

This is a Test

I used to wonder how God could lie to Abraham about sacrificing his son Isaac. But the story begins by telling us God put Abraham to the test. Abraham himself seems to know it's a test—in verses left out of our reading, he tells the servants that he and Isaac will return after the sacrifice: he also tells Isaac that God will provide the offering. Apparently, I'm the only one fooled by God.

I don't know if I would have passed the test. I would have at least argued with God about it, begging him to spare my son. Yet in our second reading, St. Paul reminds us that God did not spare his own son. (Rom 8:32) He passed his own test. Jesus was sacrificed so that God could show us how much he loved us: By dying, Jesus showed us the promise of resurrection, which shows us that we can also have new life by the forgiveness of our sins. If God loves us so much that he gives his Son to die for us, why would he not forgive us? Or as Paul says, if He is on our side, who can hurt us?

What does that tell us about life? You may have noticed that things don't always go your way. We sometimes suffer for no apparent reason. We may lose someone we love through death. We may be tempted to lose faith when we see wars, killer tornados, terrorist attacks—if "God is for us," why does he allow these things? Because he is still testing us.

And not necessarily testing the victims of these troubles. If I get angry at God because I hear about someone's death, I haven't passed the test.

Does that mean those tragedies are our fault? No, God gives everyone free will and some people choose to do wrong. And some accidents are just accidental; no one is necessarily at fault. God intervenes sometimes and lives are saved. Other times, God intervenes by saving us after death with our resurrection. But as long as people doubt God's love, there will be tests. That's why it is so important to proclaim the Kingdom: so that someday all people will know God's love and not need to be tested.



Human Dignity and Race Relations Part 2

Dear Parishioners,



The group that has had the most difficult time assimilating and integrating into the American society has been African Americans. The shadow of slavery has caused a deep wound in our nation. The entire issue of modern slavery was to have a people of a decidedly different ethnicity cast as slaves. It was easy to identify slaves when they looked very different from the rest of society. It was further complicated by a societal view that Africans were either savages or unable to be as civilized as Europeans. Those false views still haunt the thoughts and views of those who easily decide to embrace racist views.

The long history of racism in our nation before and after the Civil War has led to a very slow integration of African-Americans into the main society. Far too often Blacks lived in their own community, as did many other ethic groups of immigrants. But unlike other groups of Europeans who looked like the main society, it was easy to see how Blacks were different because of their coloration. It became very easy for Blacks to be victims of sustained racism because it was so easy to see that they were "not one of us."

Within the black community there are issues that have contributed to the lack of integration and assimilation. The most troubling factor is the breakdown of the modern black family. A society without a family rarely creates or sustains the type of environment where a child can mature and advance as an individual. Difficulties in education becomes another contributing factor. Education is the one thing that helps any individual advance far beyond the life into which they were born. Without sus-

tained parental involvement, the vast majority of children fail to excel in education. Many immigrant groups made tremendous sacrifices so their children could receive a better education in order to advance their life. Many of our successful Blacks followed the same pattern. Key individuals helped them rise above the broken circumstances of their birth to become very successful individuals.


There are those who want to keep the current status quo the permanent one. Blacks who have often managed to assimilate and integrate into society can been seen as "sell-outs," "Uncle Tom's," or "Oreos." Those racist words are often

used by blacks against their fellow blacks because they have become part of "white society." It is meant to be a stigma against them and a warning to others who might be tempted to follow in their steps.

Let us free ourselves of racist attitudes, thoughts, words and behaviors. We want to remember the fundamental respect that we should have for any individual we meet. We are all God's children. We want to judge people by their attitude and character, not by their race. What flows from the heart makes a person good or evil, capable of friendship, or best to be avoided.

Every PSR class has a chosen patron saint which catechists help students learn about. After 8 years, students will have learned more about 8 folks in God's Holy Hall of Fame. Meet the 8th grade patron— St. Vincent Ferrer.

Commissioned by Our Lord Himself to preach His Gospel, St. Vincent began at age 50 an apostolate of preaching that would extend to France, Italy, Spain, Belgium, Switzerland, Austria, Germany and a few other countries as well. Travelling with him were as many as 10,000 people, including at least 50 priests. The throngs that gathered to hear him came from many miles around, such that he was forced to preach in the open--no church being large enough to hold all the people.

SAINTS WHO RAISED THE DE AD

One of greatest miracle workers in the history of the Catholic church was the Dominican priest St. Vincent Ferrer (1350-1419). So great a missionary was St. Vincent Ferrer that he can only be compared to the Twelve Apostles. His accomplishments were incredible and rare in the whole history of the Church; his life story contains one amazing story after another, many of these are documented in the book "St Vincent Ferrer –The Angel of the Judgment" by Father Andrew Pradel, O.P.

When St. Vincent Ferrer was 46 years old, suffering from a grievous illness, Our Lord appeared to him, accompanied by St. Francis and St. Dominic; Our Lord said to Vincent, among other things, "Arise, then, and go to preach against vice; for this have I specially chosen thee. Exhort sinners to repentance, for My judgment is at hand." During this vision St. Vincent was immediately cured.

Two years later, in 1398, he was given permission to begin his apostolate of preaching. St. Vincent travelled all over western Europe preaching penance, attracting enormous crowds, and followed by thousands of disciples. He converted St. Bernardine of Siena and Blessed Margaret of Savoy. Vincent had the gift of languages; preaching in his Valencian idiom he was understood wherever he went; and in conversation he spoke French, Italian, German or English as fluently as his native tongue.

Learning about the many other wonders of St. Vincent makes it easier to accept the accounts of his death-to-life miracles. The Acta Sanctorum records 873 miracles performed by the saint, but there were actually many more. In 1412 Vincent himself told a crowd, "God has wrought in His mercy, through me a miserable sinner, three thousand miracles." After that Vincent lived seven more years, which was a period of even greater miracles.

The Bollandist hagiographers tell of 70 persons who were delivered from diabolical possession by St. Vincent Ferrer. St. Antonius (Antoninus), Archbishop of Florence, another learned Dominican about 30 years old when Vincent died, stated that St. Vincent had raised 28 persons from the dead.

Near Palma of Majorca St. Vincent Ferrer stilled a storm in order to preach from a wharf. At Beziers he stopped a flood. At the gates of Vannes he cured a great number of the sick. At Guerande he delivered a man possessed by the devil and more dead than alive. In France he had the British victors at Caen praying together with the defeated French for a sick man, who was then cured--and all of them, enemies or not, shouted for joy. At Leride he cured a cripple in the presence of the king.

One should note that none of these miracles were performed for mere sensationalism, which the saints despise. They were worked for various good purposes, especially the conversion of sinners and the strengthening of faith. As St. Vincent stated, miracles are worked for the glory of God. This was also stated by Christ at the grave of Lazarus, and to His Apostles. The saints' powers are of course limited by God, to whom all power belongs. Otherwise, with unrestricted powers, the saints could be "as gods." -St Vincent Ferrer, pray for us!




