MEDITATION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus told this parable. "An owner leased his vineyard to tenants for a share of the crops. At harvest time, he sent his servants to collect the share due him. But the tenants abused and killed them. Then the owner sent other servants, but the tenants did the same thing. Finally, the owner] sent his son. When the tenants saw the son... they grabbed him. . . and killed him. [The owner then punished the tenants.]" Matthew 21:37-39

In Jesus' parable, the vineyard owner stands for God; the vineyard, Israel; the tenants, Israel's leaders; the servants, the prophets; the son, Jesus. The parable illustrates both God's patience and God's justice. God dealt patiently with Israel's leaders. But when they refused to respond, God passed judgment on them. In what area of my life, especially, has God dealt very patiently with me?

So many emotions and thoughts well up when we experience the mystery of suffering and death that we can easily lose our sense of perspective. Thank the Lord that He is so patient with us as we do our best to make sense of things. It is difficult for us to remember that even grief is somewhat of a

mystery for us, being so personal and often private.

If you never had the opportunity to meet Erma and Bud, then you missed out on one of those rare treasures of life. I mention both of them because they were so inseparable. It was rare that you would ever encounter one without the other being close at hand. Their delightful and quirky humor brought joy to whoever had the opportunity to share their company. While everyone has their stories to tell, Bud & Erma have a gift for capturing your attention as they share little episodes of their past with you. Both of them have a gift for not taking themselves too seriously and doing their best to elicit a smile or laugh from you. They possessed an uncomplicated and active faith that drew them into the life of our parish family.

For all who knew them, treasure those fond memories and experiences. Let them fuel your prayer and guide your conversations. Two of the most important things we can do for our dearly departed is to remember them in our conversations and lift them up in our prayers. 

Pilgrim Virgin Visitation Program

The Legion of Mary is encouraging members of IHM and their families to gather in prayer together with the pilgrim Virgin Statue.

The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of our Lady of Fatima was sculpted in 1947 based on the description of Sr. Lucia, one of the three young seers who saw Our Lady each month from May to October in 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. Blessed by Pope Pius XII, it was sent out to bring the Message of Fatima to the world. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has traveled the world many time, visiting more than 100 countries, bringing the great message of hope, "the peace plan from heaven," to millions of people. Many miracles and signal graces are reported wherever the statue travels. In honor of this tradition, the World d Apostolate of Fatima developed a program many years ago to give families the opportunity to have a sacred image of Our Lady, modeled after the statue described above, visit their homes. The purpose is to remind each family that their Mother in Heaven is deeply concerned about their lives and wants to remain close to them.



The IHM Legion of Mary is offering families this statue for a week at a time. Starting with the 2nd grade families (those preparing for their first holy communion), Nancy Hollenstein will be coordinating a schedule with these folks.

- Q. What is the primary purpose of the Pilgrim Home Visitation program? A. It is to aid families in responding to the requests of Our Lady of Fatima.
- Q. What can families hope to obtain from the visit of the Pilgrim Virgin Statue?

A. Through the praying of the Rosary and the power of a sacramental image (the statue), Our Lady brings us closer to Christ. Over the years, people who have received the statues into their homes have experienced healings of body, spirit and soul, have had families reunited and many people have returned to the practice of the Catholic Faith.



A handsome and active young man from an influential family in Turin who dedicated his short life to the care of the poor and the sick and working for social and political reforms. Pier Giorgio Frassati's generosity was legendary. He often gave the clothes he was wearing to poor people he met who were in need. An open anti-fascist, a keen



sportsman and mountaineer, an enthusiast of the theatre and literature, and a young man with a great devotion to the Blessed

Sacrament, he stands as a great example of Christianity in action. His life was cut short by polio at the age of 24 and thousands of the Italian industrial city's poor lined the streets at his funeral. He was beatified in 1990 by Blessed Pope John Paul II.

Country Store:


