## ADIOS, NAVIDAD!

Dear parishioners,

As we conclude our Christmas celebrations this Sunday on this Feast of the Baptism of the Lord we want to remember our own baptism into Christ. For most of us there are no memories to associate with our baptism. We were infants and we may have seen the pictures but that's about it. If by chance you were baptized later in life you may have some memories of that day. Either way, most of us have probably spent too little time pondering this life- changing event.

Baptism is the game changer, or to be more precise the creature changer. We go from being a human being created out of love to a son or daughter adopted into the life and love of the Holy Trinity. How frequently I forget that I am a Beloved Son of the Father. I am far too prone to see Our Father as just a more grandiose version of my earthly father. While one can hope that a good earthly father will lead to a connection with Our Father, that is not always the case. Even the best of fathers on this side of reality are flawed by sin and marred by personal quirks. For many people a flawed relationship with their natural dad makes it all the more difficult to relate to the Supernatural One. Often times there is a certain amount of healing and understanding that must occur before one can comfortably approach God as Our Father.

How many of us are still tempted to think that our relationship with God the Father is one of trying to earn His approval, avoid His punishment or show Him our worthiness? The Father loves me more than I will ever realize. His approval of me is completely independent of me earning His favor or avoiding His wrath. He approves of me because He is the very source of life, love and communion. That doesn't mean that He doesn't have a choice or that it is impossible for Him not to love me, but rather that His love is intensely personal. So intensely personal is that love that the Son is eternally begotten of it and the Holy Spirit is the bond of that unending love. His love invites me to trust and challenges me to grow.

As we enter into Ordinary time I pray that we will realize the Father's blessing that we received at Baptism, that we will trust the Son enough to follow Him faithfully as His disciples and finally that we will be joyful partners with the Holy Spirit in proclaiming our faith.

Consider how one ought to reverence the name of Jesus, especially during Mass, when the Church asks that we give a small head bow when the Lord's name is said.

As we prepare for the year devoted to prayer, which will begin January 2015, it is important to reflect on the importance of prayer in our spiritual lives. The most dominant quality of Dynamic Catholics is a daily routine of prayer. In the year of prayer, I encourage you to pray more, to go to Mass more, to participate in the sacraments more, and to make significant and lasting spiritual progress.

The possibilities are awe-inspiring. When we walk with Christ, we have the potential not only to transform ourselves and our parishes, but to change the world. Yet, only 7% of Catholics are truly Dynamic Catholics. What if we doubled this percentage in our parishes and in the Archdiocese of St. Louis? What if we tripled it?

If you are already a Dynamic Catholic, I hope you will continue to bring the light of Christ to others. If you are not yet a Dynamic Catholic, this plan, read together with my book The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic, provides a roadmap for spiritual development.

Your shepherd, Archbishop Carlson, has a vision for Catholic renewal, as he makes clear in his pastoral letter on evangelization: "It is time for a new springtime of holiness and evangelization in the Archdiocese of St. Louis." Dynamic Catholic, Alive! has the potential to position the Archdiocese of St. Louis at the vanguard of Catholic renewal in the United States.

God has incredible plans for each and every one of us. He wants us all to become the best-versionsof-ourselves. But great things have to be sought with intentionality. Our team at Dynamic Catholic is excited about Dynamic Catholic, Alive! and the tremendous possibilities within your reach. We look forward to travelling with you on this journey.
