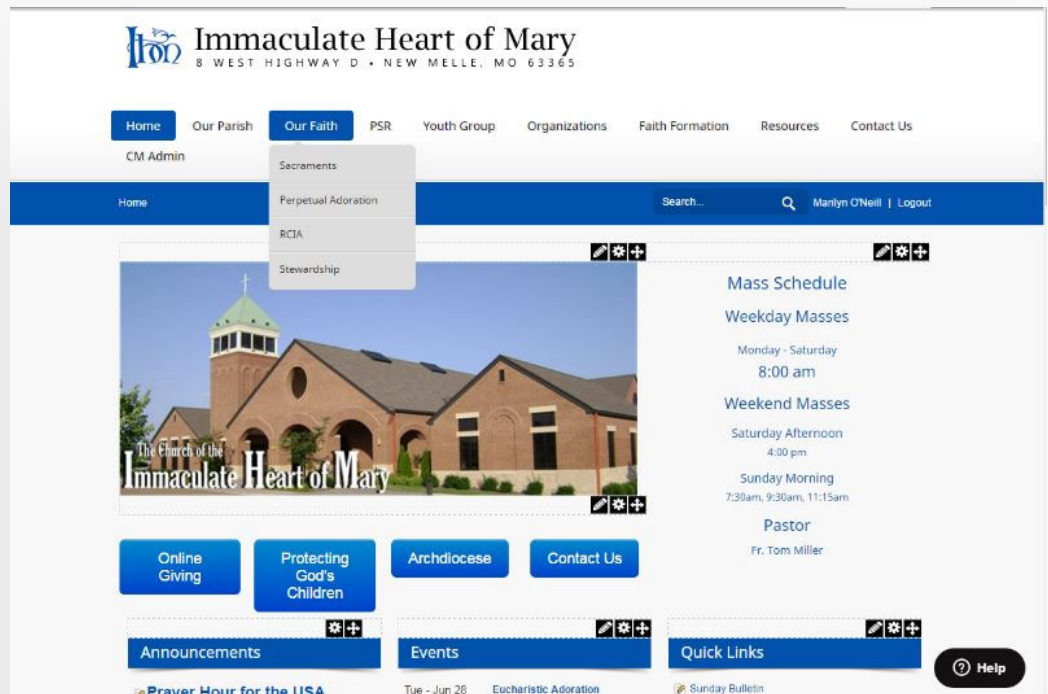

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Some say tomato—and some say tomahto—you know the old song. What do you say when you arrive at church and see a font prepared, a baby in the wings, the paschal candle burning? Well, maybe you will say that “we’re having a baptism today,” or maybe you say “we are having a christening.” The proper term is baptism, since that is the name of the sacrament. But the persistent use of “christening” in our culture, probably from due to the influence of the Episcopal Church, is interesting.

Baptism, an ancient word, is from the Greek meaning to dip or to dunk. Christening is an Old English word that describes perfectly well that more than getting splashed with water, the person being baptized is being “Christ-ed.” No matter what you call it, there’s always water involved, and then an anointing with chrism—fragrant olive oil consecrated as a sign of Christ’s presence—poured upon the brow as we say, “As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.”

So, in being Christ-ed, you are conformed to his image, your life is expected to be a retelling of his life in miniature and you—even though you may be squirming or sleeping—are commissioned to be a priest, a prophet, a king. This means that you are called to be one who worships, you are called to speak the truth, you are called to shape the world and exercise right judgment. That is the deepest treasure of our tradition, and every time you gather to celebrate a baptism, you renew your vows precisely so that you can be more “Christ-ed.” No matter what vocabulary you assign to the liturgy, the key is transformation of the human person in the community of the Body of Christ.

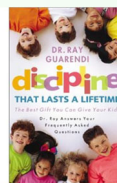

Good Discipline, Great Teens:

I really hate parenting advice books by psychologists. They often reject the common wisdom handed down from generation to generation in favor of the latest fads in academia - fads created by those with no real connection to the realities of raising kids in the real world. If you want to raise your kids in a test tube, their advice may work, but for the rest of us, they are useless and possibly counter-productive. So I never read books like "Good Discipline, Great Teens", but my wife was able to get me to read this one after she had heard Dr. Guarendi speak at a conference. She promised it would be engaging, funny, and full of practical advice. Boy, was she right! Dr. Guarendi writes in a style that is down-to-earth and quite hilarious at times. Even better, the advice he gives, while backed by his own work as a clinical psychologist, supports the common wisdom of generations of parents. Nothing he writes is necessarily "new", but by reading this book, one is given the support to be a confident parent in face of a culture that undermines strong parenting at every opportunity. I would highly recommend this book for anyone who has teens or children about to become teens. These years, contrary to popular thought, can be wonderful years for the parent-child relationship, and Dr. Guarendi gives plenty of help to make sure that this happens! (Review from Amazon.com)

Discipline That Lasts a Lifetime:

Since I got my copy of Dr. Ray Guarendi's book, "Discipline That Lasts a Lifetime", I have mentioned it to many of my friends with children. They like what they see in my own pre-teen son. I have loaned it out to many of my friends. They are thrilled with the results they've had based on practicing the down-to-earth advice given by Dr. Guarendi. It's practical, humorous (to help take the edge off of stressful situations), and respectful towards the all important job of parenting. God bless this man for NOT taking the road of modern psycho-babble and for actually using his own brain, spine and faith to give us REAL tools we need. This book helps me in many ways how to show my child that he is loved, and it gives me tools, based on actual situations Dr. Guarendi has dealt with, which I need to deal with my own son and our own life challenges. 1. **c)** The Angel Gabriel visited Mary at Nazareth to announce the birth of Jesus (Luke 1:26). Gabriel also appeared to Zechariah to announce the birth of John the Baptist (Luke 1:19).
2. **a)** A popular form of the Morning Offering is: O my Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you all my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day for your greater honor and glory, the salvation of my soul, for the intentions of our Holy Father, and for the poor souls in purgatory. Amen.
3. **d)** Perpetua and Felicity were Christian martyrs of the third century. They are often pictured in an embrace because legend has it that, after being wounded by wild beasts, they exchanged the kiss of peace before being put to the sword.
4. **a)** This station is similar to the Fifth Sorrowful Mystery: the crucifixion and death of Jesus.
5. **a)** "Personal Ordinariates" will allow groups of Anglicans who are disenchanted with the Anglican Church to enter into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church while preserving elements of the Anglican "spiritual patrimony."
6. **b)** This title reflects the form in which it is sung/read: The assembly responds with a refrain after a cantor or reader proclaims the verses of the psalm.
7. **d)** The Feast of the Ascension is traditionally celebrated on the fortieth day after Easter, the sixth Thursday of Easter. In some parts of the U.S. and in some other countries, the feast is moved to the following Sunday: the 7th Sunday of Easter.
8. **c)** Mystagogy, on one level, refers to the period of catechesis for the neophytes (newly baptized) following Easter. On another level, mystagogy refers to the catechesis in which all of the baptized engage: a liturgical catechesis that aims at drawing us more deeply into the Paschal Mystery.
9. **c)** The word postulant comes from the Latin postulare meaning "to ask for." Once a postulant is accepted into a religious community or monastery, he or she enters into a period of formation known as the novitiate.
10. **b)** The Septuagint served as the Old Testament source for most early Christians. According to legend, 72 Jewish translators, while in a separate chamber, completed the translation into Greek in 72 days. Thus the title Septuagint (septuaginta meaning "seventy" in Latin).
