

#### MEDITATION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

Mark 14:12

On the night of the Last Supper, as in the embrace following a wedding feast, Jesus gave His Bride, the Church, Himself-"This is My Body." Fulfilling all the "types" of the Old Testament, particularly the Passover meal, our Lord united Himself to us by way of a Communion meal, leading us out of the slavery from sin. Think of these "types" of the Eucharist in the OT and how Jesus has fulfilled them: The tree of life; The offering of Abel; The offering of Isaac; The offering of Melchizedek; The offering of the Firstborn / Passover Lamb; The Manna in the Desert.


If someone charted all my words and actions over a period of a month, would their report give much evidence that I truly believed in the Eucharist?

# Become what you received

Dear parishioners,

As we celebrate the Solemn Feast of Corpus Christi, I recall the words of St. Augustine to the faithful of Hippo: "Become what you have received." That simple phrase is such an immense invitation and challenge to all of us. You and I have been invited not only to praise the Living God, to offer our worship, service and sacrifice but also to receive Him in the mystery of The Sacrament. Hard to believe we are privileged to touch the Savior of the Universe, to consume the Eternal Word of God, to experience communion with Jesus Christ.





Many don't believe in the mystery of the Eucharist. Perhaps they have never attempted to understand the mystery, or perhaps they have an incomplete or unexplored faith. It does take some effort to grow in anything, and faith takes more effort than other self-evident endeavors. To sustain a relationship with persons with whom you cannot relate on a sensory level is the most challenging of relationships. We have to constantly cultivate a religious awareness that is something akin to imagination except that we are seeking the ultimate reality. We are brushing up against things too great for our limited grasp, but we have been invited to ask, seek and knock. Even more amazing is that we believe that God has given us the Church to help us in this lifelong adventure. It is so hard to love God because we cannot see Him and so hard to love our neighbor because we can.

God help us! And He has.


"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Those are the most honest words I speak every day. I hope they are for you as well. We are not

worthy, not now, not ever. But praise be to God for His grace and mercy that give us the freedom to approach Him with confidence and courage. Even more startling are the words of St. Augustine — to become like the One we receive. "Amen" is just the beginning of our response to Jesus. Imitating His life is the goal set for all of us who are sincere about discipleship.

We are not perfect and we never proclaim our perfection, but we do proclaim One who is perfect and calls us to discipleship. We want to invite others to know the Living and Loving Lord, to begin the amazing adventure of faith and conversion. We know we will sin, fail and falter along the way. But God has given us His Son and the Church to forgive our sins, to lift us up from our failings and to steady us along the way.

"Behold the Lamb of God, Behold Him who takes away the sins of the world, blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb." Those words always make me pause in awe and wonder.

We are so blessed.

In this Archdiocesan "Year of Prayer" here is the first of some ways parents can help teach their children to pray. 1. **Teach the five-finger method**. This approach to prayer may help your child become comfortable with praying. It includes five steps: give praise, give thanks, make a request for another person, ask for forgiveness, and make a request for yourself.




# Top Ten List: Fr. Tom gave a homily in which he listed the "top ten" spiritual priorities that all of us are called to prayerfully put in place. This week we look at # 3.

1. Go to Mass every Sunday & Holy Day of Obligation 2. Make more frequent Confessions, at least quarterly. 3. Pray with Sacred Scripture as part of your daily activities. 4. Develop a daily habit of examining your conscience. 5. Pray the Rosary weekly if not daily. 6. Be generous with your blessings through charities and tithing. 7. Give of your time to the faith on the parish level or within the local Catholic community. 8. Continue to form yourself in learning as a disciple of Christ. 9. Examine your conversations. Are we criticizing or complaining more than we are praying? 10. Go to Mass more than once a week and find time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

## Develop a daily habit of examining your conscience.

What this basically means is at some point during the day, typically at the end of the day before you go to bed (or are in bed) reflect upon your blessings and ask forgiveness for your sins. This is a brief renewal of your commitment to try and follow Christ faithfully tomorrow.

This can be a general renewal, or you can formulate some kind of a specific resolution, e.g. "Lord, tomorrow, with your help, I don't want to gossip during our lunch, so please help me



to change the subject when it starts, or at least give me the strength and wisdom to know how to respond." Then follow with an act of contrition telling God you are sorry for your sins. This doesn't have to be a formal act of contrition (you can use your own words), but sometimes it helps to use a simple formula. For example, you can use the act of contrition utilized at the end of confession, or the "I confess to almighty God..." prayer we utilize at the beginning of Mass. This may seem like an incredibly complicated way to spend five minutes. But in reality it isn't. You will find your own rhythm, and the Holy Spirit will help you. The important thing is to make this examination of conscience a staple of your daily diet. If you find it hard at first because your mind is racing, you may want to try doing it in writing: a) write down two specific things you are thanking for from the day; b) write down one thing about your behavior from the day that you would change if you could go back in time; c) write down a petition for the grace to follow Christ faithfully tomorrow. The goal is to keep the voice of conscience, where God dwells within, attentive and awake as we strive to know him more clearly, follow him more nearly, and love him more dearly.





#### **ANSWERS TO CATHOLIC IQ**

- **1. d).** Para. 1324: The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (LG 11). "
- **2. b).** Para. 1329: "The Breaking of Bread, because Jesus used this rite, part of a Jewish meal...above all at the Last Supper. It is by this action that his disciples will recognize him after his Resurrection and it is this expression that the first Christians will use to designate their Eucharistic assemblies..."
- **3. True.** Para. 1337: "In order to leave them a pledge of this love...he instituted the Eucharist as the memorial of his death and Resurrection... 'thereby he constituted them priests of the New Testament.""
- **4. e).** Para. 1363: "In the sense of Sacred Scripture the memorial is not merely the recollection of past events but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become in a certain way present and real. This is how Israel understands its liberation from Egypt: every time Passover is celebrated, the Exodus events are made present to the memory of believers so that they may conform their lives to them."
- **5.** Para. 1406: Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; . . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . . abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6:51, 54, 56).
- **6. False.** Para. 1411: Only validly ordained priests can preside at the Eucharist and consecrate the bread and the wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord.
- **7.** Para. 1333: . . . The Church sees in the gesture of the priest-king **Melchizedek**, who "brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering" (Gen 14:18; cf. Roman Missal, EP I [Roman Canon] 95).
- **8. c and e**. Para. 1413: "Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity."


