Independence from Common Sense – Part III

Same Sex Unions or Holy Matrimony

Dear parishioners,

In any discussion of a serious topic we hope to experience mature, patient, and charitable conversation. If that is not possible, we might as well just end the conversation and pray for the individual and go our own way. If they are willing to have a mature conversation I think we need to make certain they understand what we believe and why. Here are some points for conversation:

The Good News

- We believe in Holy Matrimony, one man and one woman, for life. We believe that this is something revealed to us by God.
- We believe in the very Sacramental nature of this relationship. It is given by God for the transformation (conversion) of the



- individual. Holy Matrimony is a path to knowing Jesus in your life, marriage and family. It is one of the most difficult sacraments to live because it is made up of hundreds of little decisions to be open to grace and overcome the temptation to be sinful and selfish. Personal conversion is lifelong. Believing that God is working through your spouse can be a hard pill to swallow if your faith is dormant or undeveloped.
- The Church acknowledges the challenges faced by those who are married and offers support and guidance to couples and families so they can strengthen the bonds of their love and life rather than dissolve them.

The Bad News

- Our society/culture/media (sometimes it's hard to untangle all of those) does not encourage long-lasting relationships. Everything is disposable and replaceable, and sadly relationships and people are too. It's been that way for about 40 years.
- Our "unholy trinity" mentioned above is much more about personal fulfillment rather than personal conversion. In fact, conversion is seen as negative and threatening to your life. Conversion is seen as rejection. Ironically enough it is. But it is a rejection of what is opposed to God as we do our best to understand, love and follow Him.
- Feelings and personal preference have replaced thought and belonging to something or someone greater than oneself. For instance, we belong to Jesus and His Church. We believe that both of those are helping us live our life now and prepare us for eternal life.
- American Culture has become unmoored from Christian morality. The unmooring has often been accompanied with anger and hatred toward the very values that helped form our Nation. I know I am painting with a broad brush, but the vast majority of Americans who still uphold Christian morals are constantly told to either keep their values to themselves or told that they are hateful.

ANSWERS TO CATHOLIC IQ

1. (d) St. Gregory the Great (540-604) shortened Advent from six weeks to four, arranged the Lectionary for the season, and composed prayers and antiphons for it.

2. (c) Only Matthew and Luke tell the Christmas story. See the first two chapters of both Gospels.

3. (c) The part about dancing has been dropped from its modern meaning: "a song of joy, especially a Christmas song."

4. (a) The rose-colored candle usually marks the third Sunday, traditionally called "Gaudete" (the Latin word for joy) Sunday because Christmas is only a few days away, and people are feeling joyful. They express that joy in the opening prayer of the Mass.

5. (a) See Matthew 1:19. Joseph was "unwilling to expose her to shame." The penalty for proven adultery was being stoned to death.




The video uses the case of high school biology teacher Roger DeHart to introduce and frame a presentation on six of the "icons of evolution": Haeckel's embryos, Darwin's finches, four-winged fruit flies, homology in vertebrate limbs, bacterial resistance to antibiotics, and Darwin's "Tree of Life". These are referred to as "icons" because they are presented in biology texts as key proofs that Darwinian evolution has occurred.

However, each of these is at best misleading (four-winged fruit flies) and at worst an outright fake (Haeckel's embryo drawings). Mr. DeHart was a popular teacher who had taught high school biology for many years. He supplemented the standard textbook presentation of the theory of evolution with additional materials from mainstream , peerreviewed scientific publications illustrating that there was some disagreement in the scientific community over the interpretation of the purported evidence for evolution. This practice was challenged in the late 1990s (even though teachers in other disciplines frequently used supplementary materials without any challenges) and led to public

debate over how the theory of evolution should be taught. This video is produced from the perspective that the evidence against evolution should be taught at the high school level as well as the evidence for it. Students should know how science is practiced, which includes considering alternative interpretations of evidence and considering contrary information as well as supporting evidence for a theory.
