### **MEDITATION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL**

### Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. (John 8:6)

This is the only passage in scripture where Jesus is said to have written anything. Patristic authors suggest that Jesus was invoking Jeremiah 17:13 "Lord, on whom Israel's hope is fixed, all who reject you will be inscribed in the dust, for they have rejected the source of living water, the Lord." A later manuscript, the Armenian, translates the passage this way: "He himself, bowing his head, was writing with his finger on the earth to declare their sins; and they

were seeing their several sins on the stones." The suggestion is that Jesus was writing in the dust the sins of the very men who were accusing the woman. There may be something in that. The normal Greek word for to write is graphein; but here the word used is katagraphein, which can mean to write down a record against someone.

### How to Make an Act of Contrition

### Excerpts from the "How-To Book of Catholic Devotions"

There are many ways to say you're sorry. Any way you express your sorrow to God is called an Act of Contrition. There are several set prayers called by this name. These are the expressions of sorrow that have been most revered by Catholics through history. The Council of Trent defined contrition as "sorrow of heart and detestation for sin committed, with the

resolution not to sin again." Contrition includes, at once, a sorrow for sin, a hatred of sin, and a firm re-

solve to sin no more.

Contrition can be perfect that is, arising from a love of God. Contrition can also be "imperfect," which means it arises either from a revulsion for the sin or from a fear of punishment. Both forms of contrition are acceptable preludes to sacramental confession.

When we pray an Act of Contrition, there are several principles that we should consider. First, contrition must be interior. In other words, to say the words mechanically with no inner conviction is ineffective. The words of the prayer must reflect the movement of the heart and the will to sorrow and conversion. We need not feel strong emotion, though contrition may include an emotional component. Also, we need to acknowledge that contrition is supernatural. It is prompted by the grace of God. If someone is sorry for getting drunk simply because the vodka gave him a headache, he is not experiencing true contrition, because his sorrow has a totally natural basis. Our contrition also needs to be universal. Our sorrow must not be selective. We need to repent of all mortal sins that we are aware of. We can't be sorry for only some, because all mortal sins sever our relationship with God. Restoration depends on our true contrition. The final element of contrition is a "purpose of amendment." As one prayer of contrition states: we firmly resolve, with the help of God's grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. This resolve includes not only the sin itself but also those situations that generally lead us to commit the sin. For example, imagine that almost every time you go to a bar with a certain group of people, you end up getting drunk. Then you have to conclude that going to a bar with those individuals is a "near occasion of sin." Thus, it's not enough to want to avoid the sin. We must also plan to avoid the occasions of sin. Certain people, places, and things can be occasions of sin for us. Bad company should be avoided. Certain movies, books, television programs, video games, and internet sites can be occasions of sin. True contrition would resolve to avoid such sources of temptation.

#### **Hold That Thought**

It is a good practice to examine your conscience every night and to end with an Act of Contrition. During the day when you are conscious of committing a venial sin, make a quick, sincere Act of Contrition that acknowledges the sin, ask for forgiveness and for strength to avoid the sin the next time.

#### A Broken and Contrite Heart...

"So all divines and saints, dealing with contrition and sorrow for sin, advise penitents who are disconsolate because, taking into account the gravity of mortal sins, they cannot burst into tears nor feel in themselves that sensible grief that they would have wished, so that their very hearts should have broken with grief. They tell them, true contrition and sorrow for sin is not in the sensitive appetite, but in the will. Be grieved for having sinned because it is an offense against God, worthy of being loved above all things, for that is true contrition. As for that feeling, when the Lord gives it, receive it gratefully; but when He does not, be not distressed... - Alphonsus Rodriguez

Traditional Act of Contrition (For daily examination): O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of Hell, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, Who art allgood and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

Traditional Act of Contrition (During the Sacrament of Confession): O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You. I detest all my sins because of Your just punishments. But most of all because they offend You, my God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Your grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

b) The Easter Sequence is an ancient poem that summarizes the story of the Resurrection and is an integral part of the Easter Sunday liturgy. It also may be used at daily Mass during the Octave of Easter.
d) Readings from the Acts of the Apostles provide us with a sense of the enthusiasm that the early Church had for proclaiming

the Risen Christ to others. **3. a)** The refrain, "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad!" is taken from Psalm 118 and is the Responsorial Psalm for Easter Sunday.

**4. c)** During the Easter Season, it is common for the priest to invite us to renew our baptismal promises after the homily. This is done in place of the Profession of Faith (the Creed) since, in renewing our baptismal promises, we profess our faith in the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit, and the Church.

**5. d)** On December 8, 2010, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Bishop David Ricken announced that he officially approved the Marian apparitions (in 1859 to Adele Brise, a young Belgian immigrant) at the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help at Champion in the Diocese of Green Bay, Wisconsin.

**6.** a) The story of the selection of Matthias as Judas' replacement is found in the Acts of the Apostles 1:15-26. The feast day of St. Matthias, Apostle, is celebrated on May 14.

**7. c)** For almost 70 years (1309-1378), the papacy resided in Avignon, France, as a result of a conflict between the papacy and the French crown. In all, seven popes reigned from Avignon until Catherine of Siena persuaded Pope Gregory XI to return the papacy to Rome.

**8.** a) Saint Paul wrote about the centrality of the Resurrection for our faith in his First Letter to the Corinthians 15:17, reminding us that, without the Resurrection, his preaching and our faith are in vain.

**9.** c) The laying on of hands is part of the Sacraments of Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick, and Holy Orders.

**10. b)** Saint Paul used the word justification to talk about what faith in Jesus Christ does for us, bringing us into right relationship with God. (See Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1987-1989.) *From Catechist Magazine*

Our Lady of Fatima Promised all the Graces Necessary for Heaven if a Catholic Finished the Five First Saturdays Devotion

"Whether the world has war or peace depends on the practice of this devotion, along with the consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is why I desire its propagation so ardently, especially because this is also the will of our dear Mother in Heaven." - Sr. Lucy (March 19, 1939)

During her July 13 apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to Lucia, "*I shall come to ask.....that on the First Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world.*" On December 10, 1925 Our Lady completed her request for the Five First Saturdays and gave her great promise.

"...Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of five successive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary."
