

Faith or Works?

Sometimes we think the argument of faith vs. works started with the Reformation. But the second reading shows that it was already being debated in New Testament times. The simplified version of the debate has the Reformers saying that faith alone is all we need to be saved, while the Catholic side says we have to do good to be saved. Actually, they are both right.

The idea of works being necessary for salvation probably goes back to the Old Covenant emphasis on the law and the commandments. The Jews believed that keeping the law showed their holiness. They avoided anything or anyone that was un-

clean. They believed that their religious practices set them apart from the pagans around them.

Then Jesus came to show that only God is Holy. Our holiness comes from loving God and loving others. Because Jesus is the Son of God, He is the best way to know God. So believing in Jesus is not just believing that He exists, (like those who believe in Santa Claus or UFO's.) It means we believe in Love, the love Jesus showed by His life and death. We believe in a Person who loves us and showed us that God is not our boss or judge; He is our Father. He gives us life and protects us; He supports us and also lets us learn

from our mistakes. Then He forgives us, showing that He loves us even when we turn away from him.

So if we truly believe in Jesus we believe in what He said and did. We follow His commandment of love, not because we want to avoid evil, but because we love him so much we want to be just like him. We help others, not to make us look good, but to show them how good God is. So you cannot truly believe in Jesus without wanting to help others to know and love him too. Jesus' way of saying that in today's gospel was to take up our cross and follow him. That is truly a work of faith.

Missionary captures more of the true nature of the Church rather than just the human quality of being motivated. We are missionary because we have

great news to share. Just a reminder on the three key words to define our spirit and attitude, our charism, as a parish family.

Informed ~ We want to take responsibility for being informed about our faith and about our world. As I have mentioned in the past we want to become people of desire and discipline in our efforts to grow in our appreciation and appropriation of the faith. The fruits of this joyful struggle will be greater consolation in this life and eternal joy in the next.

Hospitable ~ We are a community that welcomes others. While we may not be able to welcome everyone to join us at the altar, we do welcome any who want to worship with us. We want to welcome any who come to us seeking fellowship in our varied and many communities and activities of our family of faith. Our Welcoming Committee, the IHMformation



Station, and other ministries do a great job in welcoming others to the life of our parish family.

Missionary ~ The real fruit of desire and discipline is to transform our personal faith into shared personal faith. We are not proclaiming perfect faith or discipleship (we all grow tired and struggle against our personal sinfulness), but we are striving to be missionary in our love for God and neighbor. We should constantly ask

the Holy Spirit to grant us greater clarity and courage in sharing our faith and witnessing to our life of discipleship. It is not easy to witness to the faith, to share our story, but like all things, the more we do it, the more natural it becomes. Only by having a first time, can we ever hope to have a second or third time to share the joy of our faith. Our God has an immense desire to pour His very life and love into our hearts. He wants to make us overflowing vessels of His love and truth. When we allow that to happen, the miraculous and amazing has the possibility of unfolding in our very midst. Moments of clarity and courage are great, but they are not meant to be rare and seldom experienced. Moments of clarity and courage are meant to lead to a lifetime of deepening clarity and joyful commitment to the Gospel.





Mysteries, Marvels and Miracles in the Life of the Church: The Blood Phenomenon- Miracle? of Saint Januarius Feast Day: September 19

St. Januarius was a bishop in Italy during the early 300s and was martyred during Emperor Diocletion's persecution. What is believed to be Januarius' blood is kept in Naples, as a relic. During St. Januarius' feast day the relic is carried in procession and has frequently liquefied, a phenomenon that has baffled scientists and onlookers since being noted in the 1300s to this day. The day I saw a saint's blood become liquid

A resident in Rome, I decided, along with some friends, to take the train down to Naples for the feast of St Januarius. And so we went. The Mass happens in the evening, and after an agreeable day's sightseeing, we were in the cathedral in good time, first to visit the side chapel where the relic is kept in some splendor, and then to stand as close to the sanctuary as possible.



The Mass was very long, and the cardinal's sermon very dull indeed, but the congregation sat or stood throughout with great patience. Then the tension rose visibly at the end

of the Mass when the cardinal took the relic from its place and held it up; he turned it one way and then the other; it was clear for all to see that the contents of the glass ampoule were solid and blackish in color. Several times the cardinal did this, each time with a look of disappointment on his face; and several times the congregation renewed its prayers to the saint. The ampoule was suspended round the cardinal's neck by a cord, to prevent it being dropped.

Eventually the cardinal said: "Shall we come back tomorrow, or shall we pray some more?" "Let us pray!" shouted a voice from the congregation. And pray we did. Once more the cardinal twiddled the ampoule, then let it rest from

its cord. He announced in a sad voice that clearly the marvel was not going to happen this evening; perhaps tomorrow, perhaps next week; but people should not be disappointed, we could all come back another day...

At this moment I despaired. I had come all the way from Rome; I would not be able to be there tomorrow. So at that moment, I prayed. I prayed as I had never done before in my life, or perhaps since. The cardinal's voice droned on... Then suddenly there was a cry "E fatto!" ("It's happened!") followed by a huge shout from the congregation which numbered several thousand. The cardinal, his face lit up by surprise and joy, now turned the ampoule round again and again, showing off the silky red liquid that had replaced the black gum of a moment before. The little man



in a tailcoat waved his handkerchief ecstatically, the traditional signal that the marvel had happened.

For about a quarter of an hour the cathedral was a seething mass of shouting and applauding people. When we had all calmed down somewhat the cardinal spoke again. The marvel of the liquefaction of St Januarius, he said, proved that we were all equal: then the line formed to kiss the relic – first the mayor and the political figures, then the various sprigs of Naples' now defunct reigning house, the Bourbons of the Two Sicilies, then the rest of us.

Afterwards, our train to Rome was delayed by several hours (this sometimes happens in Italy, whatever they say about trains running on time). But nothing could dampen our spirits. Ten years have passed, but St Januarius remains one of my favorite saints, and Naples remains my favorite Italian city.


