He Alone is Lord

In the scriptures, being anointed usually meant you were a prophet or king of Israel. Anointing was a sign that God had chosen you for that job. But it was almost unheard of to call a king from another country anointed. So why is Cyrus given that title? Cyrus was king of Persia when the Babylonians held the people of Israel captive. God used him to defeat the Babylonians and eventually bring the Israelites back to their homes.

In our first reading, we hear the Lord's words to Cyrus about God's plan for Israel. Notice that God is in charge: telling Cyrus what God will

do, making other kings run from him, opening doors or gates that might have blocked Cyrus' armies—all for a king who doesn't even know God. Cyrus only knew the Persian gods. That is why the reading says several times that there is no God but the LORD.

One thing this tells us is that God can work through anyone, not just saints and religious. Any time someone does a good deed, God is behind it. Just as God used Cyrus to free the Israelites from their Babylonian captivity, God can use governments to pro-

tect the poor, to help rebuild after disasters, to defend freedom.

In that sense, we can understand what Jesus says about payment to Caesar and to God. Since everything belongs to God, that should be our first allegiance. When a government does not protect the weakest or the rights of the poor, it should be accountable. But when God works through governments, we can give some support to them by such activities as voting, or paying taxes. Let us ask God to work through us also, helping us to proclaim that God alone is LORD.

The Surprisingly Catholic Origins of Halloween

When most people think of Halloween, the first images that come to mind are children dressed up in scary costumes going door-to-door to collect candy from as many houses as possible. At the end of the night delighted kids empty their "loot" on the floor and begin the feasting that often ends up with a stomachache and a trip to the dentist not long after.

What it evolved into in the United States, however, is not how Halloween began.

The word "Halloween" is a Scottish shortening of the phrase "Allhallow-even," literally meaning "All Holy Evening" and dates to the 18th century. The English have a similar phrase, "All Hallows' Eve," with the same meaning. Both words denote the night before All Saints Day, November 1, and refer to the celebration of the holy men and women who are recognized in the Catholic Church as residing in Heaven.

Pope Gregory III established the feast during the 8th century after consecrating a chapel named in honor of "All Saints" in Saint Peter's Basilica. The feast was then extended to the universal Church by Pope Gregory IV and made into a holy day of obligation for all Catholics.

Along with its celebration, All Saints Day was given a special vigil Mass the night before (October 31), which led to that date being regarded by Catholics as a "holy evening."

In addition to All Saints Day, the Church established November 2 as All Souls Day, dedicated to praying for the souls in purgatory. On this day Catholics pray for their deceased relatives and friends, visiting cemeteries to remember those who are no longer on this earth. It is with this celebration that many local traditions were created and became mingled with the festivities of All Hallows' Eve when immigrants started establishing themselves in the United States.

In various cultures in Europe there developed a tradition of "souling" and baking "soul cakes" in honor of the faithful departed. These cakes were baked on All Hallows' Eve and children would go out on All Saints Day and All Souls Day, beg-

ing door-to-door for these cakes in exchange for praying for deceased relatives and friends.

It is believed that in some places there was a tradition of wearing disguises while souling that represented the various souls in purgatory who were seeking these prayers. And of course, the processional candles were carried sheltered from the wind in hollowed-out gourds or turnips, call Jack O'Lanterns.

In France, the faithful created a *danse macabre* or "dance of the dead" that consisted of a representation of Death (typically a skeleton) leading a chain of individuals to the afterlife. The scene would often be brought to life on All Souls Day, where actors would put on costumes representing the different people in the chain.

According to some accounts, Irish peasants developed an "All Damned Day" on October 31 to complement the All Saints and All Souls Day. The theory is that "if the souls in hell are left out when we celebrate those in heaven and purgatory, they might be unhappy enough to cause trouble." The Irish then banged pots and pans on October 31 to make sure those in Hell knew they were not forgotten.

All of these different traditions revolving around All Saints and All Souls were mixed together in the United States when immigrants started to intermarry and combine customs. The celebration of Halloween spread throughout the country during the early 20th century and quickly became a secular community activity that was devoid of its Christian origins.

Businesses then recognized the profitability of the holiday and started to promote it in their advertisements, taking over the day in a similar way to the celebration of Christmas.

In the end, while the current activities of Halloween appear to have no Christian significance, they have deep Catholic roots and are meant to remind people of their own mortality and the need to pray for souls in purgatory.

Many professional beekeepers tend their beehives without putting on special veils or clothing. How do they avoid being stung? Their technique is simple. We see him do that in today's reading. To what extent do I try to remain cool and in control when others attack me—even unfairly?





Items from the Lighthouse CD rack are located and available in the Narthex.



HHS to define human life as “beginning at conception”

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) released a draft of its new strategic plan for 2018-2022, and with the addition of a few small words, it's clear that there is a major change.

Formerly, the document stated the following in its introductory information:

HHS accomplishes its mission through programs and initiatives that cover a wide spectrum of activities, serving Americans at every stage of life.

The new edition now states this:

HHS accomplishes its mission through programs and initiatives that cover a wide spectrum of activities, serving **and protecting** Americans at every stage of life, **beginning at conception**.

The change might be five little words, but its meaning is deep. It signifies the HHS knows and accepts the truth, that life begins at conception (fertilization). Pro-life activists have said it for decades, scientists have proved it, and abortion supporters have denied and flat-out ignored it, but it's true: life begins the moment a new human life is created—at fertilization. HHS is committed to protecting those lives.

What's your Catholic IQ?

It is the 25th anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, under (now saint) Pope John Paul II, who wrote, “The Catechism is offered to every individual who asks us to give an account of the hope that is in us (cf. 1 Pet 3:15) and who wants to know what the Catholic Church believes.” Every adult Catholic is asked to prayerfully “digest” the Catechism. These questions (which will cover the whole CCC during this year) can help break it down in small bites.



1. The 1992 CCC's introduction *Fidei Depositum* was written by this Pope.
2. The CCC aims at presenting an organic synthesis of Catholic doctrine in light of this Council.
3. The Commission entrusted with the task of preparing a draft of the Catechism was chaired by this Cardinal and future Pope.
4. The mission which the Lord entrusted to the Church to fulfill in every age is to guard this deposit.
5. The CCC is a sure norm of Catholic teaching and is offered to everyone who asks to give an account of the _____ that is in us (1 Peter 3:15).
6. God, infinitely perfect and blessed in Himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in His own blessed _____.
7. So that the call of the Gospel should resound throughout the whole world, Christ sent forth these men whom He had chosen.
8. The name given to the totality of the Church's efforts to make and educate them.
9. This Council in 1545 gave catechesis priority in its constitutions and decrees and from it came the Roman Catechism.
10. The plan of the CCC is built on four pillars: Sacraments, Apostles Creed, Lord's Prayer and this.




