SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, *How am I present to God and others in my life*?

JESUS CHRIST, SUPERSTAR

Imagine how you would feel if a very famous person asked you to stand right by her side during a highly publicized funeral. Calling on you in her time of greatest suffering and vulnerability, she asks you to share in her suffering. As media reports on the tragedy roll in, every photograph shows you standing side by side with your famous friend, grieving together. In the midst of sadness, you would probably feel honored to serve as such a close and trusted companion.

Jesus asks something like this from us. From time to time, the Lord asks us to accompany him in suffering. Often we postpone or reject the invitation, though, preferring health, security, and prosperity. God provides all good things, but here for a little while we are sometimes asked to suffer. And who asks us? Needy family members, people who are homeless, refugees drinking contaminated water, children with special needs, irritating coworkers—all of these people are stand-ins for Jesus, asking us to suffer with him.

JESUS KNOWS OUR HEARTS

Abraham and Martha show us how to get busy tending to others' needs. Abraham orders up an impressive menu of fine food, selecting his best animal to slaughter and prepare. Abraham's visitors appreciate his attentive hospitality and reward him with long-awaited good news. When Martha bustles about preparing for her guest, however, she receives a gentle scolding. Jesus, who knows our hearts, senses anxiety, perhaps bitterness, in Martha.

Despite her good deeds, Martha pays more attention to her sister than to her guest. Our attention to Jesus is the one thing necessary. If anger, jealousy, or resentment distracts us from serving Jesus, then our work is empty. Saint Paul confirms this when he invites the Colossians to offer all their daily activities, even their suffering, to the Lord. The only thing lacking in Jesus' suffering is our own free choice to pay attention to him and share his suffering.

WATCH YOUR POSTURE

Our posture is often a tip-off to our hospitality and reverence for the Lord. Note the actions of Abraham as he greeted the Lord in the presence of three men who appeared near his tent. He ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them. He bowed to the ground as he met them. He and Sarah, his wife, hastened to prepare a meal and bring food and water to their guests.

In the Gospel story, Jesus' friend Mary sat at his feet in order to listen to him speak.

How do we welcome and reverence the Lord? What do our actions show? Do we remember the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament? How do we welcome the Lord in the scripture readings? How do we acknowledge his presence in our brothers and sisters, both at Mass and afterwards?

Whether we kneel, stand, or sit in the Lord's presence, may our hearts and minds always be attuned to him.



- **3.** a) On the Feast of St. Blaise (February 3), the Church offers a blessing of throats, calling upon the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, who, according to legend, cured a young boy who was choking on a fish bone.
- **4. c)** These words are from the Stabat Mater, a traditional chant sung during the praying of the Stations of the Cross, as the faithful move from one station to the next.



FROM THE RESPECT LIFE APOSTOLATE:

The Majority Caucus members of the Sanctity of Life Committee issued a nine-page report on July 5 following a review of documents produced by St. Louis Planned Parenthood in response to the committee's subpoena. A copy of the report can be downloaded at http://www.senate.mo.gov/16web/wp-content/ uploads/2016/07/Missouri-Senate-Planned-Parenthood-Review-Statement.pdf

Specifically, the report identified three areas of concern. There are alarming gaps in the records regarding the human fetal tissue. These include missing and incomplete contracts for disposal of the fetal human tissue and unaccounted for fetal

Planned Parenthood appears to be out of compliance with Missouri laws on disposal of fetal remains and potential use of digoxin in violation of the Federal "Infants Born Alive Act."

Internal documents demonstrate shocking indifference to women's health, possibly rising to the level of medical malpractice. These practices include procedures and forms that purposely direct patients away from outside treatment in a hospital or emergency room and protocols that may prevent timely response by emergency medical professionals.

These findings are deeply troubling and certainly support the need for laws mandating facility inspections and protection of the well-being and health of women seeking abortions. As the report notes, the investigation "has raised as many questions as it has answered."
