

### MANIFESTING THE SPIRIT

The Christmas season closes this Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. This feast is a sister to last week's feast of the Epiphany. Each of them celebrates an "epiphany," or a manifestation of the Spirit of God in Jesus—first in his birth, and now at his baptism.

The divine Spirit is manifested in all of the scriptures for this feast. Psalm 104 highlights the Spirit of God creating and renewing the earth, while the reading from Isaiah describes God restoring Israel. In Luke's account of the baptism of the Lord the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus. And the letter to Titus reminds us that the Holy Spirit was "richly poured out" on us also, through the "bath of rebirth" (Titus 3:5, 6).



# The Corporal Work of Mercy: Clothe the Naked

Pope Francis has decreed a special year of mercy (beginning December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016) in which he is directing the faithful to reflect and act on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. He writes, "It is my burning desire that, during this Jubilee, the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy." Here are some Scriptures and concrete ways or suggestions you or your family might reflect and act up this work of mercy.

## SCRIPTURE PASSAGES

**Mt 25:35, 40** "For I was naked and you clothed me." 40... 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.'

Luke 3:10 And the multitudes asked (John the Baptist), "What then shall we do?" 11 And he answered them, "He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise."

James 2:14 What does it profit, my brethren, if a man says he has faith but has not works? Can his faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister is ill-clad and in lack of daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit? 17 So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

#### **SUGGESTIONS**

- ♦ Start with going through closets and finding clothing to donate to the needy. Can I simplify my wardrobe? How many pairs of shoes do I own? Can I donate more than my excess?
- Consider volunteering, working with, donating clothes and shoes to a local thrift store or a clothes collection bin.

- ♦ Organize a parish group to make trips to the city to pass out clothing to the poor.

- ♦ How about helping out at home with the laundry?
- ♦ Learn about the prayer shawl ministry. <a href="http://www.shawlministry.com">http://www.shawlministry.com</a> Consider knitting such a garment for someone.
- Say family meal prayers with more gratitude. Have members ask, in their own way, for God's protection and blessing for all those who will go to bed cold or lonely.

### Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - Baptism

In today's Gospel, we heard about John the Baptist and the Baptism of Christ. Baptism takes away original sin, all personal sins and all punishment due to sin (Compendium, 263). The Church teaches that a baptized person belongs forever to Christ. After His Resurrection, Christ commanded His Apostles: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt 28:19). 

Items from the <u>Lighthouse CD rack</u> are located and available in the <u>Narthex</u>.


### From the Parish Library: Grand Hall (lower level Church)

### From the Parish Library: Grand Hall (lower level Church)







The momentous third and final volume in the Pope's international bestselling Jesus of Nazareth series, detailing how the stories of Jesus' infancy and childhood are as relevant today as they were two thousand years ago.

In 2007, Joseph Ratzinger published his first book as Pope Benedict XVI in order "to make known the figure and message of Jesus." Now, the Pope focuses ex-

clusively on the Gospel accounts of Jesus' life as a child. The root of these stories is the experience of hope found in the birth of Jesus and the affirmations of surrender and service embodied in his parents, Joseph and Mary. This is a story of longing and seeking, as demonstrated by the Magi searching for the redemption offered by the birth of a new king. It is a story of sacrifice and trusting completely in the wisdom of God as seen in the faith of Simeon, the just and devout man of Jerusalem, when he is in the presence of the Christ child. Ultimately, Jesus' life and message is a story for today, one that speaks to the restlessness of the human heart searching for the sole truth which alone leads to profound joy.

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Fittingly, this Jubilee Year of Mercy is also the Lectionary's Year of Luke, for Luke's Gospel highlights God's mercy in finding the lost, healing the sick, restoring the broken, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving the sinner through Jesus' ministry. But before doing, Luke's Jesus is always praying. As practical moderns programmed to measure worth by productivity, we instinctively appreciate the Jubilee's call to embrace the practical challenges of our baptism. But today Luke focuses not on Jesus being baptized, but on Jesus praying after baptism. So must we pray to become the disciples we are called to be, that the Spirit empower us to do what disciples are called to do. Imitating Jesus' openness to the Spirit will enable us to cooperate with the grace that transforms us into "beloved sons [and daughters] . . . in whom the Father is well pleased," living out, in this Jubilee Year of Mercy, the extraordinary potential of our baptism.
