christ. Of special mention, however, is the eyewitness testimony of women, who, at the time, would have been a somewhat embarrassing detail for the evangelists to record were it not in fact the truth. The cultural milieu of the first century did not place high emphasis on women's testimony that we take for granted today. Yet here, it is women who serve as primary witnesses to the Resurrected Lord.

R-Rise of Christianity. How do we explain the rise of Christianity? How do we explain the Christian yeast working in the dough of the world apart from its link to Christ? "Christianity without the resurrection is like a car without an engine; it gets you nowhere." If the Resurrection didn't happen it would be a greater miracle to try and explain the history and growth of Christianity.
