His international fame won him special government favors, including such things as a Mercedes-- unheard of in Communist countries. Then in 1981 he decided to turn his back on Communism and seek a free life in the West. When the "zero hour" for leaving came, Bela did not look back at his state favors, his Mercedes, and his celebrity status. He simply walked straight ahead, carrying only a small suitcase. Bela Karolyi is a fitting image of the kind of follower Jesus had in mind. How closely do I mirror that image?

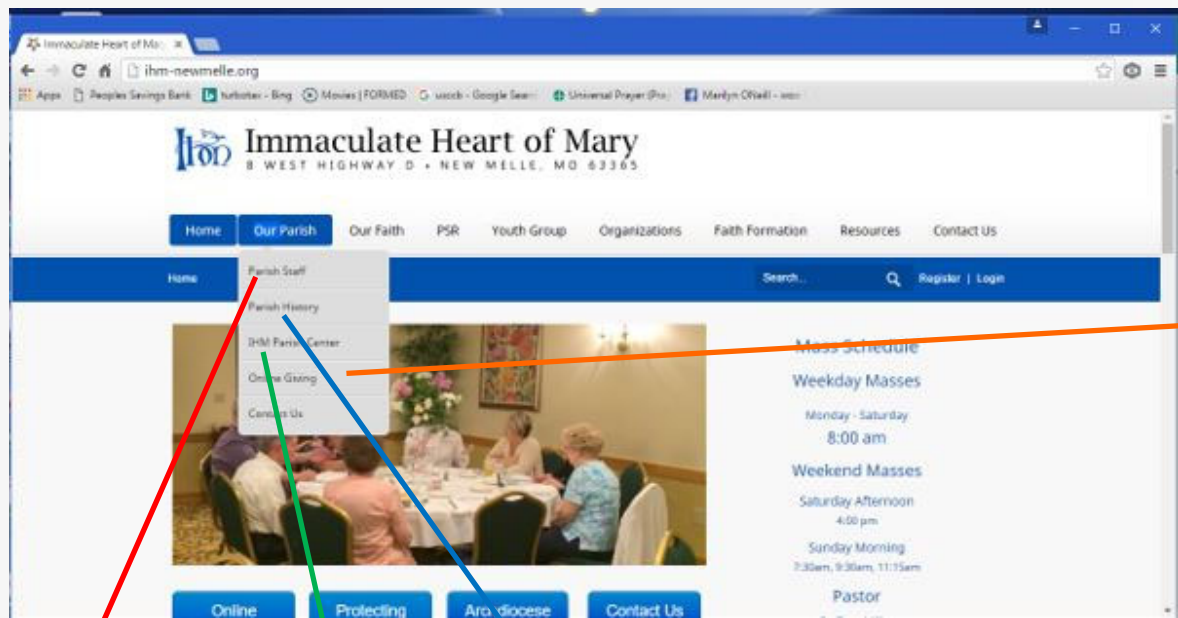

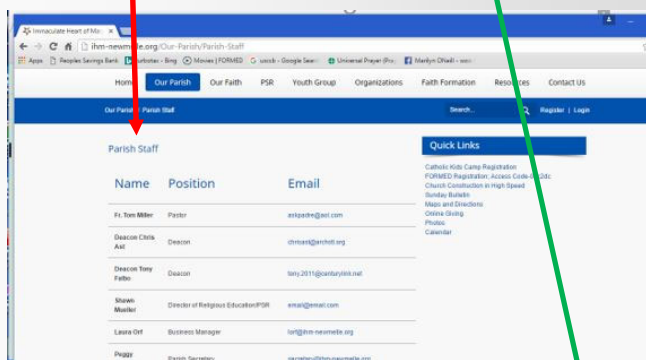

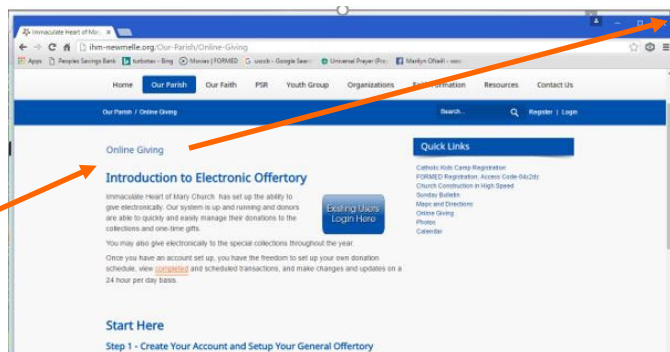

1. **b)** The central doctrines of the Christian faith can be found in the Apostles' and the Nicene Creeds.
2. **c)** "God has willed that, after him, we should honor our parents to whom we owe life and who have handed on to us the knowledge of God" (CCC, n. 2197).
3. **d)** Jesus and his first followers were Jews. Decades after Jesus ascended to the Father, his followers were first called "Christians" in Antioch (see Acts 11:26).
4. **True.** Blessed John Paul II invited North, Central, and South Americans to devote themselves to Our Lady of Guadalupe, who has been honored in Mexico since the 1500s for her motherly care for the native Mexican people. Her feast day is December 12.
5. **a)** All the cardinals from around the world who are younger than 80 years old meet in the Sistine Chapel and elect the next pope (see Code of Canon Law, n. 349).
6. **c)** Attributed to St. Dominic, the Rosary includes 53 Hail Mary prayers, each one asking for Mary to "pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death."
7. **b)** Each cathedral includes the seat (the cathedra) of the bishop (or archbishop) which symbolizes his power as a successor of the Apostles. The Bishop of Rome, the pope, sits in the seat of Peter in his cathedral.
8. **a)** "When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church" (CCC, n. 767).
9. **c)** Neophytes, literally "newly planted," spend the months after their Baptism reflecting on the experience of being baptized and becoming a part of the mystical body of Christ in the Church. This process is called mystagogy, a series of spiritual reflections that leads neophytes deeper into the mysteries of their newfound faith.
10. **d)** Only once a year is the tabernacle candle extinguished—on Good Friday, when the Eucharist is not present in the tabernacle, commemorating the death of Christ.

Mission Appeal- Prelature of Esquel (Argentina-Patagonia)

Next weekend- July 2/3, 2016, is a Mission Appeal Sunday. This year I invite you to support the missionary work of Prelature of Esquel in the country of our Pope Francis, Argentina. This mission was created in 2009 and covers more than 30,000 square miles and a population of about 70,000 people. Presently 6 diocesan priests and 7 Polish Redemptorists serve in 11 parishes. The people in these communities are very poor and unable to support their parishes. Without funds collected during Mission Appeals the Prelature cannot sustain its pastoral work, e.g. evangelization activities, children and youth catechetical programs, lay ministry training and help for the poor. The construction of new churches for the young Catholic communities cannot continue. Our Mission Cooperative Preacher will be Fr. Wieslaw Bajor who works for the Prelature. St. Pope John Paul II reminded us in his encyclical "Rich in Mercy": Jesus Christ taught that man not only receives and experiences the mercy of God, but that he is also called to practice mercy towards others. Thank you for your generosity. God bless you!

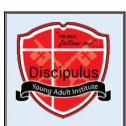


Theology on Tap Summer Series –
