

A virtue, as opposed to a vice, is a habitual and firm disposition (quality, or condition) to do the good. Virtues can be *human* or *theological*. The 4 principal (cardinal) virtues are *prudence*, *justice*, *fortitude*, and *temperance*. The theological virtues are *faith*, *hope*, and *charity*. Are you cultivating virtue in your life? Is there a particular vice that you struggle with? "The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God" (St. Gregory of Nyssa). archstl.org/dynamic

We ended our regular 2014-2015 IHM school religion program on May 7 with a May crowning followed by an ice cream social. We give thanks to God for all that has been passed down in faith and practice through this year, and we thank our catechists for being a part of that as well. On Thursday, May 14 Archbishop Robert Carlson crowned the year by coming to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation for our 8th grade students. Teach them Holy Spirit, to learn to unwrap the gifts you have placed in their souls.



Top Ten List: Fr. Tom gave a homily in which he listed the "top ten" spiritual priorities that all of us are called to prayerfully put in place. This week we look at # 1.

1. Go to Mass every Sunday & Holy Day of Obligation 2. Make more frequent Confessions, at least quarterly. 3. Pray with Sacred Scripture as part of your daily activities. 4. Develop a daily habit of examining your conscience. 5. Pray the Rosary weekly if not daily. 6. Be generous with your blessings through charities and tithing. 7. Give of your time to the faith on the parish level or within the local Catholic community. 8. Continue to form yourself in learning as a disciple of Christ. 9. Examine your conversations. Are we criticizing or complaining more than we are praying? 10. Go to Mass more than once a week and find time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

1. Go to Mass every Sunday & Holy Day of Obligation

Fr. Tom prefaced these ten priorities by stating, "If there is only 1,2,3..etc things you do as a Catholic..." And at the top of the list, "If there is only one thing you do as a Catholic, go to Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation." The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for

a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin. (2181)



Archbishop Robert Carlson made a firm statement in the St. Louis Review about this very topic: "I'm not going to sugar coat the truth. Too many Catholics ignore their solemn obligation to attend Mass every Sunday. Parents who fail to bring their children to Mass on the Lord's Day sin twice — by failing in their Sunday obligation and by being a source of scandal for their children. This is a serious problem for individuals, families, parish communities and for the whole Church. Sunday Mass is not optional. It is an essential requirement for all of us, and unless we have a serious reason, there is simply no excuse for missing Mass on the Lord's Day. If through your own

fault you miss Mass on Sunday, you are committing a serious sin. You should not receive Holy Communion until you have gone to confession. ... It is here that we are fed with the Bread of Life. It is here that we prepare ourselves for discipleship and service during the coming week. If we fail to worship God on the Lord's Day, we betray our baptismal promises and we neglect our responsibilities as disciples and as stewards of the mysteries of God. What could be more important than being with the Lord, and with our parish family, on the first day of each week? Surely our excuses fail miserably when compared to the opportunity to hear God's Word proclaimed and to receive Christ's gift of Himself in the Eucharist! Too many of us are letting the precious gift of faith slip through our fingers by our lazy and sinful ways — missing Mass regularly and excusing ourselves for reasons that are unworthy of faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. Wake up, brothers and sisters! Our salvation is at stake, and the evil one is only too happy to entice us down a path that leads to hell."




From the library


